## *Letter from the pastor*



I love being an American, a citizen of the United States. This is the land that welcomed millions of immigrants from other lands to find freedom, opportunity, and new beginnings, and that list would include my own parents. Our nation rose up and defeated Nazism and Communism at a great cost of lives. We continue to stand to oppose injustice in many lands, and we are a people who respond when others have suffered famine, disease, or some natural catastrophe. The list of the goodness of our nation could go on and on. We have so much to be proud of as Americans and much to give thanks to God.

Yet, we also have our sins and failures. We know that our Constitution once permitted the evil of slavery in spite of the words of the Declaration of Independence - "that all men are created equal." A great and bloody civil war was fought to finally end this horror. Shortly after the attack on Pearl Harbor, we removed American citizens of Japanese ancestry to detainment camps. We certainly know that we have not always treated our Native Americans with fairness.

It may well be that our greatest failure as a nation is what happened on January 22, 1973. This is the date when, for all practical purposes, our Supreme Court and nation legalized abortion in the Roe v Wade case. Since this decision was made, well over fifty million abortions have occurred in the United States.

Right to life and discussions on abortion often grow very heated, and the safer course is to avoid the topic. This is a civil rights issue, a moral issue, a political issue and a highly personal one. I have met people who have had abortions, and they carry a great weight and burden in their hearts. I do not seek to lay any further guilt on them. They may well have felt trapped, facing few other options at the time. I pray these women and men involved in obtaining abortions can find healing and peace in their lives.

But I do believe our nation and its laws must continue to be challenged in the protection of all life. At the time of Roe v Wade, it was said that this decision would lead to a cheapening of the value of all human life. I think this has proven to be true. Some have abortions because the baby may not be the gender they wish, or they may find a pregnancy inconvenient to their career, or the possibility that the baby may have medical issues. Have we, as a nation, devalued life? This is a serious question.

This devaluing of life has led to serious discussions and even the acceptance by some of assisted suicide, stem cell research where fertilized ovules are casually discarded as waste. We may well be on a very slippery slope where we continue to lose regard for human life.

As Catholics, and in line with the teaching of our Church, respect for life must also lead us to great concern about all the living. Our national policies concerning the poor, immigrants, war, and the death penalty to name a few must enter into any discussion of the right to life.

January 22<sup>nd</sup> was a sad day in our nation's history. We praise God that many men and women continue to gather in Washington, D.C. on this day, brace the cold, and march for life, pray, and lobby Congress. I do sense there is the beginnings of a turning of the tide toward a national pro-life sense.

This Christmas I received a card from a couple that had a picture of the sonogram of their expected baby. Even people who do not share our religious values are beginning to see that we must, as a nation and as individuals, reflect on this most profound question: ***When does life begin?*** We should stand and applaud those who have continued this faithful commitment to fight for life, even when at times they must have felt they were standing alone.

Our parish has a strong commitment to life. Parishioners gather every week to say the rosary for life. We have been very generous in our Baby Bottle Campaign that donated more than \$11,000.00 to the Life Center of Long Island. Father Henry, Diana and Jerry Miranda and others have been very dedicated in keeping this major national issue before our eyes and hearts.

On January 22, I ask you to do something in support of human life and in atonement for the sins of our nation. Perhaps you might fast, skip dessert, make a donation to the poor or the pro-life moment, say a decade of the rosary, email a political leader, or speak to your children about the goodness of life. God bless you if you can make the march in Washington.

***Also on January 22, at 7:00 p.m., there will be a Holy Hour in our Church to pray for reparation and healing for what has been and for the grace of ongoing conversion of all of us to the deepest respect for human life. If you are able to attend, that would be wonderful!***

I will end these thoughts with the words of Blessed John Paul II:

***"America you are beautiful . . . and blessed . . . . The ultimate test of your greatness is the way you treat every human being, but especially the weakest and most defenseless. If you want equal justice for all and true freedom and lasting peace, then America, defend life." - Pope John Paul II***

**RESPECT LIFE COMMITTEE**

Lorraine Gariboldi, the Executive Director of the Life Center of Long Island, writes in the Center's January Newsletter, "Recently, I viewed a documentary film called ***Eggsploitation***. This important powerful documentary gives the viewer insight into the egg donation industry and helps us to better understand the desperate need for regulation and oversight. In the U.S. the infertility industry is a multi-billion dollar business. Their primary commodity is human eggs.

Young women all over the world are solicited by ads, usually on college campus bulletin boards, through social media, and online classified ads, with some offering up to \$100,000 for the "donated" eggs

The ads portray donating your eggs as a humanitarian thing to do. What the infertility industry is failing to do is keep records of all those women who, as a result of the procedure to donate their eggs, are faced with short-term and long-term medical risks to her health such as infections, strokes, cancer and possible infertility. There is a desperate need for regulation and oversight.

We need to educate our young people, especially those going off to college about this danger. This video is available for a donation from the Center of Bioethics and Culture or at [www.eggsploitation.com](http://www.eggsploitation.com).
