# Letter from the pastor

Our parish is blessed with numerous people who have chosen to become involved in a variety of parish ministries. All the ministries are important and contribute to building up the Body of Christ here at St. Martin's. I have three ministries that I would like to mention today. The first is the Arimatheans. They take their name from St. Joseph of Arimethea, who gave his own tomb so there would be a burial place for Jesus after his crucifixion. These are men and woman from the parish who attend our funerals and assist the priest celebrating the Mass by distributing the Mass programs, serving the Mass, proclaiming the Scripture if necessary, hanging the funeral banner, and assisting in other ways. One of the most important ministries of our parish is comforting those who are in grief, and this dedicated group of men and women, often go unnoticed, but they are vital to our parish since we have so many funerals and there is such a need to assist those in sorrow. I think of the words of the Beatitudes, "Blessed are those who mourn for they shall be comforted." Certainly this ministry is a great comfort to many people.

The second group I would like to recognize is the money counters. These are men and women who gather on Mondays to count the collection. They sort out the money and checks, and count the change (hopefully not too much change) They do their ministry in the background and no one sees them. They have a wonderful spirit among themselves, perhaps because of the excellent pastries they have. I do not know if they have a formal name but I wonder if they might be called the Matthians, after St. Matthew who was a tax collector. The only weakness I see in this ministry is that there are more Giant than Jets fans among them.

The third group, perhaps even more unrecognized than the previous two ministries, are the women (I do not think there are any men in this ministry although they would be welcomed) who take responsibility for keeping the altar cloths, purificators, and corporeal clean and ironed. In our parish, where we have eight Masses on a weekend, with the precious blood being distributed all the Masses, as well as during the weekdays, we use a great deal of purifications. We are blessed to have these women who take such good care of such a sacred part of our parish-the altar and its linens. It was St. Veronica who provided the cloth that was used to wipe the face of Jesus on his way to Calvary. Perhaps, these good women could be called the Daughters of Veronica.

I like to thank all who serve in any ministry in our parish I like to thank our ministers but I know they serve because it flows from their love and commitment to the parish. They tell me that it is a privilege to serve the Lord and their parishioners. So God bless the Arimetheans, the Matthians, and the Daughters of Veronica. If you would like to consider serving in a ministry in our parish, or might see a need a like to start a new one, I would be delighted to speak to you about it.

### FEBRUARY 3RD - FEAST DAY OF SAINT BLAISE, PATRON OF THROAT ILLNESSES

St. Martin's will have the blessing of throats on Friday, February 3rd at the 6:30 and 9:00 AM masses. A general blessing will be done at all weekend masses, February 4th and 5th.

Many Catholics might remember Saint Blaise's feast day because of the Blessing of the Throats.



Two candles are blessed, held slightly open, and pressed against the throat as the blessing is said. Saint Blaise's protection of those with throat troubles apparently comes from a legend that a boy was brought to him who had a fishbone stuck in his throat. The boy was about to die when Saint Blaise healed him.

Very few facts are known about him. We believe he was a bishop of Sebastea in Armenia who was martyred under the reign of Licinius in the early fourth century.

The legend of his life that sprang up in the eighth century tell us that he was born in to a rich and noble family who raised him as a Christian. After becoming a bishop, a new persecution of Christians began. He

received a message from God to go into the hills to escape persecution. Men hunting in the mountains discovered a cave surrounded by wild animals who were sick. Among them Blaise walked unafraid, curing them of their illnesses.

Recognizing Blaise as a bishop, they captured him to take him back for trial. Soon after Blaise was killed by the governor.

Blaise is the patron saint of wild animals because of his care for them and of those with throat maladies. Take time as Saint Blaise did to find out how you can help wild animals. Find out what is being done to support and protect the wildlife in your area. There is wildlife everywhere, even in cities. Even a birdfeeder can help God's creatures survive.

### Prayer:

Saint Blaise, pray for us that we may not suffer from illnesses of the throat and pray that all who are suffering be healed by God's love. Amen.

### U.S. BISHOPS VOW TO FIGHT HHS EDICT

(Unconscionable to force citizens to buy contraceptives against their will). (No change in limited exemption, only delay in enforcement) (Matter of freedom of conscience, freedom of religion).

The Catholic bishops of the U.S. called *ltterally unconscionable*" a decision by the Obama Administration to continue to demand that sterilization, abortifacients and contraception be included in virtually all health plans. This means that this mandate and its very narrow exemption will not change at all. Instead there will only be a delay in enforcement against some employers. "In effect, the president is saying we have a year to figure out how to violate our consciences," said Cardinal-designate Timothy M. Dolan, archbishop of NY and president of the USCCB.

The HHS rule requires that sterilization and contraception - including controversial abortifacients - be included among "preventative services" coverage in almost every healthcare plan available to Americans. "The government should not force Americans to act as if pregnancy is a disease to be prevented at all costs." added Cardinal-designate Dolan.
