Letter from the pastor

I like to go the movies. Sometimes, I get annoyed when the coming attractions that are shown seem too long. I want to stand up and shout, "Start the movie!" In spite of this negative personal experience, I want to write about a coming attraction to our parish: our Lenten mission that will be conducted by Father Kevin MacDonald CSSR. Father Kevin will preach at all our masses on March 3-4, and begin the mission services on Monday, March 5th.

I am looking forward to Easter as we celebrate the greatest feast of our faith, the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. Lent is a season that helps us prepare for this great feast. For me, if we do not have faith which is the cornerstone of my life, it would be hard for me to make much sense out of my daily existence. I draw great comfort from my deep belief that all the people I have ever loved in life, my parents, my sister Gerry, my dear family members and friends, are alive and present with God. I shall see them again. When I left the cemetery with a sad heart, I drew strength from the firm conviction that this was not the end. Their bodies are in the grave but that which made them who they were is still very alive in eternity. I often wonder how people without faith can get through periods of loss and death. Even with my trust in God, I still find loss so very overwhelming.

When I see terrible natural disasters such as earthquakes and tsunamis that take thousands of lives, I cannot understand why this happens. Yet, because of the resurrection of Christ, I do believe there is something beyond that darkness, that those who suffered so much have the promise of hope of a great life and that there will come a time when every tear shall be wiped away and we shall see God face to face.

I feel blessed in life. I love being a priest and I have a wonderful family and the best of friends. I love nature, music, sports, movies and a good television show. My great nieces and nephews bring me delight and happiness. Yet, it would be still very hard for me if I thought that this is all there is to life and nothing more, that I only have a certain amount of days and nothing more. God is so very good and since the dawn of time, he has promised us that he is awaiting us after death. The resurrection of Christ proclaims that God is stronger than death, and no chains can bind him. He is risen!

Where are you in your faith? Most of us have lots of questions, and some of us find it hard to trust in the promises of God. Perhaps, we have been away from the faith for a time, and are not sure how to return. Maybe we feel we will be made to feel guilty and judged if we return to Church. One of the greatest messages that Jesus gave us is that he came for sinners and not the righteous. As he was on the cross, he prayed, "Father, forgive them; they know not what they do."

Our parish mission will be from Monday, March 5th to Thursday, March 8th, beginning each night at 7:30 p.m. It will be a week of hearing the good news of Jesus Christ and his redeeming love for each one of us. I ask you to consider coming to this retreat. I also ask you to be an evangelist for this mission. Consider inviting a family member or friend to this wonderful time of faith. Even if you can bring them to one night of the program, I am sure that it would be a great blessing to them.

How blessed we are to have the Good News of Jesus Christ. Come, and I think your heart will be lifted.

FAITH AND NEW WORKS
STRONG RESERVATIONS AND FIRM CONVICTIONS
By Bishop William Murphy

Last Friday President Obama announced that he had worked out "accommodations" to respond to the legitimate concerns about religious freedom that Catholic bishops and faithful, along with many others, have been raising to the HHS regulations that mandate coverage of artificial contraception, sterilization and abortion inducing drugs in virtually all health plans as of August 2013. Hopeful as always that truth and common sense would prevail, many of us watched his televised announcement with mounting disappointment. Putting aside some of the President's remarks that reinterpreted what he has actually said to officials of the USCCB (Catholic Bishops Conference), Mr. Obama raised more difficulties than he claimed he had resolved. While there still may be some hope that meetings with Administration officials might clarify some of the issues, the leadership of the US bishops and this Bishop remain disappointed and dissatisfied, determined to continue the effort to protect religious freedom and freedom of conscience not only for Catholics but for all Americans.

Put simply, we Bishops are more convinced than ever that we need rigorous legislative guarantees of religious freedom in the face of this Administration's continued effort to force coverage of religiously objectionable procedures as part of a universal mandate for all Americans regardless of their religious or conscience reservations. Without iron-clad guarantees that to date we have not been given, we will continue to work for the repeal of the mandate...

...The President of our Bishops Conference, Cardinal-designate Dolan, referred to this as a year to learn how to violate our consciences. That "grace period" now seems to have been changed to a year long "process" to determine what religious organizations or individuals may or may not qualify for the new "accommodation." This is a grave concern for us Bishops. It reduces a God given right, protected by the First Amendment, to a "privilege" to be negotiated with an Administration that swore to uphold the Constitution of the United States. The HHS mandate and its support by the Administration are deleterious to the life and liberty of citizens who should be able to live secure in the conviction that their right to religious freedom is not being undermined. Indeed, our right to religious freedom must be re-affirmed as soon as possible by all those in our government who have caused this grave situation to surface. The clear assertion of religious liberty is a matter of justice this Administration owes to all Americans.

Ash Wednesday is February 22nd and the beginning of the Season of Lent. Here are some clarifications on fasting and abstinence.

Ash Wednesday and **Good Friday** are days of fast and abstinence. The **Fridays of Lent** are days of abstinence in the United States.

The **Obligation of Abstinence** (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 19-59. No one should consider this obligation lightly.

Those individuals who have a medical condition in which fasting or abstaining may be considered harmful are not obliged to fast or abstain, but should perform some other act of penance or charity.
