

Letter from the pastor

I have been thinking about Jeremy Lin, Tim Tebow, Gary Carter, and Whitney Houston. The story of Jeremy Lin, the Harvard graduate, who was cut by two NBA teams and then sat on the bench with the New York Knicks, has become an overnight sensation in the United States and others parts of the world, as he has led the Knicks to seven straight wins. Not too long ago, many people were celebrating *Tebow mania* and kneeling in prayer in what became known as *Tebowing*. Baseball fans are mourning the death of Gary Carter who died of a brain tumor at the age of fifty-seven. At the same time, there is a great sadness over the premature death of the great singer Whitney Houston. Since I read an article in *The New York Times* the other day by the columnist David Brooks, I have been connecting all four of these people in my mind.

Brooks wrote a fascinating column entitled: *Wrestling with Conflict between Sports and Faith* and mentioned Tim Tebow and Jeremy Lin by name. Both of these athletes are very devout Christians and are quite open in the profession of their Christian belief. Lin has even spoken about being a pastor after his basketball career is over. The main point of Brooks' article was that there is a fundamental division between sports and religion. He argues that almost all faiths speak about being humble and meek. They seek the good of others, especially the down-trodden. Athletes, in the mind of Brooks, are highly competitive and determined to conquer and beat their opponents. Thus, there is the conflict between sports and faith.

Although I found Brooks' article very thought-provoking, I do not agree with his general assumption that the nature of playing sports is to win. Granted a devout Catholic such as Coach Vince Lombardi would stress winning to a very high degree; however, he always did put faith and family ahead of sports when he spoke to his teams. Gary Carter was called "Kid" even when he was an older player. He got this nickname from the way he played the game of baseball. I heard someone say that he played every game with the joy and zest of a little league ballplayer. I am sure he wanted to win the game, but I am even more certain that he loved playing the sport even when he lost. Interestingly, while not quite as recognized in faith matters as were Lin and Tebow, he too was a man of strong Christian faith.

I had the pleasure of watching our fourth grade boys CYO team play the other day. They are a very wellcoached team. What I loved in watching them play was the sheer joy and delight they took in playing. I have no doubt they were concerned about winning, but I think they were far more interested in just running around on the court and shooting the ball. Both teams were a group of happy kids enjoying the sport.

I loved the movie *Chariots of Fire.* It tells the story of the 1924 Olympics and two of the English sprinters. One is Harold Abrahams and the other is Eric Liddell. Liddell is the son of Christian missionaries and he plans on going to China to do missionary work. His sister is concerned that her brother is running in races and not preparing for the missions. When Eric Liddell accidentally misses a church prayer meeting because of his running, his sister Jennie upbraids him and accuses him of no longer caring about God. Eric tells her that though he intends to eventually return to the China mission, he feels divinely inspired when running, and that not to run would be to dishonor God. He says to her, "I believe that God made me for a purpose. But He also made me fast, and when I run, I feel His pleasure." I love that line: *"When I run, I feel his pleasure."* Running, for Liddell, is an act of praise to God. An athlete, whether a faith-filled person or not, and a person who develops one's skills to the best of one's ability, is actually praising God by using his or her body as a demonstration of athletic skills.

I believe the same could be said for Whitney Houston. Whatever the circumstances of her life and death, God gave her a great gift in her amazing singing voice. No doubt, she worked hard to develop that talent. Her gift was first recognized in the New Hope Baptist Church in Newark, New Jersey. Whether she was conscious of it or not, when she used her talents and gifts as she sang, she was praising God.

Certainly in Christian theology, we believe all our gifts and talents have their source in God. When we use our talents to the best of our abilities, we are praising God. Whether it be cooking a meal, coaching a little league game, singing in the choir, visiting the sick, driving a car, raising children, studying algebra, exercising, working at our jobs, and the thousands other things that make up our lives, we do them for the glory of God.

In the second century, a great Catholic saint named Irenaeus wrote, "A Human Being Fully Alive is the Glory of God." José Reyes running the bases as he hits a triple, Eli Manning throwing a pass, Bruce Springsteen singing Glory Days, Aretha Franklin leading the audience in singing Respect, a mother feeding her infant, a child learning the alphabet, or a wife caring for her husband suffering from dementia are all giving glory to God.

"Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it. Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a crown that will not last; but we do it to get a crown that will last forever. So I do not run aimlessly; I do not box as one beating the air. But I discipline my body and keep it under control, lest after preaching to others I myself will not be disqualified for the prize." 1 Corinthians 9:24-27



THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS

For Roman Catholics throughout the world, the Stations of the Cross are synonymous with Lent, Holy Week and especially, Good Friday. This devotion is also known as the "Way of the Cross", the "Via Crucis", and the "Via Dolorosa." It commemorates 14 key events on the day of Christ's crucifixion. The majority of the Stations concern His final walk through the streets of Jerusalem, carrying the Cross.

The Stations originated in medieval Europe when wars prevented Christian pilgrims from visiting the Holy Land. European artists created works depicting scenes of Christ's journey to Calvary. The faithful installed these sculptures or paintings at intervals along a procession route, inside the parish church or outdoors. Performing the devotion meant walking the entire route, stopping to pray at each "station."

Today, images of the Stations (or simple crosses representing them) are on display in almost all Catholic churches. They serve mainly as a focus for Lenten worship services. However, the Stations can also be performed privately at any time of the year, even at home. Many organizations offer free or inexpensive, illustrated pamphlets for this purpose.
