Letter from the Pastor

Our parish has many generous parishioners, who not only provide strong support to the regular weekly collections, but are also most generous to our flower collections at Christmas and Easter, as well as to our visiting missionaries. Additionally, I continue to be deeply touched by your regular donations to our Parish Outreach Center, to the poor box, to the baby bottle campaign, to our Youth Ministry appeals, the Harvest Festival and to the H.O.P. Club. We are blessed!

This week and next week, we are going to pay special attention to the **Catholic Ministries Appeal.** This campaign is an annual event in the life of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, and I am sure many of you have been supporting this program for years. Your donations are used for parish outreach programs, hospital ministry, prison ministry, Respect Life work, the Diocesan Mission to the Dominican Republic, meals on wheels, senior community ministries, immigrant resettlement, mental health outreach, and many other wonderful hands-on ministries to those in need. We can say that Jesus' words in Matthew 25, "I was hungry and you fed me, I was thirsty and you gave me a drink, I was naked and you clothed me, I was in prison and you visited me," are being met by the work of the Catholic Ministries Appeal.

Every year our parish is given a target goal to meet. The goal is based on norms that flow from the size of our parish and our regular collections. Our goal this year, as in the past, is over \$100,000.00. That is a lot of money! Over the past several years, we have not come near to meeting the goal which has been given to us. Very often we've achieved less than fifty percent of the target. The Diocese, while disappointed in our results, has never pressured us or demanded that we do more for this campaign.

I am fully aware that many of our parishioners are seniors living on fixed incomes, while others are struggling to provide for their families in a county with very high taxes. You are asked to give to your government, to your church, to your community. You probably also receive many requests in the mail for charity. Perhaps, you might be afraid to open your mail!

I also know that there are some parishioners, for whatever reason, are reluctant to give money to the Diocese. Perhaps, there are still bad feelings about the closing of St. Martin's School and now LaSalle Regional School. I also realize Catholics in general feel very hurt by the sexual abuse scandal. In addition to the terrible pain that this has caused, it has also caused great financial damage.

It does seem clear to me that money given to the Catholic Ministries Appeal is used quite directly for those in serious need of help. Although we must always have a great concern for the needs of our parish and parishioners, we do belong to a universal church and have concerns for the needs of those beyond our boundaries.

So this week we will have a video presentation at the Masses on the Catholic Ministries Appeal. Next week, we will have a talk by someone about this appeal and how we might contribute to it. Although I was reluctant to give up two weeks of homilies, I do think that it is important that St. Martin's listen carefully to what the Catholic Ministries Appeal is about and consider making a contribution to it. To do so is to help the poor and needy which is certainly at the core of the Gospel of Jesus.

At the same time, I only want parishioners to do what they can do. I know how good and generous you are. I know you cannot give to every cause you are asked. I know you have your own financial challenges. All I ask is that you carefully listen to the speaker and reflect upon how you might respond. I feel that the approach we are taking is a sincere effort to respond to the Diocesan Campaign, while at the same time, respecting all the other needs you have as an individual and as a parishioner of St. Martin's.

Thank you and God bless your great commitment to your Catholic faith!



Easter is the greatest feast in the Church's calendar. This is the feast from which all others stem — the only feast kept by the early followers of the Lord. The Resurrection is so important that the Lord's followers observe every Sunday, the Lord's Day, as a "little Easter."

Lent has prepared us for the Resurrection feast. Now in similar fashion the Easter Season is the liturgical continuation of this greatest of feasts. The Easter Season lasts for 50 days. This amounts to seven weeks (or octaves), crowned with the feast of Pentecost. In fact, at the Pentecost Vigil Mass we say, "fifty days have celebrated the fullness of the mystery of your revealed love." This entire season is designed as a prolongation of Easter. The feast of the Ascension occurs 40 days after, but this does not change the spirit of the Easter Season. The Ascension celebration helps us look forward even more expectantly to the Holy Spirit and Pente-

cost. There are two special characteristics of the Easter Season. First is the Paschal Candle, which until Pentecost burns brightly at our liturgical celebrations. Second is the "Alleluia" - our victory cry or acclamation, over the Resurrection of our own Lord. "Alleluia" or "Hallelujah" is a Hebrew word meaning "Praise the Lord." In the Book of Revelation this is a special song of those who have been saved. As Augustine said, "We are an Easter people and Alleluia is our song!" We stand for the Alleluia — as a physical reminder of Resurrection.

During Easter Season we read the Acts of the Apostles. This book, which is traditionally read after Easter, demonstrates the impact of the risen Christ on the young Church. In the special "Gospel of the 50 Days" John is theologically and strongly reflective of the Lord's Resurrection.

RESPECT LIFE COMMITTEE

YOUNG ADULTS MAKE CHASTITY MESSAGE REAL FOR TEENS

GENERATION LIFE is a movement of young people just a year out of college, committed to building

a "culture of life" by educating their peers on pro-life and chastity messages. *Generation Life*, a Philadelphia based program whose members consider themselves "missionaries, who devote a year



of their lives after college to the program." During the week of April 16 -20, they presented their program to 7th and 8th graders who are studying for their confirmation in a few parish religious education programs, that included Maria Regina in Seaford, St. James in Setauket, SS. Peter and Paul in Manorville, Christ the King in Commack and St. Joseph's in Babylon. There will also be a preview of the *GENERATION LIFE PRESENTATION AT 9am at the RESPECT LIFE CONFERENCE on April 26th at the SEMINARY OF THE IMMACU-LATE CONCEPTION in Huntington.*

Allison O'Brien, Rockville Centre's Respect Life Office Director, saw the presentation and said, "It was a very powerful witness to see, especially the way the kids responded to them." The program consists of a talk about chastity and a video presentation. We'll separate the girls and boys at one point." O'Brien stated that a chastity program presented by young adults who are not much older than the students is also important. There's a generation gap! You want to hear this message from someone who is not too much older, and the thing is, they are actually living what they say. Kids will ask them, and they proclaim it proudly."
