Letter from the Pastor

If a stranger were to visit the Church of St. Martin of Tours to study our beautiful church, I believe they would know that the Redemptorists had been part of the history of the parish because the icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help has *such* a special place in our prayer area. We came here 26 years ago, and I am sure one of the first



things on the minds of our confreres was how to introduce this Madonna to the parishioners. Wherever a Redemptorist gives a retreat or mission, they bring the icon along with them and leave it to the parish as a gift so that Mary, the Mother of God and our perpetual help, can be present to the parishioners in a special way.

I knew a Redemptorist confrere, Father Charles Mallen, CSSR, now home with God, who told me that he brought the icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help to over 300 parishes in the state of Florida. When I toured around Ireland with my niece in 1994, I was moved by how many diocesan parishes have the icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help enthroned in the Church. The Irish Redemptorists have been doing great work in spreading devotion to Our Lady of Perpetual Help.

I love to read what is happening in the Baclaran, the Philippines: The Baclaran Phenomenon is, first and foremost, the incredible number of

people who come to the Redemptorist Church in Baclaran every Wednesday to make the Perpetual Novena to Our Mother of Perpetual Help. It is estimated that at least 100,000 devotees come on regular Wednesdays, reaching about 120,000 on the First Wednesday of each month. The biggest turnout of the year is on Ash Wednesday. The crowd for that day simply defies estimate.

Wednesday, June 27th, the Feast of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, saw thousands of people from Haiti come to the Basilica of Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Brooklyn to honor the patroness of their island. This year for the first time in recent history, the Redemptorists will be conducting a three day program at St. Patrick's Cathedral in honor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help.

We Redemptorists of the Baltimore Province are proud to say that our Province has two great Basilicas, both named Our Lady of Perpetual Help, that were built by the faith of the people and the Redemptorists - one in Brooklyn and the other in Boston. I remember a priest once saying to me, OLPH in Brooklyn is the biggest church on Long Island (he was making the point that Brooklyn is part of Long Island).

In 1866, Pope Pius IX entrusted the icon to the Redemptorists with the simple words, *Make Her Known*. We take those words to heart; we have also found that when we speak about our Blessed Mother under the beautiful title of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, that many people fall in love with the icon. Here at St. Martin's at 8:30 a.m. on June 25th, 26th, and 27th we had our Triduum to Our Lady of Perpetual Help.

We are so happy that you have embraced Our Lady of Perpetual Help in your own lives.



NOTE FROM FATHER PAT

We are not certain, but it seems that our church may have been hit by lightening on Monday, June 24th. We had a service planned at 8:30 a.m. in honor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help followed by the 9:00 mass. As the services began, it was noticed that the air conditioning system was not working and some lights were also not functioning. There was also trouble with the sound system. The novena service want on and mass began. Soon after the first reading, Father Henry and others noticed smoke in the church and Father wisely asked people to leave which they did so in an orderly fashion.

The Bethpage Fire Department was called and responded quickly. They did a thorough search of the church, the roof, and the bell tower, and saw no fire. They did think we might have had some smoke from a problem with the air conditioning that possibly could have been affected by the lightening strike. They advised us to call the air conditioning service which we did.

The fire department informed me that it was safe to use the church at this time. We did have some slight damage to the bell tower since it had to be opened so the firefighter could check it. I am grateful for their rapid response to us and their respect and care for the parish church.
