





What About Ventilators?

The use of ventilators can pose particularly challenging problems during end of life situations for families. When should we place a loved one on a ventilator? If somebody is on a ventilator, can we ever "*pull the plug*?" Understanding our moral duty depends upon whether the use of a ventilator in a particular case can be considered "ordinary" or "*extraordinary*."

Ordinary interventions can be understood as those medicines, operations and treatments that offer a reasonable hope of benefit for the patient and that can be obtained and used without excessive pain, expense, or other significant burden. Use of a ventilator will sometimes satisfy these criteria, and other times it will not, depending on the specifics of the patient's situation.

Whenever there is a considerable hope of recovery from the illness by making use of a particular means (a ventilator, for example) and when the patient can employ the means without much difficulty or burden, it is likely to be "ordinary" treatment. Thus, in the experienced hands of a well-trained physician, in a developed country with access to proper medication and equipment, intubation and ventilation of a patient can be low-burden intervention.

In the case of a patient who has damage to his brainstem so that he cannot breathe on his own, the physician treating him may be convinced that the underlying cause (example, multiple, severe strokes) will continue to get worse with nearly-certain outcome of death in a few hours or days. To continue ventilation would be considered "**extraordinary**." A decision to withdraw the ventilator would not be an act of euthanasia, because he would be dying due to an underlying condition. It would be a recognition of the burdensomeness of continued ventilation and an acknowledgment that heroics are not required, especially when death is imminent.
