



# RESPECT LIFE COMMITTEE By Diana Mirando, Life Center volunteer Continued from last week's column A BEAUTIFUL LIFE - Mr. Jack Eschmann

Jack Eschmann found a little house in Massapequa, across from Planned Parenthood. He knocked on the door and asked if the owner was thinking of selling in the near future. That knock on the door led to the construction by donations of the beautiful building we call The Life Center of Long Island.

When you got a call from Jack, you immediately said to yourself..."Oh God, here it comes, he's got me lined up for something." And that "something" was a job you were suited for. A rescue of some homeless person, a frightened pregnant woman, someone hungry or in need of help. And, you did it without a second thought. Jack had that way of making you know that by your effort to help someone else, you were in fact helping yourself. You were doing God's work and would be a better person than you were before you walked out the door!"

August is the anniversary of his death one year ago. He died with his wife, his children, grandchildren and great grandchildren at his bedside. As they sang "Amazing Grace," he closed his eyes and went to our Lord. There was no place to park at his viewing. Hundreds upon hundreds of people said "goodbye" to Jack. At his funeral mass, as the Knights moved his coffin down the aisle, everyone, inside the church, stood and applauded, following those outside until he was driven away.

He is buried in St. Charles Cemetery. A simple grave, a simple stone, he picked it just before he died.

He's there, near the airport where the planes take off and land. But most of all, by the Monument for the Children. A statue of Jesus holding the hand of a small child while holding a baby in his other arm. All the names of little children that died. Toys, dolls, little trucks are placed there by the parents that lost them.

A fitting place for a man that left this world a little better, a little kinder, a little more peaceful than when he entered it. He was a noble man...he lived a little life...in a little space that reached out to thousands.
