Letter from the Pastor

Celebrating Our Sexuality

"Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, in our likeness, and let them rule . . . So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. The man and his wife were both naked and not ashamed." Book of Genesis

When I am called upon to speak on what it means to be a sexual person, there are two Hollywood images that I like to use to help put this reality in the context of our age. The first is from the 1950's. Two shows I liked were *I Love Lucy* and *The Dick Van Dyke Show*. Both were comedies about family life and marriage. I remember that in both shows, when it showed the bedroom, the couples slept in twin beds. I think they were afraid that if they showed a queen sized bed it might be considered too provocative. I remember reading that when Lucy became pregnant (both in real life and in the show), the screenwriters did not use the word *pregnant*—it was considered a bit too much for the audience. This was certainly a time of innocence. When we consider where we are in our culture today, and with the saturation of sexual images and graphic language in the media, we might long for a return to this time. Yet, I think what was reflected in the fifties was almost a denial of human sexuality. The topic was considered not a proper topic and to be hushed up. I do not think that was neither correct nor healthy. God made us sexual beings, and all that God made is good.

The other image I use is from the classic movie, *The Graduate*, starring a young Dustin Hoffman and Anne Bancroft. Part of the story of the movie involves the recently graduated Hoffman being seduced by an older married woman, Mrs. Robinson. When he is confronted by Mr. Robinson, the young man says with all sincerity, "Gee, Mr. Robinson, it didn't mean anything to me; we might just as well have been shaking hands."

This dialogue is incredibly telling for our age. The act of sexual intimacy is a profound moment of committed love between a husband and wife. Words like hooking up, casual sex, one night stands and pornography speak to a sense of an age that has lost its bearings about a profound and sacred gift God has given us. I think neither the denial of the fifties of sexuality, nor the shallowness of today are helpful to us in coming to maturity as men and women in relationship with one another. So I thought it helpful to offer our parishioners a program on sexuality.

We are sexual beings, each of us possessing sexual desire. That is the way God made us. Our sexuality is a precious gift from our Creator. Very often when our Church talks about sexual matters, it is to say what must be avoided and what is sinful. Honestly, many feel our faith has little to say about human sexuality. *Thou shalt not!* For those of us who are a bit older, I would say that many of us grew up with those words in our mind when it came to any matter that had to do with sex and sexuality. Sex was something that no polite person was supposed to talk about; it was kind of a hushed area of life. Yet, when we became teenagers, our bodies, minds and emotions went through tremendous changes. Some of them might have been explained well to us, but most likely what we learned about sex was from our friends or books that we might have peaked at with guilty feelings. As we grow older, although the passion and energy may lessen a bit, we continue to be living sexual men and women. God made us both male and female.

Now we live in a culture where sex is promoted at almost every moment on television and in the media. Sex is used to sell anything from cars to toothpaste. I have read that almost 40% of the traffic on the internet has something to do with sexuality. Our culture seems to encourage the young to be sexually involved while marriage and fidelity are considered old-fashioned. Sex and sexuality are not problems to be solved, but gifts from our God. We know that ALL that God made is good.

Yet, it is God who made us sexual beings. Our faith proclaims that married sexual love is a sacrament, a most holy moment, where God is so very present. Honestly, many of us, single, married, celibate, young or old, struggle with what it means to be a sexual person in the modern age. I invite you to attend this program our parish is conducting:

This program will be lead by Mr. Anthony Gentile. Anthony is a dynamic speaker who I believe will hold your attention and speak to you in a most authentic way about what it means to be a Christian sexual person. I feel blessed that he will be in our parish for the following three sessions:

IN PERSON REGISTRATION

(N.Y. Election Law Sections 5-210, 5-211, 5-212). However, to be eligible to vote in the November General Election, your application must be received no later than **October 12th** except if you have been honorably discharged from the military or have become a naturalized citizen since **October 12th**, you may register in person at the board of elections up until **October 26th**.

- The American Urological Association recommends men age 40 and older should be offered a baseline PSA test and physical exam for early detection and risk assessment of prostate cancer.
