Letter from the Pastor

I hope that you have had the opportunity to read *Discerning the Future: Reflections on St. Martin of Tours Parish Bethpage, New York; Our Present Realities and Future Directions.* This blue covered sixteen-page booklet was distributed at all the Masses on the weekend of September 1st and 2nd. There have been three open parish meetings about this booklet in the last three weeks. I am grateful to all who been giving their reflections on future directions. If you have not seen this booklet, there are copies still available in the Church and I invite you to read it.

Although I wrote this report, it comes from <u>you</u> since I sought to listen carefully to what I experienced and heard over the past year. In particular, the parish survey that was taken earlier in the year had considerable impact on what was written. There is a great deal of good news in this booklet. The vast majority of parishioners are happy with the parish and describe it as a warm and welcoming community. It is clear that the parishioners of St. Martin's love their parish. There are challenges and concerns that were also raised. The people who raised these issues also care deeply about the parish and want it to be the best possible community reflecting the love of Jesus that it can be.

I think what has gotten a fair amount of attention is the financial concerns for the future. Reading that we may need almost a million and half dollars in the coming years for the necessary care of our property may have been upsetting to you, especially in the light of our national economy. I am coming to understand how many of you are on fixed incomes, or struggle to provide for your children, and pay costly taxes. However, the financial concerns are very real and will not go away. There are certain building matters that must be taken care to ensure the good maintenance of our property. However for me, the heart of this booklet is about how can we as a parish continue to grow in love of Jesus Christ, deepen our understanding of the Word of God, and respond in love to those around us. How can we be good disciples of Jesus Christ? I am trying to follow Jesus, but I do not always do it well and I need the help of the community to strengthen me. I would suspect the same is true for you. You are good people who are seeking to love God. Still we do not go to the Lord as individuals; we need each other to be the Body of Christ here at St. Martin's.

A key word in the document is *stewardship*. God has given us all many gifts. How do I choose to respond to God as I reflect on the gifts he has given me? I hope you feel blessed in your life in spite of whatever difficulties you have had. The question then is how do I share my blessings. I think when people hear the words "stewardship" and "sharing gifts," they sense this is a subtle way of the priest asking for money. I hope that is not the case. Stewardship has three major aspects: sharing you time, your talents, and your treasure. Although I know we have bills to pay and projects facing us, my greatest hope is that many (if not all of you) prayerfully consider how you might share your time and talents with the parish. We do need your treasure (a classy word for donations), but we need your time and talent far more. Over the next year or so, I do believe the parish will be speaking about the word stewardship. This letter is a first attempt to assure you that the heart of stewardship is not money and fund raising. The core of being a good steward of God's love is discipleship: responding to the God who loves us by how we live and act and participate in the life of our parish. I certainly see a strong spirit of stewardship in our parish and I hope we can move to increase this virtue in all of us.

I have just returned from Chicago after a attending a four day national conference on stewardship. I hope to discuss with you about this spiritual concept and how together we might deepen our understanding of this path to loving God and our neighbor.

These past weeks have been the days of political speeches by both the Democrats and the Republicans. I was ten years old when I heard the stirring words of President John Kennedy in his inaugural address: "Ask not what your country can do for you, but what you can do for your country." We know what God has done for us. He has given us life and the promise of eternal life. To paraphrase our late president, a simple definition of stewardship might be, "Ask not what your parish community can do for you, but what you can do for you you parish community."
