Letter from the Pastor

I have given over a hundred parish missions in my life, most of them with my dear friend Father John McGowan CSSR. The tradition of the Redemptorists and missions goes back to the earliest days of our Congregation in 1732 and our founder St. Alphonsus. We did not invent the parish mission, but our order has been well-recognized for this ministry. I remember reading a history of the American Church by the historian Jay Dolan and he noted that the Redemptorists missions in the 19th century in the Eastern United States was one of the keys in the development of the Catholic Church in America.

As a boy growing up at Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Brooklyn, the missions were dramatic events in the life of the parish. There would be a week for the men, a week for the married women, week for the single men, and a week for the children. In some countries where we serve, some of the Redemptorist missions can last several months. However, almost all our missions in the United States are about four or five days.

The word mission itself is interesting. Sometimes a parish team will ask me if they can call it a retreat rather than a mission. I will reluctantly agree to this if they insist, but I much prefer the word mission. We know that word means "to be sent." God sent his Son Jesus into the world to save us and preach the Good News of the kingdom of God. Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit upon the Church at the first Pentecost. The Church now has the mission of being the Body of Christ on earth as it proclaims the death and resurrection of Jesus. In truth, we are all sent by our baptisms to be men and women who proclaim the Gospel by how we live our lives.

Thus a parish mission is a time of special grace. The parish seeks to celebrate in a special way that invitation of Jesus to be his followers. Of course, we are seeking to do this all year, but this week is different: we seek to give full attention to the Lord. I was never <u>not</u> surprised by the effect that a parish mission has on individuals and the parish. Although the sermons, the music, the Scriptures, the rituals, and the coming together of the community are key aspects of the mission, I have found that there is something else happening in the life of those attending. By the amazing grace of God, they hear the word of God anew - a nudge is felt from God, a desire springs up in their hearts, and a call to change is felt. I can only explain this by the grace of God working through the mission.

I am very excited about our upcoming mission this week. Fathers Kevin O'Neil CSSR and James Wallace CSSR are spirit-filled men. They have prepared an excellent program for us. We always have wonderful music here. Whatever you have or have not done so far this Lent, this mission is a great time to enter into a heightened spiritual journey with the Lord. I also ask you to invite someone to the mission. I always joke that you can tell them you are taking them out to dinner and bring them here instead. We will not consider that a sin! There are so many people we know who would be blessed by hearing the Word of God at the mission, and you could be God's instrument in bringing them to this special moment. Tell them that even if they haven't been in church in years, even if they feel they are not welcome (they are, of course), even if they are angry at the Bishop, the Pope (the old one or the one to come) or the Pastor (there is long line for that one), or the teachings of the Church, do not let our humanity limit the grace of God. All are welcome. This is your mission to attend and to evangelize by inviting others.

May our Lady of Perpetual Help bring her choicest blessings upon the mission.

Enter at the side door on the left side of the church. Staircase leads to our meeting place.

Our first meeting took place on Monday evening, February 18th. We will meet again on Monday, March 18th and our final meeting will take place on April 15, 2013. All meetings will begin at 7:00 PM.

If you can only give a limited time, we need assistance with the following:

- Taking everything down (beds, tables, etc.) on Sunday afternoon, April 28th at 4:00 PM

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

August 1, 2013 is the deadline for certain organizations in the Diocese such as Catholic Charities and Catholic Health Services of Long Island to comply with the HHS mandate that they provide free artificial contraception and abortifacient medications as part of their compliance with the Affordable Care Act. Without being specific, indications from the Obama Administration are that they will no longer listen to our claims or those who share our religious and conscience convictions.

The latest Administration pronouncements were a disappointment. After a week of analyzing this latest proposal from the Administration, Cardinal Timothy Dolan of New York, President of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops, expressed our willingness to continue to try to convince the government that the objectively inadequate "accommodation" from the HHS continues to fall far short of the mark.

To me, the major problem is in the very word the Administration uses: **accommodation**. The state is not the giver of rights, especially religious freedom. We as citizens possess the right to religious freedom without government pronouncement and, in truth, the Administration cannot "accommodate" what is already ours. We should not be treated as if we are second class citizens because we disagree with the government's new and arbitrary insistence that all of us have to follow their prescriptions despite our religious beliefs and our right to freedom of conscience. Those rights are God-given, not state-granted. Every person and every religious institution already has from God what is guaranteed in our Constitution and Bill of Rights: freedom of religion and of conscience.

Now in the middle of Lent I write to you to ask you first of all to pray that God will protect us and our God-given rights as persons and as a Church. Second, I invite you to stay informed and be ready to respond to our calls for help as needed.

Keep your eye on the website of the US Bishops www.usccb.org as well as our news website www.licatholic.org to keep up-to-date and find concrete ways for concerted action. To get involved, please consider joining grass roots advocacy groups forming in parishes across the Diocese, such as Catholics for Freedom of Religion www.catholicsforfreedomofreligion.com. I encourage you to consider participation in such a group. Let our Senators and your Congressperson know that you and I have not lost interest. Tell them we are resolute in insisting on this most basic freedom, the freedom of religious belief and the protection of conscience. To contact your US Senators and Representatives, go to the website of the National Committee for a Human Life Amendment www.nchla.org. Send an email to your Representatives to demand the overturning of the HHS mandate. Plans are also being made for the Second Fortnight for Freedom that will take place this summer. More details about the Fortnight will be forthcoming.

Continue to pray that what is ours by right will be recognized and honored for the good of all. And continue to stand together. Your witness is needed now more than ever.

When Lent begins, we all sort of think, "Ok, what can I give up?" It brings about the need to sacrifice something that we love to do, eat or drink. When I think of our Lord, I think of "Goodness, Kindness, and being a Good Samaritan." I think "What would Jesus do?" which helps me set my plan for Lent. Father McCabe does a wonderful thing which has always stayed with me when he begins the gospel. He makes the sign of the cross on his forehead, his lips and his heart and says, "What I think, " "What I say," and "What I do." Just that is a reminder to me that we can do wonderful things for others, simple things that can bring us closer to Christ during this holy time. We can take responsibility for things we can change in ourselves and reach out and follow in the footsteps of our Lord to help others.

Last Tuesday on behalf of the Christian Mothers, I was handed a check for \$100.00 for the Life Center, bringing our total to \$11,344.00. I am honored to deliver the check and another baby bottle that came in to Lorraine Garriboldi this week.

ST. MARTIN OF TOURS BAPTISM PROGRAM

Our Baptism Program at St. Martin was revised ten years ago. It has evolved over this period of time and has had some changes to better accommodate our parishioners. The baptisms are now scheduled for Sunday afternoons at 3:00 PM. We would like to describe the entire program for everyone to understand how the program operates. The process is initiated when the parents of a child to be baptized contacts Karen at (516) 454-6454. She will schedule the Gathering, Baptism and Reflection dates at this time.

Home Visit: The first step in our process is a visit to the home of the family whose baby is to be baptized. Our program volunteers called Companions make this visit to greet the family and welcome them. They fill out the paperwork that is required for the church records and pray with the family.

Gathering: The Gathering takes place once a month for the babies that will be baptized the following month. This session is a prayer service where we have a scripture reading, review the Baptism process and view a DVD on "Your Baby's Baptism." It takes place on a Sunday afternoon at 2:30 PM in St. Alphonsus Hall.

Baptism: The third part of the baptism service occurs on a Sunday afternoon usually on the first or third Sundays (except when there is a holiday) at 3:00 PM. At this service the entire sacrament of Baptism takes place.

Reflection: The Reflection is scheduled every two months at the 1:00 PM mass and is for all of the babies that were baptized in the previous two months. At the Reflection there is a special blessing for the mother and father. At the conclusion of the mass, the families are invited to St. Alphonsus Hall for a reception and an evaluation of their experience with the whole baptism process. The baptism certificates are distributed at the end of the Reflection.

The heart of this program is the volunteers we call *Companions* they are the people who reach out to these families with the new born babies. They are the representatives of the entire parish to these families. This is a very rewarding ministry for these volunteers.
