Message from the Pastor

Last week, twenty-seven year old, Matthew Warren committed suicide. Matthew was the son of Pastor Rick Warren of the renowned Saddleback Church community in California. Rick Warren is one of the most famous pastors in America and some consider him the successor to Billy Graham as the key leader of the evangelical movement. I read his widely successful book, the *Purpose Driven Life*, and found it to be a very moving, spiritual book. In 2008, Pastor Warren interviewed, in separate television events, the candidates running for president at the time - Barrack Obama and John McCain. Warren wrote this to his Congregation about his son's death: "My son, Matthew Warren, 27, committed suicide in a momentary wave of despair at the end of a lifetime struggle with mental illness, dark holes of depression and even suicidal thoughts."

On different websites, many people have offered the Warren family messages of prayer and consolation. Sad to say, some have written incredibly mean-spirited words of hate, suggesting that religion is the source of problems in the world, or even worse, that Matthew was doomed to hell for committing suicide. These vicious people seek to blame the pastor and his family for their son's death and suggest that faith is a fraud because of what happened. At times in life, I find myself amazed at the goodness of people, and there are other times, when I can only shake my head in shock at the evil acts of some others.

Suicide is a tragic reality that touches many families, be they devoutly religious or hardened atheists. Several years ago, when I was the superior of the East Coast Redemptorists, one of my confreres took his own life. He had battled depression for years, and had been to the best doctors and programs that could be found to help him with his internal pain. His death left all his family and friends with so many questions. I still wonder if I could have done something differently that might have helped.

There was a time when the Catholic Church would not bury a person who committed suicide since it was considered a mortal sin. However, as we have come to learn more about the human mind through psychology and medicine, we now have funerals for those who take their own lives. It is believed that a person who takes his or her own life is truly not free. They are captured by the power of depression or mental illness. They are in such pain that they are blinded and see no other way of escape from their hurt. Our Catholic theology states that a person must be free to commit a mortal sin; it is hard to think anybody in their correct and free mind would choose to take their own life. In addition to the terrible pain that family and friends feel at the loss of their loved one, they are also left with haunting and painful questions. I often think that, in addition to the person who takes his or her life, there are many other victims drawn in through the death. Many family members and friends suffer guilt and wonder if they somehow could have prevented the suicide. Suicide is a devastating event for an entire family and community.

Many people suffer from various degrees of depression. Depression is a serious illness, like cancer, diabetes, or heart trouble. Sometimes well-intentioned people tell those suffering with depression "to snap out of it," or "get over it and move on!" We would not say such words to a person with cancer; we would tell them to get medical attention. Gratefully, most people who suffer with serious depression are not suicidal. Still as family and friends, we need to strongly encourage them to seek medical attention.

Serious bouts of depression do not suggest any lack of faith on the part of the person who is experiencing this illness. I have found that some depressed people feel they are not living their faith because they are doubting God's love and in such darkness. In truth, some of the greatest saints of the Catholic Church struggled with darkness and depression. I was amazed when I read that St. Théresè's own blood sisters feared that she might commit suicide since she was in such physical and emotional pain. As a priest, I am always moved by what people carry inside their hearts and souls. Some people have so many eternal worries about relationships, finances, and medical concerns; others have powerful intense internal struggles. Sometimes even their own family and friends do not know what their loved one is bearing.

A burden shared is almost always lightened. I strongly encourage anyone who feels the burden of depression or any other form of mental illness to seek help as soon as possible. I also invite any family members who may continue to struggle with deep guilt about the death of another to seek assistance. Faith in Jesus Christ does not take away our troubles. Faith reminds us that we never walk alone and that God is with us in our struggles. Faith calls us as a community of believers to seek to help one another carry their pain. We need each other to meet the living God. May the peace of Christ fill your heart and heal you where you hurt.

For us at the LIFE CENTER, this bill seriously threatens conscience protections. If an individual or organization (like the Life Center) objected to REFERRING OR COUNSELING FOR abortion, they would be DENIED ALL STATE FUNDING AND BE INDIRECTLY PRESSURED TO SHUT DOWN!

As if the above is not bad enough, Governor Cuomo has proposed a 6% state funding cut to services for people with developmental disabilities. Now more than ever we need to "storm" Heaven with prayers and to call our NYS legislators to oppose the radical changes the Governor wants to make. 
