Message from the Pastor

I was once on a retreat with young people years ago and we got talking about music. I must confess that most of the songs and musicians that they were speaking about were names that I had never heard. Finally, they asked me who was my favorite singer. I told them it was Anne Murray. Most of them sat in silence since they never heard of her. One fellow did say, "Isn't she dead?" (she's not) They looked at me like I was wearing high waters. Now, if asked today, I would answer Bruce Springsteen since I do like his music and it makes me look a little less out of touch with the world around us. Still, I always have a special place in my heart for Murray's music and I did hear her sing several times in concert. One of her popular songs was called a Little Good News. Here are the lyrics:

"I rolled out this mornin' the kids had the mornin' news show on Bryant Gumbel was talkin' 'bout the fighting in Lebanon. Some senator was squawkin' 'bout the bad economy. It's gonna get worse you see, we need a change in policy. There's a local paper rolled up in a rubber band. One more sad story's one more than I can stand. Just once how I'd like to see the headline say "Not much to print today, can't find nothin' bad to say", because nobody robbed a liquor store on the lower part of town. Nobody OD'ed, nobody burned a single buildin' down.

Nobody fired a shot in anger, nobody had to die in vain. We sure could use a little good news today. I'll come home this evenin', I'll bet that the news will be the same. Somebody takes a hostage, somebody steals a plane. How I wanna hear the anchor man talk about a county fair. And how we cleaned up the air, how everybody learned to care. Whoa, tell me nobody was assassinated in the whole Third World today. And in the streets of Ireland, all the children had to do was play. And everybody loves everybody in the good old USA. We sure could use a little good news today. Nobody robbed a liquor store on the lower part of town Nobody Od'ed, nobody burned a single buildin' down. Nobody fired a shot in anger, nobody had to die in vain. We sure could use a little good news today."

Even though this song was written in 1983, it would seem that bad news has not changed much. We might add the story about three young women held hostage in Cleveland, a Civil War in Syria, the terrible infanticide practiced by Doctor Gosnell, and death of school children in Newtown, Connecticut. No one can argue evil is very real and alive in our world today, just as it has been throughout history. People can and do choose to do evil acts toward others and the world around them because they do not believe in God, or reject Him, or do evil in the name of a mistaken notion of God. There lot's of bad news around us.

Still, there is far more good news happening every day, and in every moment of the day, throughout the world that is very often either taken for granted or not noticed. Goodness is far more the norm than evil. It is our faith that all loving and gracious behavior flows from the power of the Holy Spirit, even if the one doing the loving deeds is unaware of the Holy Spirit or even if he or she is an unbeliever. The Scriptures tell us: "Wherever there is love, there is God."

I am going to mention what I think are twenty moments of the Holy Spirit acting in our world. I am sure you could easily come up with a thousand more:

Today, a mother chose to have her child over having an abortion.

Today, a homeless man was fed in a shelter

Today, a wife dressed her husband suffering from Alzheimer's disease.

Today, a nurse's aide comforted a lonely woman in a hospital.

Today, a brother let go of a long-held anger against his brother.

Today, a religious education teacher taught a child to make the sign of the cross.

Today, a police officer gave a man CPR and saved a life.

Today, a family sat around the dinner table and shared a meal and the news of the day.

Today, a woman went to mass and prayed for her son to return to the faith.

Today, a rosary was said praying for peace.

Today, doctors worked to cure cancer.

Today, a popular teen reached out to a lonely girl in school and invited her to lunch.

Today, a grandfather took his granddaughter to the zoo.

Today, a person refused to spread a juicy piece of gossip.

Today, children of different colors and religions played kickball in the playground.

Today, a man went to an AA meeting.

Today, a stranger helped a person change a flat tire.

Today, a prison chaplain prayed with a convicted murderer.

Today, Catholic Mass was celebrated all over the world.

Today, a person said "wow!" as they looked at the sun setting over the ocean.

My favorite word in the Bible is Emmanuel: God with us. Jesus promised us to send the Holy Spirit. We live and move and have our being in the presence of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit of God is constantly inviting you and me to love the God who first loved us and to love our neighbor. In his letter to the Romans, St. Paul says, "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." In the movie the *Wizard of Oz*, we are told to look inside yourself to find yourself. God tells us to look inside yourself to find the Holy Spirit. The first one will get you to Kansas. The latter will get you to Heaven. Take your pick.

KERMIT GOSNELL ABORTION TRIAL: Dr. Kermit Gosnell convicted of killing three babies born alive at his clinic will be formally sentenced Wed. 5/15/13 in the death of one of the babies along with the overdose death of a patient and hundreds of abortion law violations. Dr. Gosnell decided not to appeal the First Degree Murder conviction handed down for killing three babies. Instead, he will accept several terms of Life Without Parole to avoid a potential death sentence. "Journalists Kirsten Powers (USA Today), Mollie Hemingway, (getreligion.com) and Conor Friedersdorf deserve some kind of public service award for goading fellow members of the media to wake up to the horrific story in Philadelphia, where Dr. Kermit Gosnell is on trial for his chamber of horrors, aka Women's Health Society. The national Media seem to have their eyes open now. For example, Margaret Sullivan, the NY Times public editor, wrote on her blog April 15, that "The murders of seven newborn babies, done so horrifically, would be no ordinary crime." "Any suggestion, including mine on Friday, that this is just another murder trial is a miscalculation." "Judged on news value alone, the Gosnell trial deserves more coverage than it's had, in the Times and elsewhere."

He stated, "Abortion is too often, and in too many newsrooms, exactly the kind of topic that brings on a

sudden case of Snow Blindness."

"The irony is, that much of the media's lethargy in covering the Gosnell case really doesn't surprise," Chaput wrote. "It's part of the FABRIC OF CULTURE THAT SIMPLY WILL NOT SEE WHAT IT DOESN'T WANT TO SEE ABOUT THE REALITIES OF ABORTION."

Pentecost

Penterost is the day that the church was born. Christ was crucified, rose again, spent forty days with his disciples, then ascended to heaven. Pentecost immediately followed. For two millennia, Christians have been celebrating the church's birthday with joy and exuberance. Pentecost takes place 50 days after Easter Sunday. Here's how it all got started.

Background of Pentecost

Believed to be the oldest feast in the Church, the story of Pentecost dates back to the first century A.D. The feast of Pentecost coincided with the Jewish Feast of Weeks, which occurs 50 days after the Passover (Deuteronomy 16:10). According to Jewish tradition, the Ten Commandments were given to Moses 50 days after the first Passover, which freed the Hebrews from their bondage in Egypt. As the Hebrews settled into Canaan, the feast became a time to honor the Lord for blessing the fruits of their labors. At the time of Jesus, the festival focused on rabbinical law and traditions. Since this Jewish holiday took place at the same time of the Pentecost, many Jewish Christians appropriated its celebration into their Christian commemoration of the coming of the Spirit.

Story of Pentecost

According to book of Acts, the Church came into being on the day of Pentecost. As 120 worshipers, including the Disciples, were fasting and praying in an upper room in Jerusalem, the Holy Spirit descended upon them in a violent rushing wind that was heard throughout the city. Small flames of fire rested upon their heads, and they began to speak in other languages. As crowds came to investigate the commotion, the Apostle Peter spoke to them about Jesus and exhorted them to repent. From the crowd of Jews and converts, 3,000 realized the truth of his words and became followers of Jesus.

Pentecost Traditions

There are many Pentecost traditions. In some churches, baptisms are performed throughout the day. Pentecost is also known as *Whitsunday*, because of the white garments worn by those who are baptized. In most Pentecost services, priests or church officials wear red vestments. Sanctuaries are decorated with banners depicting flames, wind, and doves. Churches in Italy disperse rose petals from the ceiling to symbolize the tongues of fire described in the book of Acts. French churches blow trumpets throughout the service to suggest the Holy Spirit coming with a violent rushing wind.

Pentecost Today

The purest meaning of Pentecost is that of a time of renewal for Christian believers. There is a renewed focus on evangelism, empowerment from the Holy Spirit, deeper intimacy with God, and fellowship. For Christians, the celebration of Pentecost imparts faith, hope, a sharing of community, and an awareness of a purpose much greater than themselves.





Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful. And kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And you will renew the face of the earth.

Lord, by the light of the Holy Spirit you have taught the hearts of your faithful. In the same Spirit help us to relish what is right and always rejoice in your consolation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

If you did not receive this material, which should include a letter from the pastor, a survey about the parish, and a case statement, and for most, a questionnaire, you are welcome to stop in the office and get one.

We have mailed this material to every parishioner (family) that we have listed in our records. We desire to be as inclusive as possible since we want to know everyone's thoughts about how to care for parish and property as we move into the future.

Your responses are confidential and known only to Lynch. The parish priests and staff do not have any access to your responses.
