Message from the Pastor

I like the month of June. It is a time when the summer lies before us with the promise of warm weather, vacation, the kids home from school (not being a parent, I am not sure how you see that), barbecues, ballgames, and a bit slower pace of activity. This summer we are planning to have a one week Bible Camp program from August 12th to August 16th. Yet, we know how fast the time of the summer will pass. On Labor Day, you may well say, where did the summer go? It was so fast.

Parish life slows down during the summer. Although our religious education leaders are very busy planning for the upcoming programs, we have no classes during the summer. On Friday evening May 31st, we had a very nice party with our religious education teachers as a way of thanking them for their ministry. The highlight of the night was the *Electric Slide* done by Fathers Henry, Jim and Ciya.

This past year our parish had over 1,300 children in our religious education program. Deacon Jim Biggin is the overall program director and Pat Ryan and Laura Leigh Agnese are the coordinators. We are blessed with a wonderful team of volunteer teachers, some of them who have been doing it for twenty and thirty years. Over the course of the year, first graders were given their first formal introduction to religious education. Children were prepared for the sacraments of Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation. Our program sought to teach our young boys and girls about the Bible, the Ten Commandments, who Jesus Christ is and what he means to us and what he taught, the Sacraments and the Church.

The ministry of religious education is being conducted in a very secular time. This year I asked the children to write once a month about the Mass they attended. Several times I would read something like this: "I would like to go to Church but my Mom and Dad are too busy to go or my Mom and Dad won't take me."


One of the most powerful experiences I had this year was when I met with the religious education teachers of the parish. This year we had instituted a program that mandated the children to attend Sunday Mass at least once a month. I discussed with the teachers that we may not accept back children into our program whose parents completely ignored this rule. I had the feeling that if the parents could not even bring their child to Mass once a month that it was very difficult to provide a serious religious education for them. I believe the teachers understood what I was trying to do. I was hoping to have the parents connect with their faith at Mass and to witness to their children that going to Mass was important. I have a sense that today's parents are under tremendous pressure to provide for their children and all their activities. Whether they go to Mass or not, I know they are men and women who love their children and want to do all they can for them. I suppose I was thinking you must attend soccer practice to be on the soccer team, you must go to dance class to be in the recital, and you must attend the meetings at school that are required. I must confess I had a somewhat queasy feeling using Mass attendance as a requirement.

Still, many of the teachers told me that they felt my policy would hurt the children and that they should not be punished for the actions of their parents if they chose not to attend any Masses. They spoke with passion and they spoke out of love for their children. I was profoundly moved by the love and commitment our teachers have for the children they teach. When I meet a religious education teacher, I will ask how he or she likes it and the answer would often be, "Father, I love it! I love the kids!"

I know there are those in our Church who feel that we are losing the next generation, that the kids of today do not know how to genuflect in church, that they talk in Church (as do many of us including me), that they can't sit still, that they do not dress properly for church, that they don't know the 10 commandments, they do not say the rosary, that they don't go to confession or communion regularly. I would agree the Catholic world of today is far different than the one I grew up in many years ago. Less people go to Church and many of the customs and traditions that we grew up with are not known to the young people. Still, when I see our teachers and religious education staff in action, I do not lose hope. Even if we may not always see it, the Holy Spirit is alive and active.

I am unsure how to proceed with my policy about mandated monthly mass attendance. I am still praying about it and consulting with the religious education team. I would welcome any feedback you wish to give me as I discern how best to pastor our children and their families.



MORE ON "REBUILT"

[I recently read an excellent book about a Catholic parish in the suburbs of Baltimore. The book is called *Rebuilt* by Father Michael White and Mr. Tom Corcoran. It is the story of how they took a dying parish and brought it back to the point where they have overflowing crowds. As I read it, I appreciated how much life and energy we have here in St. Martin of Tours and what committed parishioners we have

We do not face the many problems that these two men did in their parish. We are a very alive and vital parish. Still, I think there are many things, especially about evangelization, that we might learn from reading the book. *Evangelization* is a very popular word in church circles; quite simply, *it means that I love my faith and I am happy to share it with others who might also come to love it*. The authors in line with the teaching of the Church, say that this is really one of the primary missions of a parish.]

Here is a section (in italics) where the authors raise the question in a somewhat humorous way, as to how welcoming a parish they are to people who are not regulars at church.

I vividly remember my Christmas Eve Mass at Nativity, specifically the 4:00 p.m. Mass. Like everywhere else, this is the Mass that attracts the biggest crowd of the year, with lots of visitors and newcomers as well as 'dechurched' people.

After Mass, in the gathering space, I was approached by one of the parishioners. She shouted to my face, "It makes my blood boil to see **that** in church." "That" turned out to be a young man dressed in black denim, sporting multiple tattoos and piercings, a really interesting hair color, and I think mascara. Everyone in the church, including the young man, heard her. "Merry Christmas to all and good night!" The message was clear: This is our church and Christmas Eve was for us!

Quite honestly, I could not picture people in our church at St. Martin's acting in such a way toward such a young man. However, in our hearts we might feel it since I think it is a struggle for all of us to truly believe our faith, our church, belongs to all. I do hear occasional remarks from some parishioners who complain about how people are dressed. I know their heart is in the right place: they want a deep respect shown to Christ and the Mass. I admire that. Still, although I find people, especially the young, at times rather casually dressed, I really have not seen any person dressed in what I would consider very inappropriately dressed.

We know our church is struggling so hard to have young people come to church. I am not sure if the first thing they should hear from the pastor is that they are not correctly attired. Perhaps as they grow in understanding of the Eucharist and a bit older, they might change their wardrobe. Nonetheless, I am, as I am sure you are, delighted that they are worshipping God and receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus.

Parish Missionaries

I enjoy meeting parishioners after Mass on the weekends chatting and discussing the ups and downs of the Mets and Jets (mostly downs!) Yet there are very moving moments when people share with me a personal story about someone in their family with a serious health issue, or their own medical worry about something they are facing. I always hold these requests in my prayers. Other times, I hear about students who have finished school, children in the military, and concerns about family. They are quick conversations but ones that remind me of the depth of family love.

Over the past couple of weeks, I have heard two stories about parishioners who are going on missionary efforts this summer. Kristi Alvarez, one of our religious education teachers, and her grandmother, Anna Gatto. They will be going to Lourdes, France to work with the people who are pilgrims, many of whom are sick and in wheel chairs. When I went to Lourdes two years ago, one of the realities that touched me the most was the dedication of the men and women who volunteer their time and talent, at their own expense, to help the sick and suffering. I often say watching them in action was one of the real miracles of Lourdes for me.

I also met Louise Sandberg at the end of one of the Masses. She was so excited about her missionary work to Uganda, Africa in August. I asked her to email me about what she would be doing.

"I am going to this trauma-ridden country to minister God's love to children. As you may already know, the Lord's Resistance Army led by Joseph Kony, devastatingly and brutally ravished almost two generations of children in Northern Uganda (and more recently in the Congo and Sudan) from 1988 – 2010. He would capture and enslave the children, abuse them psychologically, physically and sexually, and then get them to fight in his army, forcing them to physically, sexually, and psychologically abuse and brutalize other adults. Many of these children have been rescued and placed in "refugee"-type camps in Northern Uganda where they are being kept and educated. Not much has been done to help them process and heal from their experiences so we are going to bring to bring them God's healing love." May God bless Louise in this great work.

How proud our parish can be that we have three missionaries going to France and Uganda to

bring God's love to people in great need. They go at their own expense and without remuneration. None of them asked me for a donation, but I would like to offer the parishioners an opportunity to support the St. Martin of Tours Missionaries this summer. If you wish to, you can drop a donation off to the parish office or to me and I will divide it between the two projects.
