

Message from the Pastor

For many years, I have said in different homilies that I have been to the Holy Land several times. After a pause, I smile and say, Yes, I have been to Ireland several times. The people laugh. Well, on Father's Day, June 16th, I will be flying to Jerusalem to spend twelve days there. It has been something that I have always wanted to do, but every time I planned it, either something bad would be happening in the Mid-East or something would come up in my work that prevented me from going. I finally decided that if I wait until there is perfect peace in the area of the Holy Land, I may be waiting a long time.

When I tell people that I am going on this trip, they have two reactions: "Wow, that is wonderful; I am so happy for you," or, "Are You Crazy?" I have spoken to several parishioners who have gone on such a trip and they have given me the greatest encouragement by telling me how much their lives were touched by the pilgrimage.

I am going on a Franciscan pilgrimage, as a member of a group of people I do not know. I am not a guide or director but just a pilgrim which makes me happy. I chose the Franciscan tour because their Order had been placed in charge of the Holy Land by the Pope many years ago, and they have good knowledge and access to the holy sites. The trip has a scripture professor who will also be with us.


The word *pilgrimage* is important to me. I am not going as a tourist to see sites but with the hope this journey will deepen my love for Jesus Christ and His Church. I hope it will be spiritually enriching and perhaps be part of some future preaching. I also know that it will be fun. I am blessed to have this opportunity since I am able to use travel miles that I accumulated over the years from my travels in other ministries. Here is an outline of the tour:

- Day One: the group travels overnight to Jerusalem-I will already be there a day
- Day Two: a day of rest and relaxation in Jerusalem
- Day Three: Visit the Mount of Olives, the Church of the Ascension, Walk along the Palm Sunday Road, the Garden of Gethsemane, to the Kedron Valley, then to the village where John the Baptist was born and the Church of the Visitation
- Day Four: the wailing wall, Bethlehem, the Shepherd's Fields, Bethany the home of Martha, Mary and Lazarus, and the tomb of Lazarus
- Day Five: the Dead Sea, Qumran where the Dead Sea Scrolls, were found and then into the Sinai desert
- Day Six: climb Mount Sinai for the sunrise and then on to the Red Sea
- Day Seven: Petra-one of the seven wonders of the world
- Day Eight: Ride a horse into Petra (I hope it is a big horse) and then on Tiberias
- Day Nine: Cana, Tabor the Mount of the Transfiguration, a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee, Tabha (the site of the multiplication of the loaves and fish), then to the Jordan River where we will renew our baptismal vows.
- Day Ten: Nazareth, the Annunciation Church and Mount Carmel
- Day Eleven: Jerusalem, the Path of the Crucifixion, Golgotha, the Upper Room Day Twelve: home to the USA

Sometimes, the Holy Land is called the fifth Gospel because this land is so filled with the presence of Christ, and I am so happy to be going. I do recall that St. Alphonsus, the founder of the Redemptorists, spoke about the reality that many pilgrims make great effort to go to the holy places such as the holy land when we have Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist in every Catholic Church in the world. So, I ask you to pray for me in the beautiful and holy land of St. Martin's Church.

Every day we will have Mass and prayers at the various holy sites. The trip includes some stops in Jordan and Egypt. I promise to pray for you and your intentions at the various sacred sites of this trip, especially at Calvary, Bethlehem, Mount Sinai, the Mountain of the Transfiguration, the Wailing Wall, the Sea of Galilee, and The Church of the Annunciation. I carry you all in my heart and thoughts.

Dear Parishioner,

I would like to thank all of the families that participated in our feasibility study this past April and May. It was encouraging to see the amount of families that took time to offer their opinions and questions surrounding the proposed projects. Additionally, we received an overwhelming positive response from the families that took part in this endeavor. Your collective response has given us the necessary case statement, lay leadership, and fiscal support for a capital campaign. Moreover, your input has been essential in providing a direction for the future of our parish. Specifically, it has aided us in determining which projects are of priority. Additionally, your input has provided us the foundation of what will be a strong lay leadership effort.

We are currently in the process of obtaining the necessary approvals to begin a capital campaign. Also, we are in the preliminary phase of planning our campaign. The summer months will be utilized to plan a Fall 2013 capital campaign, to address the projects outlined in the feasibility study. You will begin to receive more information as September approaches.

Below, we have provided general results from the feasibility study, for your review. The final feasibility study report and results are formatted in a comprehensive packet. Therefore, if you would like to review the final report and results, please know it is available in the parish office. I am grateful for your continued love and support of our parish and community. I look forward to working with all of you on this endeavor. Please be assured of our prayers and may God continue to bless you and your family.

The following are the statistical results from Phase I: **Interview Phase**:

- The enthusiasm expressed for St. Martin of Tours itself during the interview process was strong with 98% indicating an either Excellent or Good rating in regard to the reputation of the Parish.
- In regard to the leadership and operations of the parish under Fr. Patrick Woods, 93% of those interviewed felt he was doing either an Excellent or Good job.
- 98% of the interviewees indicated that the case statement proposals were an Excellent or Good idea.
- 93% families indicated that they would pledge to a potential capital campaign. Each interviewee was asked to provide a range of potential gift should the proposed projects move forward. These ranges offered the donor the opportunity to make their pledge commitment over a three year period. 25 of the 45 interview participants were able to indicate gifts in the range of \$135,000 to \$216,000 dollars to a potential campaign effort.

Based on this response counsel anticipates the top 100 donors will provide the initial \$400-\$500,000 to the campaign effort.

The following are the statistical results from Phase II; **Parish Mailing Questionnaire**:

- 254 individuals or families responded to the second phase of the study. This is an extremely high response rate and represents approximately 1/3 of all envelope users.
- Over 95% of the respondents felt that the Parish had an Excellent or Good reputation.
- Over 98% of the respondents felt that Fr. Patrick Woods was doing either an Excellent or Good job. Study participants *strongly* indicated their support of Fr. Patrick Woods.
- 80% felt that that the case statement proposals were an Excellent or Good idea.
- When asked to consider a sacrifice of \$1, \$2 or \$3 a day over three years in order to accomplish the raising of the funds necessary for the construction of the new church, 69% indicated a yes response.
