Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Over the past two years, I have twice made a donation from the parish to the Bethpage Fire Department. One was during their annual fund raising campaign and the other was in gratitude for all they did for the community during Hurricane Sandy. Whenever our parish has had an emergency, they are so very professional and prompt in their response. I was surprised when both donations were returned to me with a very kind note that stated the Fire Department appreciated our gift but they also want us to know that they consider what we do for the community to be so very important they would not accept it. I was touched by that.

As pastor, I am somewhat surprised by the number of unsolicited phone calls that are placed by businesses seeking to have us use their services. Genny Mitchell, our parish secretary, does a fine job not allowing most of them to get through to me. We also receive phone calls from many charities who are seeking a donation from the parish, along with groups of people who want to come to the parish and do fund-raising at the weekend masses. Some of these groups are wonderful people who are helping the very poor: Food for the Poor in Haiti, Cross International that raise money for the poor, Help for Persecuted Christians in the Middle East, and support for Christians in the Holy Land. I believe these are fine charities and do a great deal of good for the poor and needy. However, I have chosen not to have them come into the parish and speak at the Masses. When I hang up the phone, I do feel a bit of guilt (we Irish specialize in that).

Every year our parish does have an annual collection for the Sisters of the Poor, a religious community that takes care of the elderly. We also, by diocesan norms, have an annual mission appeal to help people in other lands. There is also the Annual Diocesan Appeal which seeks to help many needs within our own diocese. There are numerous second collections for many important needs of the Church and various people in need.

Our parish has been amazingly generous in the annual baby bottle campaign that supports pro-life concerns. We also have fund raisers for Life Teen and Edge programs. We raise money through the annual Golden Harvest Celebration and the HOP Club. And every week parishioners continue to bring food and other necessities that help our parish Outreach Center serve those in need in our local community. And last, but not least (at least in my mind), we have our regular Sunday collections in support of the parish.

Wow! That's a lot of charity in action! I know that many of you also receive many requests in the mail to support other charities and fund raisers that are seeking to do good things for people. People at your place of work may sell you raffle tickets from their parish fund raiser or local charity that they are supporting.

It is not easy to meet the challenge of so much demand to help those in need. Many of you are seniors living on a fixed income. Many of you are paying mortgages for your homes, car payments, school tuitions, and medical insurance. The taxes of Nassau County are among the highest in the nation.

To be a follower of Jesus does demand that we be concerned about others and their needs. To be a follower of Jesus also requires that we seek to provide for our family and needs of our households. We may well feel we are being overly stretched in all the financial requests for help that we receive and are asked to respond to. What is a person to do? It is not easy to respond to this question, but here are some practical ideas I offer you:

- 1) Pray about how you want to help others in need and still provide for your own needs and those of your family. If you have a family, speak about this together as you discern.
- 2) Recognize that you cannot meet every charity that asks something of you. That is impossible unless you are Donald Trump. Pick a few charities that you might choose to help. Prioritize what you consider the most important donations that you wish to meet. I do hope your parish would be on the top of the list or near the top of that list. In truth, support of your parish is really not a charity, but a commitment as a member of the parish family.
- 3) All generosity begins with gratitude. When a person sees how blessed they are, when there is an understanding of all that God has given, it moves one to want to be generous. If we can give out of love and choice rather than out of obligation, we are giving in a spirit of gratitude. As the Bible says, God loves a cheerful giver.
- 4) If you can, perhaps, you can link your donation to some sacrifice. Perhaps you love to spend three or four dollars a day on coffee; maybe you consider spending only two and the rest goes to others. As you miss that jolt of coffee, you might reflect on how your sacrifice is touching others. Perhaps a family might consider one simple meal a week as a way of communal giving to others. These are things usually spoken about during Lent, but really they are part of being a disciple of Jesus.

As you often hear from the parish priests and deacons, we are humbled and challenged by your ongoing generosity to so many needs. I think it is only in heaven that we will learn how our donations to charities helped others. May God bless you - all loving hearts.
