Letter from the Pastor

As you may know, I am a big Seinfeld fan. One of the shows tells the story of Elaine dating Lloyd Braun. Lloyd is one of Mayor Dinkins' advisors as he runs for re-election against Rudy Giuliani. Elaine tells Lloyd she thinks everyone in the city should wear name tags so it will make the city friendly and homier as everyone says *Hello* to each other. Lloyd likes the idea and the Dinkins campaign plans on implementing it before the entire city starts to ridicule the idea.

Sometimes, I think Lloyd and Elaine might have been on to something since we have so many parishioners and I know so few of your names. I presume the same is true for you in terms of other parishioners. When we go to Church, we may say a hello to a few people as we come in and leave, but the vast majority of people, although we recognize them by face, we do not know them, nor have we ever spoken to them. I am often surprised when I mention the name of a long time active parishioner to another very active parishioner and they shake their heads and say *What do they look like-I might recognize them if I saw them.* Do not be alarmed: I am not going to suggest name tags!

There are many aspects to our Catholic faith and following our Lord Jesus. A primary goal we have is to come to know Christ more deeply and to love him. Many of us would see our spiritual relationship as between me and God. Certainly this aspect of our faith life is very important. A second aspect of being a member of a parish is to help build community. Belonging to a parish is not the same as having a membership in Costco's or the local gym. When Jesus began his public ministry he formed a community, a group of followers. He chose apostles and disciples, including several women who were part of this early community. Our Lord knew that after he went back to his Father, he needed men and women to continue to make his presence alive on earth. The Body of Christ is obviously the Eucharist. But it is also the people of faith who gather to hear the Word, receive the Lord, and bring their faith to the world around them. We do not go to God alone; we need each other. I love the prayer we say before the Sign of Peace: Look not on our sins but on the faith of your Church. However weak and sinful any one of us may be, we find strength and support in one another.

So how do we build a community of faith here at St. Martin's? Are we becoming the Body of Christ in Bethpage? Attending the Eucharist and worshipping together is an essential element of community. The Sign of Peace is a reminder that I must love my brother and sister as I step forward to receive Holy Communion. Faith is not a private matter. When I see you singing and praying, it strengthens me in my singing and praying. At the prayer of the faithful, we pray for the needs of the members of our local community: we remember the sick and the deceased of the parish and those serving in the military. In the bulletin, we read about various aspects of the parish and its members. Certainly our donations of food to the food pantry are a sign of our care for those in need in the Body of Christ.

Becoming involved in a ministry or parish committee is a great way to come to know other parish members. You may join the choir, the Christian Mothers or the Garden Committee, and you begin to come to know and meet other people who are also seeking to love God and their parish. Perhaps if you have been sitting next to the same people in church for many years, you might introduce yourself before or after Mass.

Our parish does not have very many social gatherings. I think most of us find our lives busy and it is hard to get up and go to gatherings. We do have the Golden Harvest Festival which is a fun night, but it does mean you have to buy a ticket and I know not everyone can afford one. We also have an International Night, which is a great deal of fun since we have such a diversity of foods. I have been considering having coffee and cake occasionally after different Masses. This is a challenge due to parking concerns for the Masses, but I think it may be worth doing if it would help build up a sense of parish community. I think if I asked the parishioners if they wanted more gatherings, most would say *yes we do*. But, I have a fear, perhaps mistakenly, that many that were so enthusiastic in asking for such events might not find the time to come and attend them.

I am excited about our Parish Block Party on August 23rd. There is an excellent committee planning it. I do hope you come and spend some time with other parishioners. Perhaps, go to some folks you never met and offer them some of your special taco dip or three bean salad. Personally, I would love to meet and welcome anyone carrying a fried *Twinkie*.

Earlier I used the words active parishioner. What is an active parishioner? It does not necessarily mean that you have to be an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist or a member of the Pastoral Council. What it means to me is that you care for your own spiritual well-being and those of our community. How that is shown is different for each one of us. I know that I often slip into Church in the afternoon to look for something and find some people in front of the Blessed Sacrament. They are great witnesses to me. What I would challenge us not to be is someone who is only concerned about what the parish does for them, and has no interest in the rest of the parishioners and their needs and dreams. We might think of the quote from the inaugural address of President Kennedy and re-write it for our parish: Ask not what St. Martin's Parish can do for you, but rather, ask what you can do for St. Martin's.

God bless our parishioners! I think we are on a good path together as we seek to help bring one another to Jesus. We are seeking to be faithful to being the Body of Christ here in Bethpage. I am blessed to be pastor to such a community!

WOUNDED WARRIOR PROJECT—THE GREATEST CASUALTY IS BEING FORGOTTEN

As we celebrated our fallen heroes on Memorial Day, may we continually keep in mind those that are fighting around the world for us every day. Keep in mind their families, waiting for their return, and those families that are caring for them now, and maybe for the rest of their lives. The following is about the Wounded Warrior Project and how they work for our wounded, and the statistics of those that are suffering, and might always suffer having defended us here back home. Please note that the following information was reported by the Huffington Post, 11/0712. The numbers have expanded since then.



Since 2001 when the war in Afghanistan was launched in response to the 9/11 terrorist attack, approximately 5,225 American military personnel have been killed in action in Afghanistan or Iraq. The casualty statistics only begin to suggest the suffering of the injured and of the families of those killed or injured. Because so many of the wounded are in their early 20s, they and their families face a lifetime during which the medical care required may be COSTLY, INTENSE, AND CONSTANT! Amputees for example, must be fitted for new prosthetics every few years.

According to a 10 month investigation by the Huffington Post, more than 16,000 Americans have been taken from the battlefield with severe disabling wounds. The U.S. Army Surgeon General's Office shows a dismaying range of injuries:

- 253,000 overall servicemen and women suffered traumatic brain injury on battlefields or elsewhere.
- 83% have lost one or both legs mostly from improvised explosive devices.
- General wounds have been suffered by 1,410 U.S. Troops.
- Traumatic burns, 2,542
- 142 have lost one eye in combat
- 5 have lost both eyes in combat

The Wounded Warrior Project is a NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION whose stated mission is to 'HONOR AND EMPOWER WOUNDED WARRIORS OF THE U.S. ARMED FORCES with a vision to 'FOSTER THE MOST SUCCESSFUL, WELL-ADJUSTED GENERATION OF WOUNDED SERVICE MEMBERS IN OUR NATION'S HISTORY.' WWP works to raise awareness and enlist the public's aid for the needs of severely injured service men and women, to help severely injured service members aid and assist each other, and to provide unique, direct programs and services to meet their needs. 


