
The Ripple Effect

Letter from the Pastor

The Saints will soon be marching in! I, like many of you, have a devotion to Catholic saints, and I have several favorites. I was very happy when the Christian Mothers donated the outdoor statue of St. Bernadette. I fell in love with her when I made a trip to Lourdes a few years ago. I am also happy that we were able to get, at no cost to the parish, the large statue of Blessed Francis Seelos CSSR who is near St. Alphonsus Hall. As I explained in a bulletin letter a few weeks ago, we now have a painting of St. Monica in our prayer area. She is the patron of parents praying for the return of their children to the faith. I am happy to inform the parish that Father Biju, our visiting Redemptorist priest from Alwaye, has painted five saints for the parish. I plan on eventually placing these images on the wall in the vestibule, on the opposite side of the choir loft steps.

Father Biju will soon be leaving us to return to his Province having completed his studies in Rome, and helping our parish during the summer. He is a very gifted man who has published several novels in his native language, had art exhibits and is a great cook. He recently cooked a meal for the men and women who worked in the summer Bible camp and it was haute cuisine (French - for great food!) When I learned of his many gifts, I asked if he would do some painting for our parish and he graciously agreed. So throughout the summer, he has been painting five saints. He did this for us at minimal expense. They are beautiful. I think the parish will cherish them for years to come. After consulting with various parishioners, I chose the following five saints: St. Anthony, St. Anne, St. Therese of Lisieux, St. Jude the Apostle and St. Peregrine. There were many other saints we could have chosen, but I settled on these five men and women who loved God very much and from whom we can learn much. St. Anthony is patron of the poor, travelers, and lost items. I thought of St. Anthony because of the generosity of so many of our parishioners to the food pantry. Serving the poor is a fundamental call of the Gospel. Anthony has also helped me find my lost cell phone several times!

St. Jude the Apostle is called the saint of the impossible. People pray to him in times of desperate need. St. Anne, the mother of the Blessed Mother and the grandmother of Jesus, is patron of grandmothers, women in labor and housewives. I love how so many of the grandparents bring their grandchildren to Mass and many of them are babysitters for these precious children. St. Therese of Lisieux is one of the most beloved saints of the Catholic Church. Even though she never left her convent, she is patron of the missions because of her great prayers for those on the missions. She is also famous for spirituality of the Little Way - doing little loving deeds for Jesus. St. Peregrine is the patron of those suffering from cancer. Cancer is very prevalent in our world that I thought he would be a good saint for interceding on behalf of us. Over the days to come, I will give more information about each of these five special friends of our Lord.

Those of us on the other side of sixty grew up in churches that were filled with images and statues of saints. No doubt, you had your favorite to whom you lit many candles for special intentions. After the liturgical renewal of Vatican II, there seemed to be lessening of saintly images and statues as churches were renovated to meet the new norms of Vatican II. What happened to the saints and our statues is a question that many Catholics have asked through the years.

The Catholic Church has not changed in its affection and love for our saints. However, what the Church is calling us to do is always place our primary focus on Jesus Christ as the path to salvation. Jesus is our Lord and Redeemer. We are brought to the love of the Father by him through the power of the Holy Spirit. Sometimes it seemed that some Catholics might have had more focus on a particular saint than on our Lord. In a Church, the focus should always be on the altar, the pulpit and the tabernacle. The altar is the

holy ground where we celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus. The pulpit is where we hear the Word of God, and the tabernacle is where the body of Christ is kept under the form of bread. The Church never wants our saints to distract us from these central areas of worship. Still the saints have an important role to play in the life of the Church in the devotion of many Catholics.

Here are some basic points about the role of saints in the life of a Catholic:

- We can always go to Jesus with our prayers. There is no saint who has more power or love for us than
 does Jesus. Jesus is the intercessor between us and his Father.
- You do not have to go to the saints to pray, nor do you have to have a favorite saint.
- When we pray to a saint, we are really praying to Jesus. We are asking the saint to join with us in our prayer to the Lord.
- The saints are great witnesses of grace to us. They faced many of the same challenges and difficulties of following Jesus and living life as do we. They are models to us of how we can love God and follow him.
- The saints are men and women in whom we can see the love and power of God shining. Many have written wonderful books that help us on the path to our Lord.
- The saints give us comfort and make God feel close to us. Since God is God and such a wondrous mystery, some find it easier to turn to a saint since they are so human and we know they will pray with us to our God.

There are many saints who have not been declared saints by the Church. A saint is someone who loved God and is now home with him. I believe you and I have lived with saints (perhaps your own parents or a relative) who you know to be a saint. You can ask them to pray with you to Jesus. Sometimes saints do reveal themselves in mysterious ways. I think of people who feel they sometimes get a rose from St. Therese in a moment of need. However, we must never allow our love of the saints to enter into what might be called superstitious practices where we believe our prayers will be answered exactly as we wish if we pray in a certain way or do some kind of ritual. We do not control God and his grace.

Our Church is blessed by her saints. As we read in Hebrews 12:1 Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us.

On Tuesday, September 10th at the 9:00 am mass, Father Biju will formally show the five paintings of the saints that he has done for our parish. A farewell reception will follow for him in St. Alphonsus Hall. You are welcome to bring some pastries and cookies. Artists have a special love for chocolate donuts. He will be leaving before the weekend of September 13th -14th so it is our chance to thank him for being with us this summer, to wish him Godspeed in his new assignment, and to see the art work he has done for us.

I do hope to show the paintings at the weekend Masses since I know that many people cannot attend a morning gathering. It will take me some time to get the paintings framed, and set up since I want to provide the best possible setting for these beautiful images of those who have gone before us in faith.
