Letter from the Pastor

Last week, on September 7th, Pope Francis asked for a day of prayer and fasting to prevent war in Syria. (By the time this comes out in the bulletin, war may have started). I was at San Alfonso Retreat House, conducting a retreat for seventy or so people, among whom were about twenty-five of our parishioners from St. Martin's. I must confess that I did not do too well with the fasting part of his request but, on the retreat, we prayed several times for peace in Syria. I know that we did the same here at St. Martin's for all the Masses on September 7th and 8th. The Holy Father has asked the nations of the world not to go to war in Syria. If our nation does choose to attack Syria over its terrible evil use of chemical weapons on its people, whom do we follow, the Pope or the President?

I am a very patriotic America with a deep love for my country and I love what a deep sense of reverence our parish has for our nation, for our military, for our veterans, and for those who have died in war. Through the beginning work of Father John McKenna CSSR and the ongoing work of Frank De Cicco, we have the names of every American solider who has died in war since September 11, 2001. Having a recently retired nephew who was in the Special Forces, and deployed several times to both Iraq and Afghanistan, I know a little bit of the great worry, fear and concern that families have for their children who are in harms way, and also how very proud we are of our family members who seek to defend our nation.

I, like all of you, am a Catholic who seeks to follow Jesus, the teachings of his Church, and his vicar on earth, the Holy Father. So, the reality of war is a matter of conscience and prayer. The Church does teach that there are times when a just war can be fought. Here is a brief outline of what is a most serious and complex matter:

The strict conditions for legitimate defense by military force require rigorous consideration. The gravity of such a decision makes it subject to rigorous conditions of moral legitimacy. At one and the same time: the damage inflicted by the aggressor on the nation or community of nations must be lasting, grave, and certain; all other means of putting an end to it must have been shown to be impractical or ineffective; there must be serious prospects of success; the use of arms must not produce evils and disorders graver than the evil to be eliminated. The power of modern means of destruction weighs very heavily in evaluating this condition. These are the traditional elements enumerated in what is called the "just war" doctrine. The evaluation of these conditions for moral legitimacy belongs to the prudential judgment of those who have responsibility for the common good. The Catechism of the Catholic Church

I was a firm supporter of President George W. Bush's decision to invade Iraq. I believe he acted honorably for the sake of our nation. Now, with the insight of 20/20 hindsight, I must say I wonder if the decision was a good one. So many lives of Americans, Iraqis, and men and woman from other nations have been lost. So many people have been maimed and wounded. I am glad Saddam Hussein is gone, but I do wonder if the situation in Iraq is any better today than it was before war started. I now have serious doubts about this war.

Today, President Obama and our national leaders are faced with the great burden of similar decisions. What should the American response be to Syria and Assad's use of chemical weapons? As did President Bush, I believe President Obama seeks to do what is best for the nation and the world in the face of evil. Knowing what that is, is no easy matter.

Our Holy Father's desire for no war is important for our reflection. He has called for prayer and fasting to touch the human hearts involved on all sides of this conflict to move toward peace rather than violence.

I read the following piece online the other day. It was dated September 6th:

On Friday's <u>CBS This Morning</u>, Mark Phillips all but hinted that Pope Francis had "taken sides" with Russia's Vladimir Putin and against President Obama in the international debate over military strikes in Syria. Phillips proposed that the Pope's letter to Putin "must have been music to the Russian president's ears." Phillips led his report by noting that "popes have urged peace before. Remember, John Paul II was firmly against the Gulf War. This pope, Francis, is now actively arguing against military action against Syria. And the question is, "does it matter?" The CBS correspondent continued by outlining Pope Francis's recent actions on the Syria issue:

Phillips said: This pope with the common touch has been uncommonly active, lobbying against an attack on Syria. He's used his last two major public appearances in St. Peter's Square to appeal to world leaders – and that primarily means President Obama – not to do it...Pope Francis has followed up his appeal by writing to Vladimir Putin as current president of the G-20. 'Armed conflicts create profound divisions and deep wounds, which require many years to heal,' he said. It must have been music to the Russian president's ears. The Pope may be taking a moral position, in his mind, but in arguing against military action, he has entered into the world of partisan international politics. He's taken sides.

I do not seek to attack Mark Phillips for what he said. I believe his view is that of many mainstream journalists. It would be my sense that they would consider the Holy Father naïve about world events and the Church should stick to things that it knows. I could not disagree more. First of all the Church has two thousand years of experience with nations and groups that choose to go to war. There have been times when the Church itself called for war (these are also difficult matters to historically judge). If our Church that seeks to follow Jesus, who taught us to love one another and to forgive our enemies, has nothing to say about war, then it should cease to exist. War, whether just or unjust, has a terrible impact on the millions of people.

I do not think the Pope, as Phillips says, "is taking sides." I think the Holy Father is taking the side of the victims of war. He is begging the leaders of the world to take alternative steps to the terrible situation in Syria. He is calling for world leaders to seek a path that will bring peace to the world. I would say he is taking the side of humanity.

Phillips goes on to say that popes have spoken against wars in the past and it has made little difference. I think the reporter fails to see the power of moral authority in terms of religious leaders, in particular the Holy Father. There was a famous statement made of Joseph Stalin when he was warned not to do something because the Pope at that time condemned what he was planning. Stalin cynically said, "The Pope! How many armies does *he* have?"

History would teach that Stalin was wrong: He is dead, the Iron Curtain has fallen, the Berlin War struck down, and Communism is on the decline in the world. Many experts credit John Paul II as one of the key factors in the fall of communism. When the Pope visited Poland, a land under the rule of the communists, the people chanted: "We want God, We want God!" The Pope has no armies but he has the power to speak the message of Jesus Christ to the world.

So, you and I pray for peace. I feel absolutely helpless as I consider the Middle East and its millenniums of war and division. Peace almost seems impossible. I am also afraid that the dispute with Syria, Iran or Iraq, could spark a third world war. Historians have taught us that the causes of war are never clear and what begins as a small battle can turn into global destruction. In the face of the complexity of the world situations of Middle East turmoil and world terrorism, I feel absolutely helpless. My only option is to cry out to God for his healing presence and peace. "O Lord, grant your people peace!"

Prayer of St. Francis of Assisi

Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy. O, Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; it is in dying that we are born again to eternal life.

RESPECT LIFE COMMITTEE OCTOBER IS RESPECT LIFE MONTH

The month of October brings with it God's gift to us in this season of spectacular color. Just to view the trees as they change from green to crimson, yellow, orange and gold, brings about such excitement. The days grow shorter, the harvest begins, and we notice how life is changing around us. What a time to celebrate Life! The change of seasons always brings about the awareness of God's hand in our creation, and the world he has created for us. What a way to welcome October, as Respect Life Month than to print this beautiful story about Pope Francis reaching out to a young girl by the name of Anna Romano.

Pope Francis has said he will baptize the unborn child of a woman who refused to have an abortion, after he telephoned her when she sent him an emotional letter. Anna Romano, 35 was on holiday when her mobile started to ring with a mystery number on the screen and she was stunned to find herself speaking to the Pope.

Anna, from Arezzo, near Florence in central Italy, had written to Pope Francis earlier this summer to describe her turmoil at having discovered she was pregnant by a man who, unknown to her, was already married with a child and who demanded she terminate the pregnancy. In the letter, she described to Pope Francis her dilemma and said to him, "I married when I was young and things didn't work out and I got divorced. I now thought I had met a man who was the man of my dreams." In June I discovered I was pregnant through him and when I told him instead of being happy, he told me he was already married, had a child and to have an abortion."

I told him that I would not have an abortion and told him to get out of my life." Anna added how she was "in a desperate and anguished state" and that she was writing to Pope Francis because she had "no one else to turn to, after being humiliated and betrayed. I addressed the letter simply to Pope Francis, the Vatican, and put it in the post. I really didn't expect to get a reply but then, out of the blue, I got a call from him. I would never have imagined that the Pope would pick up a telephone and call me and speak to me as if I were a dear friend. He reassured me and said a CHILD WAS A GIFT FROM GOD, A SIGN OF DIVINE PROVIDENCE and that I would NEVER BE LEFT ALONE. He said that as Christians WE SHOULD NEVER BE AFRAID."

"He told me I had been very brave and strong for my unborn child. I told him that I wanted to baptize the baby when it was born, but I was afraid as I was divorced and a single mother...but he said he would be my spiritual father and he would baptize my baby.

"I hope my letter will be an example for other women who feel they may be distant from the Church simply because they have chosen the wrong man, they are divorced or they are with men who are not worthy of being fathers. I don't know the sex of the baby but if Pope Francis does baptize it and it is a boy, I HAVE NO DOUBT OF HIS NAME....FRANCIS."
