Letter from the Pastor Paving the Way for Christ

Dear Parishioners,

As a Redemptorist, I have traveled to many parishes to give retreats and missions. The parishioners in most of these parishes were very happy with their priests and homilies. Occasionally however, I have heard through the years a complaint that went something like this: "All our pastor ever talks about is money!" When I heard that criticism, I said to myself that I was grateful I wasn't in a position to have to speak much about money since I was not a parish pastor. I never wanted to be accused of being a priest who only spoke about money, and quite honestly, I think no priest really ever wants that said about him.

So, I am going to talk to you about money! Something, I must confess, on one level, makes me a bit uncomfortable since I know how hard you have to work for your salaries; how some of you may be unemployed; how you worry about college tuitions and the needs of your children. There are those of you who are living on fixed incomes, barely making ends meet. There are those dealing with serious medical concerns in the family, others may be paying off loans, and on top of all that, there are the taxes of Nassau County. Although I have only been at St. Martin's for two years, I know that many of you face financial challenges. I also know that you are wonderful parishioners who love your parish.

We publish weekly what the parish received in the offertory collection. Very often it is on budget and other times a bit over. Sometimes we get less than budgeted. Our regular weekly collection is good and we are paying our bills and meeting our payroll. I believe our entire staff takes most seriously the need to be good stewards of what you contribute to the parish. As I have said several times, our parish runs well with a small staff that works very hard and quite professionally. I am confident that our parishioners will continue, as you have, to be supportive of the parish you love.

At the same time, we are now entering into a Capital Campaign in which we hope to raise at least 1.2 million dollars, and we really would seek to meet the campaign goal of 1.5 million. Why do we need this money and why now? As we study our property and buildings in consultation with building engineers and other experts, we realize we need to repair our school's roof and bricks. We also know that we must completely uproot the parking lot and repave it. These are absolute necessities that should be done in the next three or four years in a systematic way. If they are not done, there could be deterioration of the buildings with the possibility of bricks falling, water infiltration from the roof, and a parking lot that is difficult to navigate.

We also added to the list of needs the following: new boilers for the school that would convert us from oil to gas (which we think would save the parish money), renovations of the bathrooms in the cafeteria and St. Alphonsus Hall, creating a meeting room in the second room in the hall, and some minor renovations in the Parish Outreach Center. These are important needs, but not at the same level of the needs of the school and parking lot. Finally, if we were to reach our goal of 1.5 million, there is the hope that the school auditorium could become a space where the younger people of the parish could play sports such as basketball or volleyball. (And maybe some adults, if their jump shot is not too high in arcing).

Many of our parishioners no longer use the school since their children are grown. Still without the school, we would not have a religious education program. We would not be able to prepare the children of the parish for the sacraments. Last year, we had almost 1,300 children attend religious education in the five sessions that are held weekly. We have some various social programs in the cafeteria and in the auditorium. The Young at Heart, a program that has many senior women parishioners participating, also uses the school. We also host Alcoholics Anonymous which is an important work of the community. The care of the school is essential to the functioning of our parish.

This capital campaign is the result of a long consultation with parishioners, the parish financial committee, the parish pastoral committee, and the diocese. We decided to hire a firm, Lynch Associates, to guide us in the campaign. Again, after serious consultation, I came to believe that it was best to have outside help assisting us. To this point, I have been very happy with their work. It is hard to get exact numbers on what the projects will cost. We have gathered some projected estimates, but I have also heard those words that I am sure you have in terms of repairs: "we won't know exactly what it will cost until we get in there and see the damage." We believe the absolute necessary projects (the school roof, bricks and parking lot) will cost at least 1 million dollars, possibly more.

We will be asking parishioners to make a pledge to the campaign based on what they believe they can do in terms of making a sacrifice for the parish. I know some people, based on their economic situations, can donate more than others. We are asking for equal sacrifice not equal giving. One family or person may be able to give \$25,000.00, another \$500.00, another \$50.00 and another \$5.00. Only you can decide that. If you were to give \$3,000.00 over the course of three years, that would come out to \$2.00 a day. If a significant number of our active members could give \$3,000.00, we would able to reach the goal of \$1.5 million. When one makes a pledge, it can be paid over three years, either yearly, quarterly, or monthly. The pledge is not a legal commitment, but one that will be honored unless some unforeseen events were to happen and you could not afford it.

I am still working on deciding how we will honor parishioners who commit to assisting in the campaign with some kind of recognition, such as the tree we have in our gathering area. I wish to recognize all who give to the campaign. We will be asking for volunteers to help with the campaign, some of which may call you and ask you to consider pledging. We do this not to pressure you, but to make the campaign more personal.

We have a wonderful parish. I do not want anyone to feel in any way, that if they are unable to assist in the campaign, or can only give a small sum, that they are not good parishioners. If you felt that way, it would break my heart. You do what you can do. Although I am a proud Irishman, I want no one feeling guilty about what they could or could not do in this campaign. No guilt! I can only ask you to be generous according to your means. I also ask you to keep up your regular support of the parish in the collection. That is fundamental to the daily working of the parish.

This campaign, except for the redemption of the pledges, a three year process, will end before Thanksgiving of 2013. We will not be talking about money for the next three years. As the money comes in over the course of the next three years, our building committee, and our pastoral and financial councils will be taking the next step to address the projects that I have mentioned and I will be keeping you informed about them.

The theme of our Capital Campaign is *Paving the Way For Christ*. I always love Advent and the message of preparing for the coming of Jesus. As I thought about that and our parking lot, I came up with Paving the Way for Christ. Whatever we do at St. Martin's, be it celebrating Christmas Eve Mass or cleaning the bathrooms, the goal of every action is about helping us all come to deepen our love for Jesus who so loved us that he came among us as a man and died for us and rose on the third day.

I began by saying I never wanted to be a priest who was always talking about money. I hope you do not feel that way. Still, I feel that I am fulfilling my responsibility as pastor in calling for this campaign. If I did not, I believe I would be failing you as pastor and steward of the assets that you and your families have created over the years. I believe in what we are doing and I thank you for all you do and will do to continue to help us Pave the Way for Christ. May Our Lady of Perpetual Help and St. Martin of Tours intercede with Jesus for blessings on this campaign.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the timeframe for the capital campaign?

RESPECT LIFE COMMITTEE OPEN YOUR HEARTS TO LIFE!

"OPEN YOUR HEARTS TO LIFE!" has been a favorite theme of POPE FRANCIS and one that has particular urgency today, as the "CULTURE OF DEATH" is gaining an ever wider foothold. Some may think the phrase "CULTURE OF DEATH" is too grim or too exaggerated because, on the surface at least, ours looks like a culture of fun and pleasure. Most Americans are living comfortably, indulging in a tantalizing array of food and drink, and entertaining themselves with high-speed Internet and hundreds of cable-channels. And...among many young singles, casual sexual encounters are the norm. We live in a culture dedicated to maximizing pleasure and minimizing pain and inconvenience.

No less than the U.S. Supreme Court has told us that it is our choice to live as we wish...letting nothing and no one stand in our way, including the child who may be growing in her mother's womb. In upholding legal abortion for ANY REASON or NONE, the Court declared in PLANNED PARENTHOOD V. CASEY: "At the heart of liberty is the right to define one's own concept of existence, of meaning, of the universe, and of the mystery of human life." But when "liberty" leads to the doorstep of Kermit Gosnell and other abortion practitioners who have been in the news, we are forced to confront our culture's real views of human life.

OPENING OUR HEARTS TO LIFE means that we REJECT THE KILLING OF HUMAN BE-INGS FROM THE MOMENT OF CONCEPTION TO THEIR NATURAL DEATH....by ABORTIFI-CIENT "CONTRACEPTIVES" and ABORTION, in destructive EMBRYO RESEARCH and IVF procedures, by DENYING LIFE-SAVING TREATMENT TO THOSE WITH DISABILITIES, and by "HASTENING DEATH" OF THE ELDERLY AND DYING IN ASSISTED SUICIDE AND EUTHANASIA. OPENING OUR HEARTS TO LIFE, means OPPOSING THE DEATH PENALTY, as well as SLAVERY, HUMAN TRAFFICKING, TERRORISM, and UNJUST WAR, and that WE WORK to eradicate the conditions that prevent our brothers and sisters from realizing their full human potential.

That is what family is meant to be: a haven of unconditional love, acceptance, affirmation and consolation, where children learn by modeling their parents to accept others and love generously, to share with and care for those in need. It is a place to learn humility and mercy, to learn to imitate Christ. Like the saints, we can learn to love others sacrificially by recognizing our own weakness and littleness, and by begging God to transform us.

The irony is that LASTING HAPPINESS in this life is found in GIVING OF ONESELF GENER-OUSLY TO OTHERS. The mother of a child who is ill can't help but be moved to comfort her baby through the night...to suffer with him. The son of an ELDERLY PARENT with dementia can't help but respond with patience and affirmation to the often repeated stories, questions and fears. THOSE WHO LOVE NEED NO OTHER REWARD BEYOND THE HAPPINESS THEY FEEL IN KNOWING THEY HAVE BROUGHT COMFORT TO ANOTHER PERSON.




Divorce and Beyond Separation and Divorce Support Group

Last Sunday we celebrated Catechetical Sunday in preparation for entering into our religious education program. The role of a catechist in the Catholic Church is most important. Ann Hughes, Karen Sullivan and Father Henry Sattler lead our Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults for the parish and they prepare men and women who want to enter the Catholic Church. They do marvelous work in this program. Erin Horan, along with her volunteers, guides and helps deepen the Christian experience in our young people in the Edge and Life Teen programs. I also want to mention Deacon Gene Capobianco and Karen Sullivan who guide our baptismal program. They have a wonderful team of parishioners who work with the parents of those to be baptized in preparing them for this beautiful sacrament.

Jim and Carmella Biggin coordinate an excellent team of parishioners who help prepare couples for the Sacrament of Matrimony. Deacon Tom Hennessy continues to prepare outstanding courses for adult education. Under the direction of Pat Astarita and her team of dedicated volunteers, the parish had its first summer bible camp.

All of these programs are about passing on the faith to people. The men and women who serve in these programs are true catechists who love their own faith and wish to share it with others. How blessed is our parish to have so many men and women who are willing and happy to do these very important ministries.
