# Letter from the Pastor

When I was younger, I was very involved in marriage preparation for the Diocese of Erie, PA. So a couple came to see me one night, neither of whom was Catholic. Someone had referred them to me. They were older, had been dating for many years, and were struggling to decide as to whether they should marry or not. I spent an hour and half with them. As they were leaving my office, the fellow kind of ushered his girl-friend out the door and came back to talk to me. He told me that I had been very helpful to him and that he wanted to pay me for my time. I told him that it was not necessary since I considered this part of my vocation as a priest. He insisted that he wanted to pay me. So I said ok. He reached into his wallet and there was a wad of bills. Greed entered my heart and I thought, Wow, I might be getting a hundred dollars, maybe two hundred! He handed me a ten dollar bill and asked for five back. I was flabbergasted and embarrassed. I gave him the ten back and told him to give it to the poor. I had some other suggestions what he might do with the ten dollars but I won't mention them here.

Money! Money is a complicated topic and one that can bring out the best and worst in people. I know people have to be very conscious about money since they need enough funds to provide for themselves, to plan for the future, enjoy life, and hopefully help others. I am sure those of you raising families, paying tuitions, facing medical bills, living on fixed incomes, worrying about the new health care bill, having gas for your car and fuel for your home, braces for your child, and a little something for a rainy day cannot escape the relentless pressure of financial concerns. I think that is all of us, unless we are Bill Gates or The Donald. When we go to church, we go to pray, to focus on God, to receive Jesus, and to be with our fellow parishioners praising God. I suspect the last thing you want to hear about is money.

Well, this month of October, traditionally called the month of the rosary, might be called the "month of the money!" We will have at least two talks on the capital campaign going on in our parish as we seek to *Pave the Way for Christ*. The annual *Baby Bottle campaign* is this weekend to support the Life Center of Long Island. On top of both of these financial commitments, we are also selling tickets to the *Golden Harvest Festival*, as well as our regular Sunday collections. And I am sure there will be a second collection or two in the mix. After going to Mass, you might feel you were walking through Wall Street rather than Church!

However, I believe all three of these fundraisers are very important and point to important Gospel values. We have talked a great deal about the capital campaign. I believe what we are seeking to do in this campaign is very important for the future of the parish. I have been very happy with the response, especially in terms of how many people have volunteered to assist. I have met some wonderful people whom I only knew by sight and now have come to know them and how much they love the parish. In early November the main part of the campaign will slow down and we will talk about it a great deal less in the months to come.

I think our past achievements in the Baby Bottle campaign have been magnificent. Last year The Life Center of Long Island named us the *Pro-Life Parish of the Year*. It is amazing to think there may be several children alive today because of the nickels and dimes we donated to the Baby Bottle campaign.

I will confess I have placed a great amount of energy on the capital campaign, but I know that none of us can lose sight of the day-to-day operations of our parish: the masses, the funerals, the baptisms, the confessions, the food pantry, the religious education programs, and so forth. We need the support of our regular collections. Without your generous support, our parish could not do all the wonderful things we do every day.

Part of that regular annual support is the Golden Harvest. This event raises a substantial amount of money that allows the parish to meet its budget and pay its bills. I fully understand that our selling of tickets comes right in the middle of our capital campaign.

So please be both patient and generous with this "month of the money." We are a parish family that is working together to build up the Body of Christ here at St. Martin's. The goal of our parish is to bring one another to Christ. Fundraising is only a tool to aid us in something far more important: encountering the Lord.

God is blessing us and will provide for us through each other. And if you do hand me a ten dollar bill, please do not ask me for five back - it will bring back a bad memory!

# Saint Michael the Archangel





# RESPECT LIFE COMMITTEE October Is Respect Life Month

Life should be respected during every second, moment and hour of the year, but we especially come to celebrate it during the month of October. Being speakers for The Life Center of Long Island, my husband Jerry and I have been blessed to have had the honor of visiting many parishes in our diocese, bringing the message of life and hope for the preborn. As representatives of the Life Center, we center on women experiencing crisis pregnancies, their needs, the needs of the baby they will bring into the world, and a safe haven to rely upon during this time when she needs help the most. We are once again, honored to come before you this weekend with our annual Baby Bottle Campaign. Once again, we will marvel at the generosity, kindness and concern we receive from St. Martin's, and from Father Pat, Father Henry, our Respect Life Committee and all those that give us the opportunity to come before you.....once again!

As we end our appeal, we repeat the words of our beloved Pope John Paul II "In the name of God, ...respect....protect....love and serve life...every human life." Those words, we've repeated over and over for more than eight years, and yet....they leave us breathless and focused each and every time on those we serve. As we focus on the life of the preborn, we celebrate those that serve and have served every stage of life. The elderly, the homeless, the mentally and physically challenged, those without jobs...and those in despair.

Excerpts from the editor of the Long Island Catholic: WITNESSES TO THE CULTURE OF LIFE: "As we begin Respect Life Month, it is tempting to despair amid the violence and human suffering that dominate the headlines. I am prompted, instead to reflect on some of the Catholic people I have met, along my own faith journey, who, in so many different ways, have given of themselves to affirm the sacredness of All Human Life." "I think of people I've known in the pro-life movement: Lorraine Gariboldi, (past Director of the Life Center of Long Island) who provided alternatives to abortion, education on issues of life and human sexuality, and desperately needed healing for women and men, working through the tragedy of having aborted their child. Dolores Andreski, whose pro-life work included promoting life-affirming responses to disability..in care and treatment, and in supporting medical and scientific research to attack the causes, not the victims of birth defects. Jack Eschmann, (one of the first to bring about the Life Center 17 years ago). I first met Jack in the 1970s when he was helping organize pro-life participation in a walk-a-thon to benefit disabled children. After devoting his career, as a police officer, to protecting public safety, Jack in retirement threw himself into so many other volunteer efforts to offer others a "helping hand and a loving heart." St. Vincent de Paul Society to assist those in need: Dismass House, to help those leaving prison reintegrate into society: Anthony House for homeless men; travel to the diocesan mission in the Dominican Republic to assist with building projects; and full time service at the Life Center.
