As I studied the scriptures for reflection on the season of Advent, I did some serious research on the internet. Here is what I came up with when I Googled what are the most popular American holidays. From one source I found:

- Number one, to no surprise is Christmas
- I was surprised by number two: Halloween
- Thanksgiving was third
- 4th of July was 4th (people are either very patriotic or love barbecues)
- Sad to say, Easter only came in at number five.
- New Year's Eve in at six
- Mother's Day was seventh (this surprised me)
- Father's Day did not make the top 15
- I was shocked that St. Patrick's Day came in at a lowly number 12.
- Super Bowl Sunday, which is not a holiday, was tenth, but we Jet fans no longer recognize this as a holiday.

Almost everybody, with some exceptions, the *Grinch* and *Scrooge* to name two, loves Christmas. We love it for its joy, family gatherings and parties, decorations, trees, traditions and carols, and for the food. We love this day for its presents and its sense of hope that touches the mind, the heart and the soul at the beginning of Winter. Above all we rejoice and celebrate this day because it is the day we remember that Jesus, the Son of God, came among us as a man.

If I asked a group of Catholics what was their favorite liturgical season of the Church year, I believe that most would respond that it was Lent. Even though it is the season of ashes and fasting, meatless Fridays, and long Sunday Gospels, this season penitential time touches our hearts. Even the most casual of Catholics will proudly wear his or her ashes on Ash Wednesday. There is something in the human spirit that has a need to take stock, to ask ourselves some important questions about the meaning of life and death and faith. During Lent we feel a heightened need to pray and reflect on the mystery of life and my response to God and his gifts.

It seems to be that the lighting of the Advent wreath and the singing of *O come O Come Emmanuel* does not capture the Catholic imagination as does the call for conversion that Lent proclaims. It is kind of ironic since we most love Christmas, but the church season of Advent does not hold us as does Lent. Perhaps, the words and invitations of Advent are lost in the hectic pace that many of us keep during the four weeks before Christmas. We must shop, we must wrap, we must write cards (or email) we must buy a tree and decorate it, put lights on our homes, go to parties and plan our events. The time before Christmas is usually the busiest of the year for most of us. On top of all this, there are pageants to attend, school winter festivals in which to participate, and certainly, our need to keep watching the National Football League and *Dancing with the Stars* does not lesson.

We know that many of us arrive on Christmas Night with a spirit of exhaustion and wonder if we have overspent and overate, and have a kind of aching in our souls and hearts that maybe we missed something. Perhaps, that is why we like Lent— it enables us to recover from Christmas.

This is not a sermon complaining about the Christmas shopping being too commercial. I am a rare man who loves to Christmas shop. I may not be ready to fight the war with secular society who do not want to say *Merry Christmas* and gives us instead the bland *Seasons Greetings* or *Have a Good Holiday*. Ironically, the word holiday comes from holy day. I am not going to ask you to turn off your Christmas lights until December 24th or not allow Jesus in your Christmas crèche until Midnight on the 25th. I will accept generously your offer of Christmas cookies and eggnog before, during, and after Christmas Day!

But, and you know there is always going to be a *but*, I do invite you to enter fully into the richness of the Advent Season as much as you can. The readings and message of this season resound with themes of hope in the midst of struggles, reconciliation with our enemies, peace on earth, attentiveness to the wonder of creation and to the God who created it for us.

During Advent, we hear about swords being turned into plowshares. As we worry about North Korea and Iran using nuclear weapons, as we hear about people being knocked down in our city streets by young men who have such empty lives they find such an activity a way to relieve boredom. This reading and so many of Advent readings give us hope for a better time. What you see is not what you get. God is master of the Universe and there will come a time when all will be well and peace will reign. We need the hope of Advent.

I know we always need reconciliation in our hearts. Every Christmas, as I sit down to write my Christmas cards, I cannot help but think of those couple of people that have dropped out of my life for some very human reasons. Something draws us apart; where there was once a closeness is now a distance. Should I write a card and say hello or just leave it be? I know people will feel great pain this season because they are at odds with a brother or sister, a parent, or a close friend. As people sing *Peace on earth*, we wonder if we can make peace with those with whom we feel at odds. The message of Advent invites us to consider this great yearning for reconciliation.

There are some of us who have heavy hearts as the world is singing *Joy to the world*. This may be the year we lost our husband, our mother, our best friend. We carry an ache for them and so feel their loss, particularly during a time that is so filled with so many memories. Advent is a time of hope. Our beloved are home with the God who took flesh in Bethlehem and redeemed the world.

One of my favorite moments of Thanksgiving is after the meal is over, lying down, and watching football. Slowly the tryptophan from the turkey takes effect, along with the two glasses of wine and I am dozing as the kids switch the television to the Disney Channel.

A key message of Advent is be awake. Don't miss the presence of God in your life. Sometimes we say we are waiting for Christ to come at Christmas. Christ came 2000 years ago to us; he keeps coming among us in the Eucharist, in the Word, in our Church, in the faces of one another, in the joys and sorrows of life, and in the thousand daily moments of every day. Be Awake! Don't Miss him. He is here. Have a great Advent!

When we are truly grateful to God, it moves us to reach out to others. Our parish is one of gratitude and generosity. Last Saturday our food pantry team under the direction of Rosemary Scarangella, donated 60 turkey baskets with all the trimmings with the help of Long Island Cares, Island Harvest, and Crossroad Restaurants.

On Tuesday, more than 50 dinners were donated by BK Sweeney's and Crossroads Restaurant. Thank you to all who donated so generously to the food pantry. Rosemary tells me the requests are growing with an average of 4-6 new families in need. These issues are a great challenge to us as a nation and a society, but we can so proud of all of you who are working in your own ways to help address hunger.

<u>Celebrating Confirmation</u>

On Monday, November 25th in two different ceremonies, Bishop Robert Brennan, auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of

Rockville Centre, confirmed 194 young men and women from the parish. I congratulate these young people who have been very faithful to their religious education training. They were called to do twenty hours of service to others. I find this a wonderful feature since it teaches them that following Christ leads to serving others. They seemed very excited about doing this service. I congratulate their parents and families, and Confirmation sponsors for efforts in preparing the students.



I am also very grateful to Deacon Jim Biggin, Pat Ryan, and Laura Leigh Agnese and all our religious education teachers, who generously guide our students in the religious formation programs. Another part of the preparation for the Confirmation is that they make a day's retreat here at St. Martin's. During the retreat they are asked to write a letter to the pastor explaining why they wish to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Here are some excerpts from their letters:

Why I want to be confirmed

I finally understand that Jesus loves me no matter what I do, and am ready to fully accept Him into my life. I now know Jesus died on the cross because He loves us more than Himself.

Also, going to the retreat helped me realize more about myself on the inside. I now know everyone is different and unique in their own way.

I speak to God when I am worried and frustrated and He listens and clears my mind.

I feel that I am ready to be confirmed because after reading about my saint name, I realized that being a true Catholic means being brave, honest, and courageous.

I feel ready to have a closer relationship with God. Jesus has helped me through my rough times and hopefully now I can be closer to Him so he can help me even more.

I like to pray because it makes me feel good to confess to God and get things off my chest that I have been thinking about for so long.

My teachers were also very nice too. They explained a lot about Heaven and the importance of life. Now I know about what goes on in Heaven.

I am excited to go to Church and be confirmed. Since this will be the biggest sacrament until marriage so I want to make it a special and meaningful event. Thank you for giving me this experience.

I have grown up in the Catholic Church and plan on continuing practicing my faith my whole life. That is why I feel ready to become confirmed.

I feel much closer to God and feel stronger and passionate about life and how to treat people. I learned a lot. I have also given God the key to my heart when we were meditating.

Getting ready to make confirmation taught me that helping others is very important and that community service is good.

I have also learned that Jesus forgives us no matter what we do. He also never gets mad at us.

I have come a long way, and God has guided me. Although I am working on attending church more, I know God is always there not just for me but for everyone when they need it most.

If I strengthen my relationship with God, I will make better decisions which will make me a better person.


This community service taught me an important lesson. It taught me that helping others is just as important as helping myself. I also feel this way because I have become closer with God over the past years.
