James J. Miller, Sara Cantillo Charles F. McGovern When I was in the Holy Land this past summer, in the name of the parish I purchased a statue of the infant Jesus in a carved-out manger. I bought the statue in the town of Bethlehem and it is hand carved from the olive wood of the area. Rather than only put it out for the Christmas season, in consultation with the Liturgy Committee, I have decided to place the infant permanently in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel.

My main reason is that the Incarnation of Jesus is one of the central realities of our Catholic faith. In the Gospel of John we read, *The Word became flesh and dwelt among us.* Looking at a cross moves our hearts to see how much God loved us by giving up his life for us. It moves and inspires us to be his disciples. I believe the infant Jesus also is a powerful symbol to touch our hearts concerning the love of God.

St. Alphonsus Liguori, the founder of the Redemptorist Congregation that serves here at St. Martin's, had four great pillars of spirituality: the crib, the cross, the Blessed Mother, and the Holy Eucharist. The permanent presence of the infant Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, along with statue of the Blessed Mother, the processional cross, and the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle, now surround us with these four great cornerstones of Catholic spirituality.

I thank the men of the Nazareth Carpenter Shop, George Hoban and Bob Albertson, for making the table and arch that accompany the infant Jesus in the manger.

Paving the Way for Christ Update on the Capital Campaign

Here is the latest update on the capital campaign. To date we have pledges of \$1,728,423.34 and we have received \$510,115,84. Several people have been pledging over the past weeks and we are grateful to all who are able to support the campaign financially was well as by prayer. We will soon place a new list of the donors in the bulletin. I know some people have approached me about when they will be notified about their pledges and the money due to the campaign. This depends on what plan of pledge you signed up for. If you pledged to make a donation monthly, you should have received your statement. If you pledged to donate quarterly, you will receive your first statement in March. If you pledged to donate semi-annually, you will receive your first statement in June.

The building committee has recommended to me that the roof of the school be our first major repair. We are presently seeking bids from several recommended roofing firms. We are also seeking bids about the renovation of the Parish Outreach Center, as well as the bathroom in the parish hall. We are also in the process of choosing an engineering firm who will give us the cost of what the brick work on the school will cost.
