Pastor's Getter

have found January a difficult month. I suppose it goes back to my seminary days when, after the great fun and joy of the Christmas vacation, we were plunged into a challenging period of exams. Additionally, our seminaries at the time were in very cold and snowy places. Sports brought little consolation since the Jets were rarely in the playoffs and the Mets were still more than two months away. I still get the January blues since I put my heart and soul into Christmas both as a parish and personally. There is a kind of natural let down as the decorations come down and Christmas carols are not sung for another year. I am sure some of you may be looking at the charge cards that were maxed during the season, and the waistlines that may have expanded a bit!

In last week's Gospel, we really fast forward to the beginning of the public ministry of Jesus. The time between the birth of Jesus and the beginning of his public life are called the "hidden years" of Jesus. The only story we have about his childhood other than those of the nativity is the account of the finding in the temple.

John the Baptist is preaching a conversion, calling people to a change of heart to get back to following the way of the Lord. I am sure you have seen movies where a preacher gives a dramatic sermon and it is followed by people being washed in the waters of baptism in a nearby river or lake. The baptism that John is doing is not our sacrament of baptism. It is a ritual where people symbolically go into the waters of the Jordan to show they are beginning their lives anew and turning toward God.

I had the great opportunity to visit the River Jordan and the site of Jesus' baptism a couple of years ago. What I remember from that day was the joy of so many people as they splashed about in the waters, singing hymns, wearing white gowns, and professing their love for God. They were from all over the world and of every race and nationality. They were like children dancing in the waters of Coney Island on a hot summer day. They loved the Lord and wanted to give their hearts to him.

As Catholics, we face a significant challenge with our Sacrament of Baptism. Most of us are baptized as babies and have no memory of the day. I have been told that on my baptism day, the furniture was cleared in our living room and a great party and dance ensued with a lively Irish fiddle player. I learned as a child in catechism that baptism was to take away original sin and make me a child of God and an heir of heaven.

Although I haven't the slightest doubt about the reality of original sin as we read about so much evil in our world and the power of sin in our own personal lives, our focus today in the Church is less on original sin and more on becoming a follower of Jesus. We still baptize a baby in danger of death, but our Church now teaches that an unbaptized baby will not be kept out of heaven.

hen I celebrate baptisms here in the parish, I stress to the parents that their beautiful baby has been loved by Almighty God from the moment he or she was conceived. That baby has always been a child of God. The celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism marks that this baby will be raised in the love of God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. This baby, besides having his or her natural family, now has an extended family of more than 1 billion Catholic cousins. As we celebrate the baptism of an infant, the parents and godparents stand up and say that they "...will do all that we can to make sure that this child grows up knowing the love of God, seeking to follow the Lord's path." At baptism the babies usually wear a lovely white gown. This is a sign that they are putting on Christ Jesus. The babies are anointed with the oil of holy Chrism which is the most sacred oil of the Catholic Church. This oil will be later used for their Confirmation. Kings, priests and prophets were anointed with oil in the Old Testament. We anoint our children as kings, prophets and priests.

What happens next? Have we passed on the faith to our child by simply having him or her baptized? Certainly not. Baptism is the beginning of his or her life as a Christian. It is now for the parents and the rest of the family to bring their child home and teach, far more by example than by words, how to be a follower of Jesus. If the baby grows up in a family that lives their faith, he or she will likely sink his or her own roots in the Catholic faith.

I was thinking that being a baptized Catholic in the United States today is not much of a challenge. Six of the Supreme Court justices are baptized Catholics as is the Vice-President of the our country. Yet, there are many places today in the world, where one can be killed if he or she does not renounce their Catholic faith in the name of Allah. Every time we make the sign of the cross we make a commitment to be followers of Jesus in our daily lives. We are called to put on the Lord Jesus Christ in our lives.


