The Pastor's Letter

Recently, as many of you know, Father Henry received word that he has been transferred to the Provincial House in Brooklyn to work as the Province Secretary and the Assistant Financial Treasurer of our Province. Both of these positions are very important to the life and mission of our order. The Province Secretary keeps and records the official documents of the Province, handles a great deal of internal communication among the confreres, and keeps important materials updated for all of us. The Assistant Financial Officer has a very serious responsibility, along with the Treasurer to manage our funds, provide for our health care, care of all our properties and cars, all our insurances, and all matters of finances. The Provincial and his Council saw Father Henry had these skills and abilities to deal with these responsibilities and gave him this new assignment. I am sure all the confreres in our Province are grateful Father Henry has accepted these serious ministries.

The Redemptorists' gain is our parish's loss. Father Henry Sattler served at St. Martin's for ten years. During that time, the people of the parish came to love him for his pastoral care, his preaching, his dedication to the young, his visits to the sick, his ministry in the RCIA, his work with the St. Vincent de Paul Society, his leadership ability in the pro-life ministry, and his care of the practical problems that affected our buildings and properties. He is a good and zealous priest who always had time for anyone in need. I know he will be missed by the staff, the parishioners and our Redemptorist community.

I know that Father Henry was a great assistant to Father John Tizio since it was his first time serving as pastor and Father John was most grateful for his help and guidance. Father Henry also was very helpful in my transition to parish life. I was Provincial when Father Thomas Schmidt was dying of cancer. Father Henry was very supportive of Father Tom and his family. He was such a blessing to Father Tom as he helped him enter into eternal life.

Father Henry and I talked about a farewell Mass and reception. We will probably have it in September since Father Henry only officially leaves here in early August and I would not want the parishioners on vacation to miss the Mass. Father will be stationed in Brooklyn which is only about an hour (if there is a miracle of no traffic on the Belt and Southern State) so it will be easy for him to return for the celebration. We have not set a date as of yet.

After parishioners got over the surprise of hearing Father Henry's transfer from our parish, they immediately asked me who is taking his place. The answer is that there will be no one coming to replace Father Henry. This is a bit of a disappointment but not to be taken as any sign the Redemptorists don't care about the parish of St. Martin's. There have been many years when there were only three priests here at St. Martin's. When I first came here four years ago, there was only three of us until Father Ciya arrived a year or so later. There have been times when there were three priests and a seminarian or Redemptorist deacon. I think most parishioners know it was a great blessing to have four priests and not something that could always be our reality. Many of the parishes around us have two or three priests and are pretty similar in the number of parishioners.

I am confident Fathers Jim, Ciya and I, along with our zealous deacons, our dedicated pastoral staff, and the great commitment of so many parishioners who are part of the parish ministries that we can continue to maintain and even increase the level of pastoral service and care in our parish. The transfer of one of our priests is a loss for us because we love Father Henry, but it is also an opportunity of grace for all of us to consider what each of us can do to be part of the life and ministry of our parish. Granted, only priests can say Mass and hear confessions, but there are so many wonderful ministries presently active that are touching the lives of countless parishioners. Many of these ministries are led and served by the lay members of our parish. I am also confident that we will be able to have Redemptorist priests come to our parish on the weekends to take Sunday Masses. I think you will enjoy hearing different preachers.

So, we say thank you to God for the ten years of life and ministry Father Henry Sattler so generously shared with the parishioners, staff and Redemptorist community here at St. Martin's. We promise him our prayers and love as he goes forth to serve in other ministries of the Church and the Redemptorists. We look forward to seeing him in the future. May Mary of Our Lady of Perpetual Help lead Father Henry as he follows Jesus the Redeemer.

Special Parents for Special Needs Children

Children are one of the greatest blessings and gifts in life and also require a tremendous amount of work. Children bring about the greatest joy and also the greatest challenges in life. As our Hempstead staff member Patty stated, if your great gift comes in a package with special needs, then the path can be at times even more challenging, yet also more rewarding all at the same time. Parenting requires a delicate balance of patience, support, love and discipline, no matter who the child is. Having faith with reasonable expectations helps us stay balanced.

In speaking with a number of different parents that have special needs children, I have found that so many people underestimate the true ability of children with special needs. This is not limited to just the parents, it is true of anyone involved with the care of the special needs children, including their teachers, caregivers and medical professionals.

Each child is a unique individual. It is very important that they are not grouped into a specific category based on their respective diagnosis and on medical statistics, nor be given up on because of some standard limits or expectancy rates. Every special needs child holds within themselves unlimited power. It is so important to allow them to display their individuality, and let them experience their own unlimited power that they possess as an individual. Encouragement from their parents is very important for every child's success and well being. Letting them reach for the stars, never giving up, gives them hope, which is the major foundation for success.

I believe that deep down inside the soul of every special needs child there is a hero just bursting to come out. As parents we can encourage our children to become that hero, to face life joyfully and courageously in the face of suffering or adversity. By doing this, we also become heroes - both to our children and to others around us.

Parents of special needs children experience a warmth of gratefulness in appreciating every moment with their child, sharing a monumental love powered by the knowledge that life is fragile and that their time together is measured in breaths. They are given an opportunity to see life in a dark light, a constant balance of pain and peace, hope and devastation, sorrow, and joy. And maybe that is the purpose of life—to find the balance, to accept the reality, but live in the hope. We should count our blessings having these special children in our lives and the joy they bring to life.

Talbot House Chemical Dependence Crisis Center

Talbot House is a 24-hour voluntary chemical dependence crisis center licensed by the New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services (OASAS) to provide short-term medically monitored inpatient withdrawal services to adult men and women who are in crisis. This facility provides nourishing meals, counseling, limited transportation, support groups, and referrals.

Outpatient Clinics

Outpatient clinics help people in recovery maintain sobriety and live independently and productively. Services include individual and group counseling; groups for early sobriety; DWI/mandated and after-care; educational programs; crisis intervention; psychiatric services; medical evaluations; and referrals. The program also serves spouses, adolescents, significant others, co-dependents, and adult children of alcoholics (ACOAs). Our clinics provide counseling services in Spanish.

Eligibility and Fees

Programs serve people 18 years of age and older. Sliding scale fees, Medicaid, Medicare, and other third-party insurance accepted.
