The Pastor's Letter

As I sit at my office desk this Monday morning, I am looking out at our parish church parking lot being torn



up by a steam shovel. I think we will all be delighted when the paving of our parking lots are completed. I remember when we were planning the *Paving the Way for Christ* campaign almost two and half years ago, we listed the projects that we had to address for the care of our property. In my own mind there were three major tasks: The brickwork on the school, the roof of the school, and the paving of the parking lots. These projects had to be done for many practical reasons, and you, the parishioners recognized that and responded very generously.

In addition to those essential projects, we did decide to seek to

establish a meeting room in the backroom of St. Alphonsus Hall, address the possibility of creating a gym in the school auditorium, and upgrade the Parish Outreach Center. We certainly do need meeting space here at St. Martin's since there is so much life and activity that we find it a challenge to find such space for all our meetings and gatherings. It is also a great hope that we can somehow manage to make a suitable sports area in the auditorium. We want so much to reach out to younger families of the parish.

However, I am very proud that our parish chose, as part of the *Paving the Way for Christ* campaign, to renovate the building often referred to as *208*. This building houses our parish outreach center, the food pantry, has meeting space for the St. Vincent de Paul Society, and some guest rooms for the Redemptorists and their families who visit from time to time. The focus of the renovations was on the Parish Outreach/Food Pantry area on the first floor. We did not feel the need to address the second floor rooms and meeting space.

The main goals of what was done were to address all safety concerns for those who both work in the building as well as those who come for assistance, to make the work space more flexible so as to better serve the visitors to the pantry, and to make the entire area welcoming to all who either assist there or who come as clients. I believe that has been done thanks to the dedicated work of Mr. Steve Descovich and his two sons, Willy and Andrew. All three did a great deal of the work themselves, using their time and talent and treasure so generously for the parishioners.

I see an essential link between our Church and the food pantry. In our beautiful church, we are fed with the Word of God and the Body of Christ. At the Parish Outreach Center, those of our community who are in need of assistance are met by Rosemary Scarangella and her wonderful staff with great kindness. They serve there in our name. It is your donations, both in the red wagon and in the parish offertory, which enables us to touch the Body of Christ in those who come for help. The words of Jesus are so very clear: *Whatever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters, you do to me. I was hungry and you fed me, thirsty and you gave me a drink.* The reason I have asked that a symbolic basket with some food items be carried up at the offertory of the Mass, along with the bread and wine, is that serving others in need is a true sign that we are seeking to live the Eucharist. Jesus is in the Holy Eucharist: Jesus is in our brothers and sisters, especially those who are in need.

The parish outreach center is a vivid reminder to all of us that we cannot love God and not pay attention to those who seek help from us. The Mass ends with the words, *Go, the Mass is ended*. That is a call for you and me to go and live what we have done and received at the Eucharist. The parish outreach center is not a mere appendage of our parish, but is at the heart of the Gospel.

I would be remiss if I did not comment on the equally great work of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Many of those who volunteer in the pantry are also members of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. I have found the members of both groups to be men and women who seek to love God and to serve those in need. Although the St. Vincent de Paul Society is a worldwide organization, and not under the direction of our parish, the vast majority of its members are parishioners and our parish does help fund their important ministry.

After some consultation with the staff of the Parish Outreach Center, I have decided to name the improved building the *Mother Teresa Parish Outreach Center*. A sign designed by one of our parishioners, Jeanne Martin, is on the front lawn of the property. Most of us through television and the media came to know Mother Teresa as a saint. The Catholic Church has also recognized her great holiness and declared her *Blessed*, the last step before one is officially made a saint. Her love for the poor and dying was hands on. There are countless images of Mother Teresa holding a dying child or elderly person in her arms. The Missionary Sisters of Charity, founded by her, continue her great mission all over the world. There are those who have the gift of trying to solve the great causes of poverty and hunger. Mother Teresa had a different vocation: she saw her mission to help one person at a time with the loving touch of Jesus Christ.

It brings joy to my heart that the mission of the Mother Teresa Parish Outreach Center at St. Martin's is so alive in our parish. Week after week, I see people carrying bags of food into the gathering space of our Church. Whenever I drop in on the staff at the Center, it seems to me they have a sense of joy as they work to shelve canned goods and stack food. May Mother Teresa continue to bless all of our parishioners with compassionate and loving hearts.




