The Pastor's Letter

Since I write the letter for the bulletin several days before the upcoming Sunday, by the time you read this article, your pastor will either be a very happy man or a most dejected fellow, depending on the outcome of the playoff series the Mets are playing. Have no fear since I am used to a lifetime of suffering as a Jet fan.

I like the month of October. Most often the weather is crisp and you can get by wearing a light jacket. The gorgeous colors of the changing leaves shows us the great handiwork our Divine Creator. Halloween candy fills the stores and children, both young and old, are all dreaming of what they will wear for Halloween. I'm letting my hair grow a bit longer and buying some blond hair coloring since I plan on being Donald Trump for the great Pumpkin Feast. If any parishioner wishes to dress as Hillary Clinton, we can hold a debate, charge admissions, and fund the parish for several years.

There is a certain rhythm to our parish during October. Our religious education program begins and it is a delight to have our children filling the school for the five sessions held each week. The Baby Bottle campaign also starts during this month, and our parish is so very generous in support of helping provide for families and newborn children by our donations. Once again, we are selling tickets to our Golden Harvest which is both an important fundraiser for our parish as well as a very enjoyable social night. Your support of the Golden Harvest is very important for the finances of our parish since what we collect is often the difference as to whether the final numbers on our fiscal year report are red or black. Over the last several years, there has been some decline in our ticket sales. I ask you, if you cannot afford a ticket, to consider sharing a ticket with some other people.

This Sunday we will bless our newly paved parking lot. As I walk on the new pavement, I think of the planning, the discussions, the many meetings, the sermons calling for donations. I feel a great sense of gratitude to the Lord for the generous support of so many parishioners in Paving the Way for Christ. We will have a party, as I pray for good weather, celebrating what we have accomplished and moving us forward on a paved path that symbolically suggest we have made the road to our Lord a bit more inviting.

Also this month, after a significant period of planning, the parish is going to be reflecting on how best to invite our parishioners into the various ministries of St. Martin's. We are moving to completion of our capital campaign which we called Paving the Way for Christ. You did a marvelous job raising the money to complete the necessary projects (with a few more still to be done). Now we want to begin another campaign called <u>Walking the Way with Christ</u>. I am convinced we are all trying to do that already, but this will be a systematic approach inviting everyone to consider taking on a personal commitment in our parish.

We are completing a book of parish ministries that will soon be available to all. When you see it, I am sure you will be, as I was, impressed with all that is happening at St. Martin's. I must confess there were ministries I did not know about as your pastor. The parishioners here are not only generous with their treasure but also with their time and talents. I fully realize not everyone is ready to make a full commitment to parish ministries that might call for a good bit of your time. Her prayer, which we have on a plaque in our church, is a remarkable description of what it means to be a disciples of Jesus. I invite you to slowly read this prayer and pray over it. Have a Blessed October and save some candy corn for me!
