## Pastor's Letter

The older I get, I become more joyful that God has called me to be a priest. I suppose this might be akin to those of you who have been married many years. After the initial honeymoon, be it marriage, religious life or the priesthood, one settles into periods of ordinary time, with many joyful moments mixed in with times of great struggle, and even a wonderment if the vocation will survive. I have heard priests and married couples stand up at their fiftieth jubilee and announce they never had an unhappy day in their fifty years of their vocation. I must confess such words leave me a bit skeptical. But now with almost 41 years of priestly ministry, I have a sense of contentment and joy in my heart.

One of my favorite moments as a priest is celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation. There are certain times, when a person has been away from the Church for a long time, or is carrying the heavy weight of a serious sin. Speaking to them about the mercy of God and granting them forgiveness in the name of Jesus Christ and through the power of the Holy Spirit is a most humbling and exhilarating moment. I leave the confessional thanking God that I am a priest and can share in his graceful mercy. Very often such confessions begin with silence, and sometimes there are tears. The penitent is encouraged to take his or her time. Finally they speak and a great sign of relief can be heard through the confessional screen. God is so good and merciful.

I do carry a very painful moment about the sacrament of reconciliation from many years ago. I was a few years into my priesthood, filling in at a city hospital. I stopped by to visit a women in intensive care and asked her if she would like to receive the sacraments. She was an older woman and I saw a tear roll down her cheek. In a hesitant manner she told me her story: when she was a young woman fifty years ago, she found herself in a marriage that had not been blessed by the church for whatever reason. The priest told her she was a pig and that she could not receive absolution. For fifty years that women was deprived of the Eucharist and the rest of the sacraments! Her spouse was long dead. Finally she was able to celebrate reconciliation and the anointing of the sick. I never saw her again but I have never forgotten that heart-breaking moment. I wondered about the priest and prayed for him. Was he so caught up in the laws of the Church that all compassion and mercy was forgotten? I wondered if he was at fault or the Church that formed him. I have many sins and faults but I have tried very hard, as I think is true for almost all priests, to be men of mercy in the confessional.



Saint Maria Faustina

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. The devotion was actively promoted by Pope John Paul II. On April 30, 2000, the canonization of Faustina Kowalska took place and the Sunday after Easter was officially designated as the Sunday of the Divine Mercy. I know that many of you are familiar with the beautiful prayer of Divine Mercy. I remember a dear cousin of mine, who was dying in his early forties, had a video of this prayer playing in his last days to bring him comfort. At St. Martin's, parishioners say this prayer on Fridays at 2:00 p.m. Sister Faustina, a Polish nun living in Krakow in the 1930's had mystical experiences of Jesus, and he asked her to have a painting done of what has become known as

the Divine Mercy Picture. It features glowing rays of red and white flowing from the heart of Jesus, which recall the lance that was thrust into his side in which blood and water immediately poured out on Good Friday. At the bottom of the image are the words, *Jesus I trust in you*. We trust in Jesus and his mercy because we are washed in the waters of baptism and saved by the blood of the Lamb.

The Gospel on this feast is the appearance of the Risen Jesus on the first Easter. These are men who were afraid of being hunted down and killed as was Jesus, and they are filled with shame for having abandoned him. What words will Jesus speak to these frightened guilt-ridden men? Jesus said to them again, *Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.* And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain, they are retained." The first word spoken by Jesus to the apostles is *Peace - peace be with you!* The Risen Christ then gives his Church and all generations to come the Gift of the Sacrament of Peace - the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Mercy.

People often say, I just tell my sins to God. I do not need confession. We can and should ask forgiveness from God in our prayer. Still, confession is both a human and divine experience, hearing in a direct way, your sins are forgiven; go in peace. We know we are loved by our spouse but it is important to **hear** the words from time to time: I love you. So too, It is important for us to hear, you are forgiven.

A final thought: some worry that we are not talking enough about sin and the reality of hell. They are certainly both serious teachings of the church and very real. Some wonder if we are getting too soft on sin. It is a challenging thought. Still, in the year of mercy, on the Day of Divine Mercy, in the words of Jesus in the Gospels that constantly speak about mercy and forgiveness, I would prefer to fail on the side of speaking too much on the mercy of God than on his condemnation. I invite you to join me in a decade of the divine mercy prayer.

Say on the "Our Father" beads: Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

Say on each "Hail Mary" beads: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world. (Say three times).

**LONG ISLAND CATHOLIC:** CATHOLICS URGED TO SIGN PETITION CALLING FOR U.S. DECLARATION OF GENOCIDE IN MIDDLE EAST. "THE VERY FUTURE OF THE ANCIENT CHRISTIAN PRESENCE IN THE MIDDLE EAST IS AT STAKE."

Washington, CNS. The archbishop who serves as president of the U.S. CONFERENCE OF CATHOLIC BISH-OPS has asked U.S. CATHOLICS TO SIGN A PLEDGE calling for an end to the slaughter of Christians and members of other religious minority groups in the Middle East. "Today, the people of God must speak up to our brothers and sisters facing genocide in the Middle East," read a statement from Archbishop Joseph E. Kurtz of Louisville Kentucky, USCCB president. "As a people of faith, we must convince the U.S. DEPARTMENT OF STATE to include CHRISTIANS in any formal DECLARATION OF GENOCIDE." On March 14, the HOUSE in a bipartisan 393 - 0 VOTE approved a nonbinding resolution that condemns as genocide the atrocities being carried out by Islamic State Militants against Christians and other religious and ethnic minorities in the areas it occupies in Iraq and Syria. Archbishop Kurtz urged Catholics to SIGN A PETITION at www.stopthechristiangenocide.org. that has been on line since late February. The effort is sponsored by the Knights of Columbus and in Defense of Christians.

**BISHOP MURPHY on Brussels Attack:** "We pray and will never cease praying for peace. At the same time legitimate governments have the solemn duty to provide their citizens with safety and protection from their enemies within and without."

CNS: U.S. Secretary of State John Kerry said that atrocities carried out by the Islamic State Group against Yezidis, Christians and other minorities were GENOCIDE, the first U.S. DECLARATION OF GENOCIDE since Sudanese actions in Darfur in 2004. A 66 member coalition is "working intensively to stop the spread of Daesh," Kerry said, using the Arabic acronym for Islamic State. He said the world must "marginalize and defeat violent extremists, once and for all," so as not to be replaced by another extremist group with a different acronym.


