Pastor's Getter

Several weeks ago, I noticed that I was losing weight. That is usually a good thing, but I wasn't trying so I had some mild concerns. At the same time I was very thirsty and drinking lots water like a camel at an oasis. When I was traveling on vacation, I found myself stopping at every rest step in the Eastern United States. I knew that something was off and I feared it might be type 2 diabetes. This proved to be true when I went to the doctor last week. Even though I had been thinking that was the cause of my symptoms, it was a shock to be presented with this diagnosis. My most recent blood test had shown no signs of this, nor had any other blood tests I had taken through the years, nor do we have any family history of this disease. The doctor was quite surprised but I guess my lifetime weight issues, my age, and love of sweets had caught up with me.

The doctor was very supportive and assured me that he was very confident we could control the diabetes with diet (hard) exercise (even harder) and oral medication. So, I am beginning a serious change in how I eat, and I know I need to do more exercise. I tell you this news since I feel we are a parish family and I want you to know. I am adjusting well and this may eventually prove to be a kind of blessing if it makes me change bad patterns of eating that were not good for my heart and other organs.

I have been reading about what I can and cannot eat. Several times I have read that a diabetic can eat almost anything but with serious moderation and control. So if you see me drinking a light beer or eating a chocolate donut, do not tackle me to the ground. However, if you see me eating *two* donuts, then you are welcome to poke me and give me a good *Mother Superior* look! Actually in my lifetime, I must have lost over 400 lbs. dieting. I once lost a hundred pounds in less than a year. My problem, as is true for many people, is maintaining a steady weight. Losing weight, although never easy, is something I have done in the past. However, I have not mastered the life style changes needed to keep it off. That is now my goal. I know this is a serious issue, but I do believe humor is a great way to lighten a burden.

I am blessed to have a good doctor, supportive family and friends, a wonderful parish community along with the security of good health care. I know not everyone in our nation or the world has such blessings. I also know as pastor how so many of you carry far more serious medical and life challenges than do I, and I am humbled in seeing how much faith you have in the light of your struggles.

I have no symptoms and I feel good and full of energy. I look forward to serving you as pastor in the next three years with dedication and zeal. If you have a recipe for a sugar-free, low-carb, hot fudge sundae, you are most welcome to share it with me!

God bless, and keep me in your prayers as I do you.

# RACIAL TENSIONS SPARK DAY OF PRAYER, PEACE TASK FORCE WITH US BISHOPS

Washington D.C. CNA/EWTN News: After several shootings and increased racial tensions around the country, the head of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has called for a national day of prayer and appointed a task force devoted to peace and unity. "I have stressed the need to look toward additional ways of nurturing an open, honest and civil dialogue on issues of race relations, restorative justice, mental health, economic opportunity, and addressing the question of pervasive gun violence," said Archbishop Joseph Kurtz of Louisville, the USCCB president.

**THE DAY OF PRAYER AND SPECIAL TASK FORCE** will help us advance in that direction. By stepping forward to embrace the suffering, through unified, concrete action animated by the LOVE OF CHRIST, we hope to nurture peace and build bridges of communication and mutual aid in our own communities.

"To all people of good will, let us beg for the strength to resist the hatred that blinds us to our common humanity. To my brothers and sisters in Christ, let us gather at the Cross of Jesus. Our Savior suffered at the hands of humanity's worst impulses, but he did not lose hope in us or in his Heavenly Father. 'LOVE OVERCOMES EVIL,'" he said in his July 8th statement.

Alton Sterling, a 37 year old Black man, was shot July 5th after an encounter with police in Baton Rouge. The day after Sterling's death, an African American man in Falcon Heights, Minnesota, was shot by a police officer and later died. He had been pulled over for an alleged broken tail light. On July 7th, five Dallas police officers were killed in what authorities called a SNIPER AMBUSH at the end of a peaceful protest against police shootings of African Americans. In the following days, police officers were also shot and killed in racially related incidents in Baton Rouge and Kansas City, Kansas.

"WE ARE ONE BODY IN CHRIST, SO WE MUST WALK WITH OUR BROTHERS AND SISTERS AND RENEW OUR COMMITMENT TO PROMOTE HEALING. THE SUFFERING IS NOT SOWEWHERE ELSE, OR SOMEONE ELSE'S; IT IS OUR OWN, IN OUR VERY DIOCESES."

THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE DAY OF PRAYER AND THE CREATION OF THE TASK FORCE FOLLOWS SEVERAL PRAYER VIGILS AND PEACE EFFORTS IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH, AND COMES AT THE END OF A NOVENA FOR PEACE LAUNCHED BY THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS FOLLOWING THE SHOOTINGS.



# <u>Mike Piazza</u>

Mike Piazza, a former player for the New York Mets, was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame this past Sunday, July 24<sup>th</sup>. Piazza, like all of us I am sure, has his sins and faults. But as I listened on the radio to the speech that he gave as he entered the Hall of Fame, I thought: this is a man who is not afraid to witness to God's role in his life and his deep love of his Catholic faith.

Here are some excerpts from the newspapers:

Piazza's day began early when he attended 7:30 Mass at St. Mary's Our Lady of the Lake Catholic Church on Elm Street, a 10-minute walk from the Hall of Fame. As he left the brick church, he met with Father John Rosson, who beamed and said, "We have a celebrity in church this morning." Piazza asked for and received a special blessing from the priest. Piazza signed autographs and took pictures for about 15 minutes with the parishioners. In his speech Piazza credited his mother, Veronica, too.

"She gave me the gift of my Catholic faith, which has had a profound impact on my career and has given me patience, compassion and hope. Pope Benedict the XVI said, 'One who has hope, lives differently.' Mom, you raised five boys, and you were always there for me."

He got long applause when he talked about his healing home run on the first game after 9/11. Part of his plaque reads: "Helped rally a nation . . . with his dramatic home run in the first Mets game in New York following the 9/11 attacks."

"September 11, 2001 is a day that forever changed our lives," Piazza said in his speech. "To witness the darkest evil of the human heart and how it tore many loved ones from their families will forever be burned in my soul. But from tragedy and sorrow came bravery, love, compassion, character and, eventually, healing.

"Many of you give me praise for the two-run home run on the first game back on September 21 to push us ahead of the rival Braves. But the true praise belongs to police, firefighters, first responders, who knew they were going to die, but went forward anyway. Piazza, a Catholic, then added: "Jesus said there's no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends. I consider it a privilege to have witnessed that love. Your families and those left behind are always in my prayers. I pray we never forget their sacrifice and work to always defeat such evil."
