Pastor's Letter

Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come.

My first assignment as a Redemptorist priest was to teach English at what was our high school semi-



nary that has since closed. It was a boarding school with about seventy five young men who were considering becoming priests. Our seminary was located on the shores of Lake Erie and most of the students were from cities such as New York, Boston, Baltimore where our parishes were. So they were far from home and eagerly looked forward to the coming of Christmas when they would go home to their families for a Christmas break. At our daily Masses, we encouraged the students to call out their prayer intentions at the time of the prayer of the faithful. One freshman prayed a prayer that I have never forgotten, and I think of it every Advent. He prayed with great enthusiasm: *O God, we pray that*

Christmas may come sooner! We pray to the Lord. I had this image of God spinning the sun around earth like a top so that the days would pass faster. I loved the innocence of that prayer.

What is your prayer as Advent begins? Some may join with the young student and be eager for the coming of Christmas, perhaps with the return of a son or daughter home from college or the armed forces. Maybe a few are dreaming of a Christmas Eve engagement wedding proposal and have flutters in their hearts. No doubt, there are those of us who may pray that Christmas would come slower, rather than faster, and that we have enough time to do our decorating, our shopping, our card writing, and most of all our baking of sugar free cookies for the pastor! There are some who may be mourning the loss of a loved one and wish that Christmas would pass by very quickly and without notice so that the pain of missing a loved one at this special time may not be so intense. There will be those who will complain that Christmas is too commercial and that it has lost its meaning, and others who will be upset at how a secular culture may try to diminish the sacredness of the this holy time by banning the words *Merry Christmas* and the singing of any hymns in our schools. We all approach this time of Advent with many feelings.

Quite honestly, we would recognize that the season of Lent which begins with ashes has far more impact on most of our lives than does Advent. It is hard to focus spiritually on the Good News of Jesus Christ and his birth when we have so many things that go into our celebrating of this upcoming feast. If we are not careful we can arrive on Christmas Day, exhausted, stressed out, feeling unappreciated, worried about upcoming credit card bills, and feeling that we might have gained ten pounds. So how do we integrate the spiritual season of Advent with the hectic pace and glittering sounds of Christmas preparations?

I offer a little review of what is the Christian meaning of Advent. We are **not** preparing our hearts for the coming of the newborn baby Jesus. I am sure I will say that in some talk or sermon this month but it is not correct. Jesus did take flesh two thousand years ago. He came among us. He was born and lived among us for thirty-three years, was crucified and rose from the dead, sent forth the Holy Spirit, and returned to the Father. We will say these words in the creed.

dvent prepares us to celebrate the day that makes the most amazing moment in human history: the birth of Christ. Christians are the only religion in history that believe and celebrate that God chose to become a man and live among us. All the lights, all the wrapping paper, all the foods and presents are to celebrate and mark that extraordinary moment of human history. The Son of God has come among us.

Yet, Advent does bring us into a spirit of yearning. We think of the generations after generations of people who longed for the coming of the Messiah. Throughout the entire Old Testament, God is continually speaking to the people about a time when he will come. Today we heard some very beautiful words from the prophet Isaiah: They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again. This is a yearning of the human heart that cries out for a time when all weapons will turned into instruments for feeding one another. We all long for a time when there will be no more war ever again. We have been living through the longest American war in history in the Middle East. We daily live with the threat of terrorism. We can bring this desire for peace into our homes and families. Many have someone (perhaps more than one person in our family or among someone we once called a friend) with whom we are alienated and not at peace. We wish this was not the case and we do not feel good about it. The yearning we have for a better world and for peace in our own families comes from God. Advent is a time to listen to that yearning and take whatever simple steps we can take to make the world we live in touched by the presence of God.

Advent is also about waking up. Every couple of months I misread my Mass assignment and I find Sue our sacristan at the door of my room saying, Father wake up, you have the 6:30 a.m. Mass! Father, wake up! We heard the call to wake up in our reading from St. Paul to the Romans: You know the time; it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep. For our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. Jesus is present among us and we often miss him. Some of us may be sleep walking through life and miss the presence of God in whom we live and move and have our very existence. Jesus is here at this Mass, in the act of dying and rising with us. He will feed us with his body and blood. Scripture tells us that wherever there is love, there is God. Wherever we experience love from another person, be it our spouse, our child, our mother, or even a stranger, we are encountering the living God. Writing a Christmas card with some kind words to someone can be an act of love, as can a gift to someone that comes not from obligation but a desire to express what is in our hearts.

So Advent offers us many themes and I invite you today to focus on two of them: allow yourself to dream and yearn for a more loving world, country, society, family and parish and think about what steps you might take to advance the love of Jesus. Secondly, be awake. See how present God is to you. I love the lights and decorations of Christmas. We are invited not to miss the brightest light of all - **Jesus** who has come into our hearts and the hearts of others. Have a great Advent! Homily of November 27, 2016

Each day approximately 20 of our VETERANS COMMIT SUICIDE IN THE U.S. When you take into account that these are our country's heroes, men and women that put their lives on the line each and every day for our protection, we must do everything we can to get them the help they need. U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERAN'S AFFAIRS: V.A. CONDUCTS NATION'S LARGEST ANALYSIS OF VETERAN SUICIDE. July 7, 2016

The Department of Veterans Affairs (V.A.) has undertaken the most comprehensive analysis of VETERAN SUICIDE RATES IN THE U.S., examining over 55 MILLION VETERAN RECORDS from 1979 to 2014 from every state in the nation. The current analysis indicates that in 2014, an average of 20 VETERANS A DAY DIED FROM SUICIDE.

- 65% of all Veterans who died from suicide in 2014 were 50 years of age or older.
- Veterans accounted for 18% of all deaths from suicide among U.S. adults.
- Since 2001, the rate of suicide among U.S. veterans who use VA services increased by 8.8% while the rate of suicide among veterans who do not use VA services increased by 38.6%.
- Since 2001, U.S. adult civilian suicides increased 23% while veteran suicides increased 32% in the same time period. After controlling for age and gender, this makes the RISK OF SUICIDE 21% GREATER FOR VETERANS.
