Pastor's Letter



Pope Francis seeking forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation

A young woman went to confession and in the course of her confession, she mentioned to the priest that she worked for the circus. After hearing her confession and giving her absolution, he was curious and asked her what she did in the circus. She told the Father that she was an acrobat and offered to show him part of her routine. The priest and the young lady stepped out of the confessional and she proceeded to do five summersaults and three backward flips. Two elderly women who were on the line for confession turned to each other and said, *if that is the penance that Father O'Malley is giving today, we better get off of his line!*

Here is an oldie but goldie confession joke: a man goes to confession and says Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. I stole a house. In all the years of his hearing confessions this was a new one for the priest so he asked the man how he could steal a house? You see Father, said the penitent, I work for a lumber yard. So, one day, I would steal a bag of nails and no one would notice. Another day, I would take home two by fours. Each day I would take something home and in five years I had a lovely house. The priest said, this sin is serious and I must give you a strict penance. Do you know how to make a novena? The sinner responded, Father, if you got the plans, I got the wood.

Confession jokes are popular. At times Hollywood is fascinated with the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Alfred Hitchcock made an award-winning movie called *I Confess* that revolved around a sacramental confession. I have seen episodes of *Blue Bloods* and *Law and Order* which also told stories that were about the priest knowing of sins that he could not speak about. Even in a *Seinfeld* episode, Jewish Jerry finds himself speaking to a priest in a confessional.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation may provoke humor, but it is less popular today with Catholics. Many of us grew up going to confession once a week. Now, some go once a year, and many rarely celebrate the Sacrament at all. Today, the first Sunday after Easter, is called Divine Mercy Sunday. This is the first encounter with the apostles after His death and resurrection. The apostles are men filled with shame and guilt. After making bold proclamations of being ready to die for him, when Jesus was arrested, all but the apostle John fled. The first words that Jesus speaks are not filled with anger or hurt, rather he seeks to bring them healing and peace. He says, *Peace be with you.* When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, *Peace be with you.*

As the Father has sent me, so I send you. And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, Receive the Holy Spirit. <u>Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are</u> <u>retained</u>. With this declaration, Jesus gave the Church and each one of us a sacramental path to experience His divine forgiving mercy.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation, confession as most of us refer to it, is the sacrament of healing and peace. I will make a few simple points about this sacrament. Why are less people going to confession?

Has sin gone away? I think the honest answer is most of us find it hard to admit to another person our sins and faults. Still, countless people find peace and healing as they reveal themselves in twelve step groups and to therapists. As has long been said, confession is good for the soul. It is healthy to admit our sins.



I often hear: Can't I just tell my sins directly to God?

Yes, when we sin, we should tell God we are sorry. God is a God of mercy. Nonetheless, in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we experience in a very visible way when we hear the words: *your sins are forgiven*. A sacrament is a human encounter that reveals divine grace.

Some of us complain, *I just confess the same old things. What's the point?* It is humbling to admit we struggle with the same sins over and over, sometimes for a lifetime. St. Paul speaks about this: "I prayed the Lord to take it away from me, but He said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is perfected in weakness.' Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly in my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest on me."

People often say, *I am never sure what to confess.* Certainly, if we have committed a mortal sin, we should confess it as soon as possible. However, I think many confess a kind of usual list, impatience, anger, gossip, lack of prayer and so forth. That is fine. However, I often say to people that a key aspect of the sacrament of reconciliation happens before one enters the confessional. This is a time to take stock of my life over the past period since our last confession. Good questions to ask ourselves might be, how am I living my life as husband, mother, parent? How is my relationship with God? Am I at peace in my life? Do I see any patterns in my life that concern me?

How often should I go to confession? My stock answer is regularly. Regularly for some is every week, or every month, or several times a year. We do not have to wait for confessions on Saturday. We can ask for a priest at the rectory at any time (except during a Jet game!) The Sacrament of Reconciliation is not about guilt. It is a celebration - an experience of God's mercy.

Guilt is focusing on my sins: look how bad I am. Contrition is focusing on God's mercy. It is a gift to hear Jesus say to us, Peace be with you; your sins are forgiven!



DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

In his second encyclical, *Rich in Mercy*, St. Pope John Paul II offers an extended meditation on the mystery of God's mercy, which he calls "the greatest of the attributes and perfections of God" (Dives in Misericordia, 13). He returned to this theme throughout his pontificate: As a gift to humanity, which sometimes seems bewildered and overwhelmed by the power of evil, selfishness, and fear, the Risen Lord offers His love that pardons, reconciles, and reopens hearts to love. It is a love that converts hearts and gives peace. How much the world needs to understand and accept Divine Mercy!

Lord, who reveals the Father's love by Your death and Resurrection, we believe in You and confidently repeat to You today: Jesus, I trust in You, have mercy upon us and upon the whole world. ~St. Pope John Paul II, Regina Caeli message prepared for Divine Mercy Sunday, April 3, 2005

ORIGIN OF DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY, THE DIVINE MERCY IMAGE, THE CHAPLET, AND THE NOVENA



Saint Faustina: Mankind's need for the message of Divine Mercy took on dire urgency in the 20th Century, when civilization began to experience an "eclipse of the sense of God" and, therefore to lose the understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life. In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. Bl. John Paul explains: This was precisely the time when those ideologies of evil, Nazism and communism, were taking shape. Sister Faustina became the herald of the one message capable of off-setting the evil of those ideologies, that fact that God is mercy—the truth of the merciful Christ. And for this reason, when I was called to the See of Peter, I felt impelled to pass on those experiences of a fellow Pole that deserve a place in the treasury of the universal Church. ~St. Pope John Paul II, Memory and Identity (2005)

The Image: Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (Diary, no. 742).

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy: The Chaplet was also given to St. Faustina with this promise: "Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you" (Diary, no. 1541). "Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. ... Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire that the whole world know My infinite mercy" (Diary, no. 687).

Optional Opening Prayers: You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

(Repeat 3 times) O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in You!

Our Father, Hail Mary and the Apostle's Creed For each of the five decades (On each "Our Father" bead of the rosary, pray) Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world. (On each of the 10 "Hail Mary" beads, pray) For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Concluding prayer (Repeat 3 times) Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world. Optional Closing Prayer Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become respondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.

In an op-ed in the Wall Street Journal, Cardinal Timothy Dolan of the Archdiocese of New York lamented that the Democratic Party's shifting principles have effectively shut out and alienated orthodox Catholics. 
MOMMAS HOUSE
