Pastor's Letter

Fr. Pat's Homily of April 15, 2018

While they were still speaking about this, Jesus stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have."

I first met Pasquale Tremonte in 1976. At the age of 28, Pat had decided to become a Redemptorist priest and had entered the seminary. At that time, he was considered an older vocation. I was 25, newly ordained and finishing up my studies. A beautiful friendship began that ended in July of 2005 with Pat's death from a heart attack. Pat, as we called him, was one of the great characters of the Redemptorists, which is high praise since we have so many

characters in our Congregation, including myself. He was short, about 5 feet five, quite round (I know I am not one to speak), a passionate Italian, who, though born in New Jersey, spoke English (as one confrere said), as if it were his second language.

He made the mistake of telling me the story of his trip to the Holy Land with his niece Agnes before he entered the seminary. As is the practice there, you can get on a camel and do a short ride for about five dollars as the handler holds the reigns. It is hard to imagine Pat on top of a camel, and I always smile when I think of that image. He told me that when it came time for him to come down, his niece Agnes started arguing with the camel owner. She thought he was overcharging, and she would not pay. From the top of the camel, Pat yelled, *Agnes, pay the man or I will be up here forever!* I can still hear his voice!

That is one of a thousand *Pat* stories. We were often together and went out to eat many times. I felt a great sadness at his death. Pat had two complete wakes and funerals; one was in the parish in Delaware where he served and loved, and the other in Brooklyn where his family could attend. So, he had a homily at each wake, a homily at each Mass, including one by me. Each of them was a loving tribute, but they might have been closer to a roast than eulogy since they contained many funny stories.

Father Denis Sweeney also knew Pat. He and I often share stories and memories about him especially at meal times. I think Fathers Ciya and Jim must feel like they know him since we speak of him so regularly. In our Blessed Sacrament Chapel is a statue called Our Lady of the Mountain that his family had commissioned in Pat's honor. Our Lady of the Mountain, a great favorite of St. Alphonsus Liguori, shows the Blessed Mother holding Jesus and a Bible. It is *The Word* and *The Word Made Flesh*. Whenever I look upon it, Pat is very much alive to me. His last name, *Tremonte*, is an Italian word that means *between the mountains*. Pat's family are descendants from the Naples area.

I also have the fedora that Pat always wore, except when someone would steal it and put it on a statue. He was never without it. I asked for that hat when he died, and it is something I treasure. Even though Pat is now gone more than 13 years, he is very present to me in so many ways. I certainly could say the same about my parents, my sister Gerry and other special people in my life. I know he is alive with God. I am sure you have similar people in your lives.

As I read and reflected upon the Sunday Gospel for this Mass, I thought that a story of Pat might give us a sense of how the early Christians experienced Jesus after he had been raised from the dead. Even though Jesus died a horrible and a very real death, he is so very present and real to the first disciples. Sometimes he is so real that they can touch his wounds and eat fish that he cooks for them, and they know him especially in the breaking of the bread. Others times, his Easter appearances are somewhat mystical as the Gospels have him seeming to be a ghost who can come through unopened doors. There are times when those who knew Jesus best fail to recognize him when He comes to them, and when they finally do recognize him, he suddenly is gone from them.

It is clear that the resurrection of Jesus is not a resuscitation of a man thought to be dead like a patient who has clinically died and is brought back to life. Even though Lazarus was raised from the dead by Jesus, he will die in the future. Jesus is truly risen and will never die. There is a clear difference between the Jesus that the apostles knew before his death and the Risen Lord who comes to them now. Although the inspired words of the Gospels do capture the awe and wonder of the Risen Jesus, we do not have the words in any language that can truly describe the Divine Reality of the Risen Christ. So there are moments when Jesus appears and seems not to be recognized by his followers. They are slow to move from confusion, to questioning, to comprehension and then belief. They come to realize that "It is him! He is Risen!" And, often in the Gospel accounts, at the moment of recognition, he is gone just as he had been present.

Very often the Easter appearances occur at a meal. The Gospel is speaking to us how truly present the Lord is in the Mass and the reception of Holy Communion. Unlike Pat's fedora that reminds me of my friend, the Eucharist is not a symbol but the true Presence of Jesus Christ. We are believers in the Good News, but we are also like the first disciples who often do not see Christ in our very midst. Certainly, here at the table of the Eucharist, we are meeting the Risen Christ. But we also may feel a sudden touch in our spirit at an unexpected moment or during a time of prayer, when we sense and feel him in a way that is all but impossible to describe. We can almost touch his wounds. There are moments we catch a glimpse of the Risen Jesus in the love we feel for another or someone who comes to mind who has died, or we see him in the face of a suffering person. We even know his Presence in our deep longing for him.

I always thought that my friend Pat and I shared the same name, thinking Pasquale meant Patrick in Italian. Pat was happy to correct me, as he often did, saying Pasquale means Easter. May this Easter season bring many encounters for you with the Risen Jesus.
