## Pastor's Letter

I have a childhood memory of Pentecost Sunday. My mother was a very faithful Catholic, but she



pretty much left the teaching of the faith to the nuns and priests. However, after Mass on Pentecost Sunday, I remember going to our neighborhood bakery and my mother ordered what we called bullseyes for me. I am not sure that is the correct name; it was a large double-sided cookie-like delicacy covered with confectionery sugar and filled with raspberry seeded jelly. I recalled asking her why we were getting these desserts since we usually purchased rolls. She said, today is Pentecost, the birthday of the Catholic Church. I can't remember a thing about the Mass, but I

do remember the taste of the bullseye. I learned we must celebrate Pentecost well!

Pentecost certainly gets far less attention from most Catholics than does Christmas and Easter. It is true that without Christmas and Easter, Jesus Christ would not be known to any of us. But it is *Pentecost* that speaks to me of the promises of Jesus that he would not leave us orphans. This is the beginning of the Church. Jesus promised to send his Holy Spirit. This is the same Holy Spirit that hovered over creation and shaped the universe. *And the earth was without form and void, and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters*. The same Spirit who inspired the prophets to prepare the world for the coming Messiah, who came upon the Virgin Mary and brought life to her womb. The same Spirit who led Jesus into the desert and then was present as he experienced the baptism of John in the waters of the Jordan.

The word spirit comes from the Hebrew word *ruah*. Say the word *ruah* and you will know from whence the word comes. It is a word that brings forth breath. It takes deep breath to pronounce the word. The word *spirit* means breath. Breath is life. We are breathing all day and all night long and rarely notice it. But it is real. Certain things can be done medically to determine the levels and health of our breathing, but you and I cannot measure our breath. It is there, giving us life.

On Ascension Thursday, we mark the experience of the first disciples that Jesus (who was very present in a profound way after he was raised from the dead), has returned to the Father. Believers now experience Jesus in a very real way through the presence of the Holy Spirit, giving us life and the presence of God. Jesus tells the apostles to await the Holy Spirit in the upper room. (This is the same room where Jesus celebrated the Last Supper, called the Cenacle.) The apostles are very human men. When Jesus was arrested shortly before his crucifixion, all but the apostle John abandoned him. Peter denied him and the rest locked the doors and hid out. However, after the experience of Pentecost, described in terms of howling winds and tongues of fire, they rush out and speak to the people in languages that all understand. They then go all over the known world proclaiming the resurrection of Jesus. Something has changed these fearful men into bold proclaimers of the Gospel. They are quite willing to face cruel martyrdom. There is no other explanation than that they were touched by the power of God, a moment all but impossible to capture and describe in words. This is Pentecost and the power of the Holy Spirit.

It is clear that the Holy Spirit is best described by experiences rather than weighty intellectual words. I am convinced all of us have many experiences of the Holy Spirit throughout the day but may not be attentive to them. The Scriptures tell us that *wherever there is love, there is God.* So whenever there is goodness, love, kindness, compassion, mercy, we are experiencing the power of the Holy Spirit.

- Have you ever chosen to let go of a deep anger and resentment toward another person, be it over the course of days, months or years? *That is the power of the Holy Spirit*.
- Have you ever gone out of your way to help a stranger or needy person and surprised yourself by your compassion? That is the power of the Holy Spirit.
- Have you ever said something to someone that was very helpful and supportive and wondered where the words came from?
- Have you been surprised by something as ordinary as a song, a smile, flower?
- Have you resisted passing on a piece of juicy gossip?
- Have you let go of your plans for the weekend and decided to help a family member who called upon you?
- Have you resisted joining in a conversation of negativity about another race or religion?
- Have you felt and been comforted by the presence of your deceased loved ones?

I would call all of these moments as our response to the Holy Spirt. As we read in the Acts of the Apostles: "For in him we live, and move, and have our being; as certain also of your own poets have said, 'For we are also his offspring.'"

At this Holy Eucharist, we call down the power of the Holy Spirit on ordinary bread and wine, and through the Spirit, the Living God is present on our altars and in each of us in a most special way as we receive his body and blood.

Unless the eye catch fire,
The God will not be seen.
Unless the ear catch fire,
The God will not be heard.
Unless the tongue catch fire,
The God will not be named.
Unless the heart catch fire,
The God will not be loved.
Unless the mind catch fire,
The God will not be known.




