



ears ago, Father John McGowan and I were giving a parish mission in the small country village where my parents came from in Ireland. One night as we were preparing for the evening service, one of altar servers, a young boy named Joseph, asked us with great sincerity, will there be smoke tonight? Of course, he was referring to the use of incense.



The use of incense is a powerful symbol in the Church. We know incense was used to bless places and mighty kings. Incense was one of the royal gifts brought to Bethlehem by the Wise Men to give glory and praise to the King of kings. As a symbol, it touches our senses of smell and of sight, with the smoke rising to God. At funerals it can be a very emotional moment as the priest or deacon incense the body of the deceased. This is often a moment that brings tears to the grieving family. We incense the body as a sign of profound respect for the loved one's remains, which had been the temple of the Holy Spirit, and the body that God had breathed a living soul into at conception.

In our liturgies we have the option to use incense, and we often do on special occasions. Liturgy is not only a profound act of worship of God, but it is always teaching us about the core beliefs of our faith. At Mass the priest has the option of incensing the altar, the Book of the Gospels, the priest himself, the congregation, and whenever we place the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance for adoration. As we incense Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, it is a sign of belief in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

We incense the altar because at Mass this is the sacred place where Jesus becomes truly present in the consecrated bread and wine. The altar brings to mind the sacred table of the Last Supper and the altar of the cross of Calvary on which Christ died for us. It is our holy of holies. We incense the Bible, especially *The Gospels*, because they are the living Word of God. Just as the Lord God is truly present in the Eucharist, so too He is our God present in the Sacred Scriptures. In the Gospel of John, Jesus is entitled *The Word* that has become flesh.

When incense is used at Mass, the deacon or server incenses the priest. It took me awhile to get used to that since I felt embarrassed. I know well my sins and faults. But it is not Pat Woods being incensed but the priesthood of Jesus Christ is being recognized. Finally, the people are also incensed during the liturgy. This symbolizes that you are the Body of Christ. You are the Body of Christ on earth. We have a saying: you are what you eat. You have consumed the Eucharist, Jesus Christ, and you are what you eat: The Body of Christ.

In the back of our Church, we have the beautiful words of the prayer of St. Theresa of Avila: "Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks with compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are His Body. Christ has no body now on earth but yours. Today, on the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ, the parishioners and clergy give praise and adoration to Jesus Christ, the Body and Blood upon the altar.






