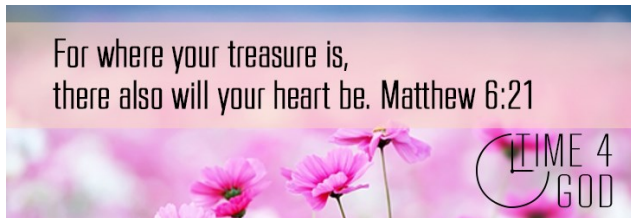
Pastor's Letter

(This week Ann Hughes is the writer while Father Pat is on vacation.)

It is always such a pleasure to be asked to write something and fill in while Father Pat is away. Foremost on our minds lately has been the transition that St. Martin of Tours is preparing for next year. It has always been a possibility but hearing the words proved difficult indeed. Anger seeped in with me, but I found that it only interfered with clear thought and moving ahead. Actually, what snapped me out of sadness and negative thoughts came from a homily by Father Denis. He spoke of "treasures of the heart." The heart feels and sees what the eye and mind often do not.

The heart is a magnificent creation of God. What an organ! What a machine! It does its job and inspires entire systems to do their jobs. It has been said that, "Your mind cannot possibly understand God. Your heart already does." (Emmanuel) It beats a steady beat and today, even when it doesn't, it can respond to science and medicine. 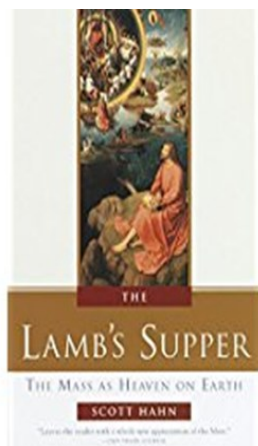
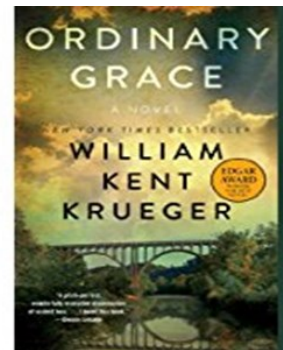

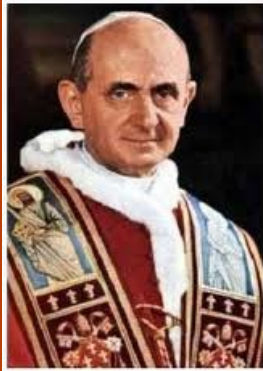

New Pastoral Letter Commemorates Fiftieth Anniversary of *Humanae Vitae*

Fifty years ago, on July 25, 1968, Pope Paul VI issued an Encyclical Letter entitled *Humanae Vitae*, "On Human Life." On October 14, 2018, Pope Francis will canonize his predecessor as Pope Saint Paul VI.



In this anniversary year, Bishop John O. Barres of the Diocese of Rockville Centre has issued a Pastoral Letter entitled *The Supreme Gift: The Gift of Life*, commemorating the encyclical of this soon-to-be-canonized saint. This teaching of the late Holy Father is in many ways more important today than at any time before.

In his letter, Bishop Barres wants to teach the people of the diocese the important truths of *Humanae Vitae*, because these truths very much need to be reexamined today in light of the problems we face in our time.

Please take a copy of *The Supreme Gift* home, read it, and discuss it as married couples and as families. Bishop Barres says: "Understanding the teaching of *Humanae Vitae*, believing it, and living it, is one of the first and most important answers to the crisis of our time. I truly believe that the future Pope Saint Paul VI wrote the letter more for our times than even for his own. Today, it can become the first step in repairing the injury between men and women, husbands and wives, parents and children, the family and society."

At the Mass of Beatification of Pope Paul VI in 2014, Pope Francis said of his predecessor:

"When we look to this great Pope, this courageous Christian, this tireless apostle, we cannot but say in the sight of God a word as simple as it is heartfelt and important: thanks! Thank you, our dear and beloved Pope Paul VI! Thank you for your humble and prophetic witness of love for Christ and his Church! ... In [his] humility the grandeur of Blessed Paul VI shines forth: before the advent of a secularized and hostile society, he could hold fast, with farsightedness and wisdom – and at times alone – to the helm of the barque of Peter, while never losing his joy and his trust in the Lord."

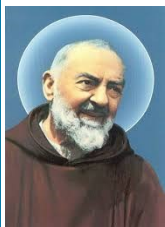

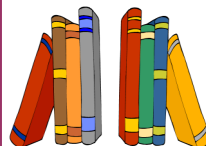

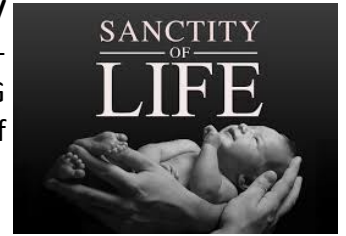

RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY

POPE FRANCIS ASKS CATHOLICS TO PRAY FOR THEIR PRIESTS IN JULY: CNA/EWTN News: In his latest prayer video, Pope Francis asked Catholics to dedicate the month of JULY to giving a spiritual gift to their PASTORS BY PRAYING FOR THEM, especially the priests who are tired or lonely. "The tiredness of priests...Do you know how often I think about it?"



This is the opening line of Pope Francis' newest prayer video, dedicated to his intention for the month. As the video flashes scenes of priests working in difficult situations, including war and disaster relief, Francis speaks in his native Spanish, saying, "priests with their virtues and defects work in many areas." "Working on so many active fronts, they cannot remain inactive after a disappointment," the pope said. And when these moments come along, it is good for a pastor to remember "THAT THE PEOPLE LOVE THEIR PRIESTS, NEED THEM, AND TRUST IN THEM." The video then displays scenes of priests administering the sacraments, visiting the sick, and speaking with parishioners. Francis closes the video asking Catholics to join him in praying "that priests, who experience fatigue and loneliness in their pastoral work, may find help and comfort in their intimacy with the Lord, and in their friendship with their brother priests." "The tiredness of a holy priest who gives his life in service, is like incense which silently rises up to heaven. Our weariness goes straight to the heart of the Father."

CNA/EWTN News: PRO-LIFE GROUPS REACT TO KAVANAUGH SUPREME COURT NOMINATION: Many Pro-life and Catholic groups reacted with optimism about President Donald Trump's nominee to the Supreme Court, Justice Brett Kavanaugh. "President Trump has made another outstanding choice in nominating Judge Brett Kavanaugh to replace Supreme Court Justice Anthony Kennedy, keeping his promise to nominate only originalist judges to the Court," said Susan B. Anthony List President Marjorie Dannenfeiser. Catholic Medical Association President Peter T. Morrow called the Justice SOLID on issues related to the protection of life. Americans United For Life President Catherine Glenn Foster, said that "Judge Kavanaugh will be an originalist Justice, committed to the text of the Constitution and the rule of law, including legal protections for human life." Foster said that this nomination is a SEMINAL MOMENT for the country, and is a CRUCIAL CHANCE TO SHIFT THE COURT to one that does not regard the judicial activism of the ROE and CASEY decision as THEIR LEGACY. Some pro-life and religious liberty advocates, though, have raised concerns about Kavanaugh. source: July 10, 2018/CNA.

All of our prayers have been answered as the last remaining member of the Wild Boars soccer team and their assistant coach have been pulled out of a flooded cave in Thailand, bringing an end to a near three-week ordeal that prompted an international rescue effort and captivated audiences around the world. What began as a local search for the missing 13 turned into a complex rescue operation, involving hundreds of experts who flew in from around the world to help.

Our prayers are with the family and friends of the former Thai Navy Seal working to rescue the boys who died from lack of oxygen.

"We are not sure if this is a miracle, a science, or what," the Thai Navy Seals said.
