Pastor's Letter

Last weekend of July 14th and 15th made up the final days of my summer vacation. When I go on vacation, most parishioners are very kind and wish me a happy vacation with the words such as: *You deserve a good rest, Father*. I must confess I feel a bit guilty about that since I know so many people, even among our parishioners, do not have the opportunity to have a vacation. Between caring for their children and grandchildren, their daily work, the upkeep of their homes and apartments, and healthy and financial challenges, I am humbled by you. I will also tell you that Jim Belmonte, who likes to tease me (which is well-deserved, since I give more than I receive in terms of teasing him), always keeps me humble. When he hears I am going on vacation, he says one word: *Again?*

I was in the Poconos with some members of my family for the last part of the vacation, and as is usually the case, the family loves when I offer to say a home Mass. I could tell you that this is because they love my sermons, but I think it has more to do with the fact that there is no collection, and I give a very brief sermon since there is usually the promise of a barbecue to follow. All celebrations of the Eucharist are special, but this Mass was a first anniversary Mass for my niece's husband Tom's mother, who died on July 14th while we were vacationing last year. It was also the fifth anniversary of my sister Maryanne's husband Jack, who died on July 15th. There were tears at the Mass as we remembered and prayed for these two wonderful people with whom we had shared life and family for many years.

In the brief homily I gave, I thought of all the things that I enjoy the most on vacation, are the morning breakfasts and the evening meals. The family meal has its difficulties in today's society. Families find it hard to sit down together due to work, school and activity schedules. People today seem to always have to be somewhere else. We often find ourselves eating and running, and the words *fast food* are so very true. Meanwhile, it can be difficult to be pulled from our TV or devices. I often see four or five people who go out to eat and at least three of them are on cell phones. I find my temptation lies in seeking to do the most useless thing of all with my cell phone: checking the score of the Met game!



But vacation meals by their nature are less rushed and more leisurely. Oftentimes, different family members volunteer to cook. The meal does not start until everyone is at the table. If the weather had been good and the ocean warm, thanking God before the meals comes easily to our lips. We tell the stories of who swam the fastest, who got dunked the most, what a great sandcastle was built, how nice the bike ride was, and how wonderful are the books that we are reading. Conversation flows easily. Very often, we tell the funny stories of past vacations. The little ones ask that we tell the same story again

since it made everyone laugh. And we remember in a gentle spirit of joy those who have gone home to God who once sat at the same table. Vacation meals touch our spirits and renews as much as any place we travel or any adventure we take on our holidays. As I concluded my simple thoughts at the memorial Mass, I reminded my family and myself that every Eucharist is a meal. We repeat the word that Jesus said at the last supper: *This is my Body. This is my Blood. Do this in memory of me.* This meal will be celebrated until the of end of time, be it in great cathedrals or on a coffee table. It will be said in every language known to humanity. *Do this in memory of me.* I told my family that Jesus called heaven the *heavenly banquet* and that those we loved who have died are with God just as they were once at our tables.

I think the two children who were at the Mass, Fiona and Sean, when they reach my age, will share their best memories of summer vacations will be the family meals. And I think they will hold onto those special moments when we celebrated Mass together. *Do this in memory of me.*

SUMMER READING



CNA/EWTN: July 12, 2018 The House Appropriations Committee moved to protect the conscience rights and religious freedom of faith-based adoption agencies on Wednesday. The committee adopted an amendment to an upcoming funding bill that would preserve federal funding for agencies who do not want to place children with same-sex couples.
