

## The Pastor's Letter

#### Father Pat's homily of 8/26/18

This past week, we had our annual children's summer Bible Camp. The camp is one of my favorite times of the year in the parish. We have a wonderful staff under the direction of Mrs. Pat Astarita and they truly put their hearts and souls into their work with the children. The camp is growing from year to year and this year we had thirty-three boys and girls between the ages of 5 and 8, along with 14 junior staff who were between 9

and 15. They were very helpful. I love the energy, the innocence and the joy that children have in the simplest things of life. (My two favorite times of the camp are snack time and nap time!)

How precious is each child in the camp? I gave them a lesson from the *Book of Genesis* on the beauty of God's creation and how he gave us everything in the universe because he loved each of us so very much. I then told them the story of Adam and Eve, and how God shaped these two people from the dirt of the earth. One little girl was upset and said, *we come from dirt*? I quickly tried to recover by telling her that God breathed into the dirt and gave us his life and that every time we breath, we feel God in us. She liked that. I then told them about Adam and Eve disobeying God and that God felt bad and said that he would send his Son Jesus to help us.

For the past several weeks, starting with the accounts of Cardinal McCarrick abusing the young and his seminarians, the news has been most upsetting. As bad as that was, and it *was*, then came the Attorney General's Report from Pennsylvania that was devastating. It spoke about a thousand minors or vulnerable adults being betrayed by three hundred priests over the past seventy years. Here is how Pope Francis spoke of this dark account: *If one member suffers, all suffer together with it*" (*1c or 12:26*). These words of Saint Paul forcefully echo in my heart as I acknowledge once more the suffering endured by many minors due to sexual abuse, the abuse of power and the abuse of conscience perpetrated by a significant number of clerics and consecrated persons. Crimes that inflict deep wounds of pain and powerlessness, primarily among the victims, but also in their family members and in the larger community of believers and nonbelievers alike.

Our hearts break for the victims and their families. There are no words that can speak about the deeds done to them. I also know that you too are hurting and struggling with these stories. You may move from sadness to a deep anger and many questions about such crimes and sinful actions. Even more appalling to many are the failures of the Church leaders, in particular the bishops, religious leaders and even popes. They were to shepherd the people and they failed to protect us from the wolves.

I thought of an experience I had many years ago. I went to meet a victim for the first time and the story horrified me. On behalf of my order, I offered counseling and sincere apologies. This person wanted to confront the accused. I explained that the accused was now a very old man and in retirement. My first reaction was to somewhat protect the old frail priest, and I lost focus on the victim. I regretted that and quickly saw that this person needed to do what was needed for healing. I committed to do all that I could to help.

tell that story because I think that is what happened to so many bishops. They were men who were so focused on the institutional church that they failed to see the hurting, wounded body of the Church; that is, all those who were suffering from their silence and failures.

Some of you may have family and friends who question you why you choose to stay in the Church. Perhaps, these events and events from the past, and no doubt future accounts from other states and dioceses, leave you with the same questions. But I also know that you know the Church is made up of far more than the sins and failures of some of its priests and bishops. The Church is always human and sinful because it is made up of humans, but it is always full of grace because of the Eucharist and the Holy Spirit. I hope in this dark time you can keep your eyes on Jesus and his presence in our broken body of faith. There is no defense for what has gone on in the past. I do believe that in the last twenty years, because of the revelations of the media and the cry of God's people, such crimes and sins are being rooted out of the Church. We are a better, not perfect, but a better Church today than we were in the past in terms of how to approach this most serious concern.

In today's Gospel, many of followers of Jesus are shocked because he has told them that they *must* eat his body and drink his blood. He is speaking to them about the Eucharist. Many walked away. Jesus turns to the apostles and asks them if they too will leave him. Peter says, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

I pray that you keep your eyes on Jesus, not lose hope and walk away in discouragement.



These reports show that CPCs often use false and misleading advertising and offer free services to attract women into their offices, where they ALLEGEDLY misinform an mislead those who seek pregnancy-related information.

#### September is PAD and Atrial Fibrillation Awareness Month

Atrial fibrillation is the most common type of irregular heartbeat and is a leading risk factor for stroke. Peripheral Arterial Disease (PAD) is a vascular condition related to heart disease and stroke. What do they both have in common? They are both detectable with simple, painless screening.

#### This is why St Martin of Tours Parish St Alphonsus Hall is hosting Life Line Screening, the nation's leading provider of preventive health screenings on Friday, September 14, 2018. The screenings provided focus on vascular disease, including atrial fibrillation and peripheral arterial disease.

Other tests check for abdominal aortic aneurysms and PAD, also called "hardening of the arteries" in the legs. A bone density screening to assess osteoporosis risk is also offered and is appropriate for both men and women. Many events also offer blood tests, including cholesterol, glucose and c-reactive protein screenings, as well as take-home colon cancer early detection tests.
