And people brought to him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, "Ephphatha!"— that is, "Be opened!" And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly. Mark 7:31-37

I remember when I had my aortic aneurysm surgery many years ago, one of my worst fears going into the surgery was the concern that I might lose my hearing. A friend of mine had bypass surgery and suffered some hearing loss afterwards. When my sister spoke to me in the recovery room and I could hear her, I was so grateful to God. Lately, I find myself saying, "what did you say?" more often than I used to. Some people whisper in the confessional and I am somewhat reluctant to ask them to speak up so perhaps my confessional line will grow if people discover this.

I am not eager to get my hearing tested, but I know it is coming soon. I have heard it said that losing your hearing can even be more difficult than losing your sight. I do find that hard to believe but the loss of hearing is painfully frustrating for those who experience it. I only lost my ability to speak once when I was struck by a case of laryngitis. I went to the pharmacist and struggled to ask what I could do for it. He said the best cure was to stop talking. I told him I could not do that since I was a priest. He smiled and said to give the people a break by not giving a homily. But not being able to speak is not a laughing matter. I have met people who are in deep frustration due a stroke and can't speak what they wish to say, or others who were born with a speech limitation. We can thank God for the gift of American Sign Language (ASL) and those who teach this wonderful path of communication.

In the Gospel today, Jesus has been on a long trip and, according to scholars who know the geography of that text, he took a very roundabout way to get where he was going. He went from the town of Tyre, to the town of Sidon, to the Sea of Galilee and then to the district called the Decapolis since it was a series of ten small towns. We might ask if Jesus needed a GPS! Our Lord seems to be going out of the area that would have been the heart of the Jewish people, and walking the edges of the borders where there were non-believers and Gentiles. This shows that Jesus is bringing the Chosen People, the Jews, to a consciousness that the good news of salvation is not only for them, but for *all* people.

When Jesus works a miracle, there are often two realities going on at the same time. The first is what is literally happening and being experienced by the individual and those observing it, and then there is often a deeper symbolic meaning that is given to teach us deeper message — almost like a parable or drama in action. So, a deaf man is brought to Jesus; he is most likely a Gentile. He is both deaf and mute. Some people, perhaps his family, bring him to the Lord since they have heard he is a "wonder worker." Notice that it is not just the man seeking the miracle. We are told *they begged him to lay his hands on him*. We often find healing and strength in community and not by ourselves. The Gospel tells us that Jesus spits and then touched the ears and tongue of the man and said the Aramaic word "Ephphatha!"— That is, "Be opened!" And the man was healed.

We may be shocked by the Lord's spitting, but I must confess anytime I have ever been cut, I immediately put the wound to my mouth. This was an ancient form of healing. There is a rite in the baptismal ceremony called the *Ephphatha* where the baptizing priest or deacon gently touches the mouth and ears of the baby and says: *The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the mute speak. May he soon touch your ears to receive his word, and your mouth to proclaim his faith, to the praise and glory of God the Father.* Hearing and Speaking. There is no spitting I am happy to say.

Have you ever said, any of the following statements?

- There is nothing you can say that will change my mind.
- Shut up!
- Not now, I am busy. You can talk to me later.
- Who cares what you think!
- I know what you're going to say.
- You think that's important; listen to what happened to me.
- How can you say that to me?
- I am not interested in what you have to say.

Perhaps we might ask the Lord to touch our ears and help us listen to one another. In our culture today, so much communication (if we can call it that) is done online or by text. I use them both, but all of us need the experience of being truly heard, especially by our family and friends. We may not agree with them, but being a good listener is a skill. We need to open our ears and hearts to hear one another.

Have you ever done any of the following?

- Gossiped. If you answer no to this, let me propose you for canonization.
- How about detraction: speaking badly about another but saying, it is the truth so it is okay.
- How about sarcasm, negativity, biting criticism, temper explosions, blasphemy, or maybe worst of all, the silent treatment.

Speech is a gift that is easily misused and we can pray to use this gift well. I invite you to touch your mouth and your ear as I say these words from the baptismal rite:

The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the mute speak. May he soon touch your ears to receive his word, and your mouth to proclaim his faith, to the praise and glory of God the Father.


