Father Pat's homily of September 30, 2018

The Pastor's Letter

Jesus said anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his or her reward.

I heard a story about the time St. John Paul II visited Ireland in September of 1979. There was at the time a tremendous response to his visit. A mass was held in Phoenix Park in Dublin and it was said that over a 1,000,000 people attended. Before the Mass, there were many priests hearing confessions. One fellow went to confession and said it had been 20 years since his last confession, and then confessed his sins. The priest gave him absolution and recommended to him that he try to get to



confession more regularly. He told the priest that he lived on one of the Aran Islands and there was no priest on the island. So, the priest suggested he take one of the small commuter planes that flew out of the island to the mainland. The fellow responded, *Oh Father that is too risky for a mortal sin and too expensive for a venial sin.*

Those of us who are older grew up very conscious of what constituted a mortal sin and what was a venial sin. We knew that missing the major parts of the mass on Sunday was considered mortal sin as was eating meat on Friday. I remember hearing one priest say that if you kissed your girlfriend for more than 20 seconds it was a mortal sin so I suppose you almost needed a stop watch to stay in the state of grace.

I do not in any way want to diminish the reality of mortal sin. Mortal sin means that a person has acted in such a way, either by one specific evil action or over a period of time to completely cut off his/her relationship with God. The word *mortal* means dead. A person who commits mortal sins has chosen to allow his or her relationship with God to die. God still loves the one who has committed the deadly sin, but the sinner has chosen to walk away from God. Jesus takes sin seriously. Today we heard, "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. No, Jesus does not take sin lightly.

However, Jesus spoke far more about mercy and forgiveness than he did about the consequences of sin. We think of the *Parable of the Prodigal Son* who runs to welcome his son home with no questions asked. Only God can judge the heart of a person and his or her actions. Quite honestly, I do not think it is that easy to commit a mortal sin. Many spiritual writers speak about serious sins - those that significantly affect our relationship with God, but they may not lead to eternal damnation. People used to ask very often: *is this a mortal sin or a venial sin?* There was often the refrain among some of us Catholics that went like this: *don't worry; it's only a venial sin.* The Scripture tells us that the just person sins seven times a day. It is very hard to get through a day without a negative word about someone, sharing a bit of gossip, taking the name of the Lord in vain, or a struggle with a sexual temptation. We trust, and rightly so, in the redeeming grace of the Lamb of God.


"It's only a venial sin." I invite you to think about a very important relationship in your life. Perhaps your spouse, your parents, your children, a close friend or relative. You love them and they love you. All human relationships have their struggles. There are times when we might thoughtlessly or even deliberately hurt someone we love by something we have done or not done. It may affect the relationship a little or more seriously. If the bond is deep, forgiveness occurs and we continue our love for the other. I do not think any of us would think in terms of what are the things that I can do that may offend my loved one, without really completely destroying the relationship. When we begin to accept habits of sin that we consider insignificant, we are thinking in that way - Don't worry. God can take it. That is not the language that you and I would use in an important relationship. We pray for the grace to avoid sin because we love God and we want to please him. When we try by His grace to avoid and resist sin, we are pleasing God and showing our love for Him

If this talk is scaring you a bit, let me give you some consolation and hope. In the second part of the Gospel today, Jesus did talk very directly about sin. In the first half of the Gospel, he says a phrase that has given me great hope and direction in my life: Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his/her reward. I am a sinner but I can give a cold cup of water to others in the name of Jesus. "Cups of cold water" are loving words, compassionate deeds, kindness and patience toward another, holding my tongue when I want to gossip or criticize, a donation to the poor or someone in need, an act of forgiveness. Avoiding sin, no matter how firm our desire, is not easily done. We have so many opportunities during a day to do good and kind actions. Anyone of us can do kind deeds toward our family, our friends, neighbors strangers, and even our enemies. As I watched the recent Senate hearing involving Doctor Ford and Judge Kavanaugh, I found myself tearing up at different points during both of their testimonies. I found both very compelling. The moment that touched me the most was when the judge spoke about his ten year old daughter who when saying her night prayers said, Can we pray for the lady? That was a cup of cold water given in His name.

At the close of wake services, I often speak of an old proverb that says, you can't take it with you. We all know the wisdom of that saying. We cannot bring our money or possessions to heaven. But I challenge that expression with a verse from the Book of Revelation that concludes wake services: "I heard a voice from heaven say, 'Write this: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on. Yes, said the Spirit, let them find rest from their labors, for their good deeds go with them.""





THE SANCTITY OF HUMAN LIFE: *Heritage House:* All human life is very special, more valuable, more significant and more important than anything in this world. It is the gift that any person has ever received and the greatest opportunity any member of humanity can be given. Human life has value, worth, and dignity because of where we came from. We originated from a loving God, who instilled value in us by creating us in His image. Understanding where our value as humans comes from is very important to appreciating the value of those who may SEEM less useful or important. In our society, it is normal to value things based on what others think or on what they can do. This makes the idea of inherent value a shift in thinking for many. But the truth is, human life is valuable, because it is a creation of God.

THE ELDERLY: In our recent history, there has been a trend toward devaluing the elderly. Historically, it was the role of the children to take care of aging parents. This was normally done in the home where the relationship with the previous generations remained intact. Recently, this has been changing. Many elderly are left to fend for themselves or, at times, in nursing homes and forgotten. The elderly are not a burden; they are a blessing. There is great wisdom to be gained from older generations, and we should respect them until the end of their days.

THE MENTALLY AND PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED: To some, having a handicapped child seems like a terrible thing. The reality is that it does add work and time, but it normally increases the reward and joy of parenting. The Bible tells us that our actions toward the most vulnerable and weak in our society will be counted as how we treated God Himself. *"I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me." Matthew 25:40.* Those with handicaps and disabilities have exactly the same value to God as any other human being. They are to be loved, cherished and valued alongside all others.
