

February 11, 2019 Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you..." (Jeremiah 1:5)

At the very heart of our beliefs about who we are and why we exist, is a message of love. God creates us out of love. Out of love, He redeems us by the sacrifice of his Son, Jesus. He calls us to an eternal destiny with Him because He loves each sacred human life, created in His image.

That we are created in God's image is reaffirmed in our nation's Declaration of Independence, reminding us that we "are endowed by [our] Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are **Life**, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." The **right to life** is the foundation and starting point for every other God-given human right. When that right is attacked or denied, all other rights and liberties begin to crumble.

You are probably aware that on January 22, 2019, the 46th anniversary of *Roe v. Wade* (the Supreme Court decision that declared an absolute constitutional right to abortion), Governor Andrew Cuomo of New York signed into law the "Reproductive Health Act", which he himself called "the most aggressive" abortion law in the country. It was then "celebrated" by his lighting up One World Trade Center and the Alfred E. Smith Building in Albany.

It is our obligation as citizens and as Catholics, to be well informed and to make our voices heard in the public square when evil and injustice threaten the sacred gift of life at any stage.

On a human level, this gruesome law should be appalling to people of every faith, or no faith. The Reproductive Health Act allows for abortion on demand with no restrictions throughout all of pregnancy. This means that as a choice, an abortion could be performed on a full-term infant as the mother is going into labor.

This law might also open the door to taking away conscience protections from medical personnel, and could be used to force doctors, nurses and other medical staff to perform or to assist in abortions. Governor Cuomo claims that he is protecting women's rights, when in fact, this law endangers the lives of women by allowing non-physicians to perform abortions, and it removes any objective standard of care due to the patient.

The Act has also removed criminal penalties when an unborn child is deliberately targeted for death in a crime. Two and a half weeks after the bill became law, the Queens District Attorney said he could not prosecute a man for the stabbing death of his unborn child in the womb of his girlfriend, because of the passage of the Reproductive Health Act.

Unimaginably, the law also repeals protections for infants who are accidentally born alive during the course of a failed abortion. This amounts to infanticide, the killing either by direct

means or by neglect of an infant who is alive outside the womb. The law is silent on reducing the pain and suffering of infants, especially those being aborted late term.

Brothers and sisters, this law is an abomination that cries out to Heaven for justice. We cannot be silent in the face of such a blatant attack on the most vulnerable among us. I invite you to do several things:

- 1. **Stay informed and educated** regarding these issues and the battles ahead of us, such as assisted suicide and legalized surrogacy. Two outstanding resources available to you are:

- 2. **Get involved**. Both web pages listed above offer easy links to contacting your elected representatives. Let the Governor and our other elected officials know that this Act violates the dignity of the human person and that you do not support it.
 - Get involved in the efforts already underway at your parish, such as Respect Life Committees. In addition, our Diocesan Respect Life Office can direct you to ways that you can support and promote the sanctity of life locally, on Long Island.
- 3. **Pray**. Pray the Holy Rosary. Ask the intercession of Our Blessed Mother Mary, Protector of Mothers, Defender of Life and the Family, to strengthen us so that we may be compassionate, courageous witnesses to the truth. Ask also for the intercession of Saint Thomas More, patron of statesmen, politicians, lawyers and judges, who lost his life for refusing to renounce his conscience and give in to the tides of political power and privilege.

Pray for our elected officials and for all people and pray that our politicians come to understand their profound obligation to defend the most defenseless among us. Any Catholic who actively supports an attack on the sacredness of life, chooses to place him or herself in grave moral danger and outside of the Communion of the Church. We pray for their souls, for a spirit of repentance, for a return to the truth of the love of God. It is God's love that formed each one of us in our Mother's womb.

A civilization that not only will not protect, but actually celebrates an attack on its most vulnerable members is morally bankrupt and stands on the verge of collapse. We pray for the courage of the martyrs, that an awakened spirit of evangelization and voices raised together will move hearts and minds, and call us back to our God-given senses, to the God who made us, who loves us, and who offers us our eternal destiny in love.

Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us!

This is from last weekend's homily

I heard a story about a bishop visiting a local parish that was preparing to receive a new pastor. The bishop spoke at a meeting of the parishioners and told them, "I am assigning an outstanding priest to this parish as your pastor. He is perhaps the most gifted man in the diocese - a brilliant man, wonderful homilist, a friendly man who works well with the young and is loved by the seniors, and a very astute administrator." As the bishop was speaking, the people were crying. He was surprised by this reaction to such good news, and finally asked, "why are you crying?" One man responded, "that's what you told us the last time!"

Since the announcement was made by the Redemptorist Provincial Father Paul Borowski, C.Ss.R. that the Redemptorists, due to a serious lack of personnel, would be returning the pastoral care of the parish of St. Martin of Tours back to the Diocese of Rockville Centre, I, and am sure is true for all our priests, have heard a statement like this very often: we are going to miss you all very much.

When I hear this, I feel we are very appreciated and loved, but at the same time I feel sadness for both you and for us. The date for returning the parish to the diocese is August 1st, 2019. Since last August first, I have been saying to myself: *this is the last Thanksgiving we will have together, the last Advent and the last Christmas we will share together, and so forth*. I have been treasuring each day, but also know that our departure is not too far off.

I am speaking at all the Masses this weekend since I want to keep you informed of the process that has begun in terms of our parish having a new pastor and an associate priest. The Diocese of Rockville Centre has what I consider a very good process of naming a new pastor. Recently, all the parishes that will need new pastors were announced to all the priests in the diocese. There are at least 15 parishes seeking a new pastor, and there may be more named in the weeks to come. Some of the pastors have reached retirement age, others have finished their two six year terms, and some may be seeking a different assignment. All the priests of the diocese have received a profile of the parishes that are seeking pastors. The priests are given information about the sacramental programs of the parish, the finances, the buildings and so forth.

The priests in the diocese can then apply for one or more of the parishes. The diocese has a personnel board that seeks information from the people in the parish. Everyone in the parish is encouraged and welcome to name their desires for the new pastor and the pastoral team. So, in your pews are sheets that will assist you in going online and having your thoughts brought to the Diocesan Personnel Board. If you do not use a computer, you can fill a sheet at home and drop it off at the parish office this week. The first meeting of the personnel board is February 19th. So, those of you who wish to be heard, need to get this done no later than this coming Friday.

These recommendations are read by the personnel board and also the priests who are considering being the pastor of the parish. I believe the personnel board will have several meetings. The final naming of the pastors is done by Bishop Barres. The request for the priest for a particular parish may or may not be met depending on a variety of circumstances.

I met with Father Edward Sheridan last week who is in charge of the personnel board. I liked him very much and I think he understands the transition that our parish is making and is very sensitive to it. He said that we may know the new pastor by the end of April or in early May. The new pastor may come and spend a week or two here and we will work together for a smooth transition. He will become pastor of the parish on August 1st. Father Sheridan said he believes St. Martin's will most likely have a pastor and one assistant. We discussed our present schedule of eight weekend Masses, and we both agreed that with two parish priests, there will have to be changes in the schedule. I told him the parishioners are aware of that and have been prepared for such changes over the past year.

I have very much appreciated that you have been concerned about us and our next assignments. Our Provincial Board will be giving us our new assignments sometime in mid-June. None of us know now where we are going. I have asked people to help plan some events to celebrate the 33 years that you and the Redemptorists have shared together. If you are interested in volunteering to be a part of those activities, you can let me know.

I am very optimistic that all will go well. Our staff and volunteers are gifted and have truly created a great spirit here at St. Martin's, as have all of you, the parishioners. A parishioner said to me, Father, we are going to miss you men so much, but we will, as always, welcome and love the new priests who come. I could not say it better.

Today, we heard about the great catch of fish to the point that the boats of Peter and John are almost sinking. What an image of the abundance of God's grace. God always gives us more gifts and graces than we ever need. Our first reading gave us the words we say at every Mass before the Consecration: "Holy, holy is the Lord of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!" The people of St. Martin's have been proclaiming those words of faith and adoration for 95 years and will continue to do so for the next 95 years. We Redemptorists will cherish and celebrate with you the next six months as a precious gift from God. Amen


