Father Pat's Homily of 3/17/19

Several years ago, I had the great blessing of being to the top of Mount Tabor, the mountaintop of the Transfiguration where the glory of God shone through Jesus as Moses and Elijah were present, leaving the apostles Peter, James and John both terrified and awe stricken. It was a glimpse of heaven. I can tell you that it was a harrowing ride in an old mini-van that clung perilously close to the edge of the road overlooking a very

deep drop. I prayed harder on the trip up that mountain than I did at the sacred site of the Transfiguration. I thought I might soon be seeing Jesus face to face!

This Gospel account leads me to think on another powerful mountaintop experience: "We've got some difficult days ahead," Martin Luther King, Jr. told an overflowing crowd in Memphis, Tennessee on the 3rd of April 1968, where the city's sanitation workers were striking. "But it really doesn't matter with me now, because I've been to the mountaintop...I've seen the Promised Land. I may not get there with you. But I want you to know tonight, that we, as a people, will get to the Promised Land. Less than 24 hours after these prophetic words, King was assassinated by James Earl Ray. Although Doctor King died before he felt his work was completed, and although we still have significant racial issues in our country, we have elected an African-American President and there have been many other positive developments in terms of racial healing.

Scripture scholars tell us that Jesus brought the apostles Peter, James and John, the three key leaders of his disciples, up the mountain to see the glory of God shone through him because dark days lay ahead that would severely test the faith of those who followed Jesus. They would see the one they believed was the Messiah sent from God arrested, brutally scourged, crowned with thorns, nailed to a cross, die, and then be buried in a borrowed grave. They would all run away and hide for fear that the same fate might befall them. Although Jesus spoke about his resurrection, the disciples naturally did not grasp what that meant. We wonder if Peter and the others drew any comfort and strength from this moment on the top of Mount Tabor in those shattering days to come.

Have you had moments when you were on the top of the mountain and for an instant had a glimpse at the wonder and glory of God? Certainly, nature has offered me some. I remember the first time I saw the majestic beauty of the Grand Canyon or the awesome power of the thundering waters of Niagara Falls, or the stunning view of a glorious sunset over the ocean or star-filled skies on a cold, crisp night. Such sights move us to awe and a whispered prayer of *Oh, my God!*

You may have had a transfiguration moment at the birth of your children and grandchildren, when you fell in love and knew this time he or she was the one, or when you went through a serious illness and found healing. Such moments might be a visit with a close friend, a surprise gift, an email from a friend that brought you light and comfort, a song that inspired you to almost want to dance, or a movie so powerful that you could not find the words to describe it. Maybe it was a birthday with one of those round numbers like 50, 75, 80 that you felt in the core of your being that God was good and life was precious. You may have been lifted up from the ordinary by a powerful homily or a hymn at Mass. Transfiguration moments! Although not always from happening daily, they lift us, comfort and inspire us to move forward. We need such moments in our journey of life.

Ordinary Time makes up most of the Church year in the midst of the Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter Seasons. At the moment of the Transfiguration, Peter says to Jesus *let us erect tents and stay here forever*. Jesus gently tells them that they must go back down the mountain to face what is to come. We live in ordinary times. We live with working hard, seeking to pay bills, dealing with the ups and downs of our marriages and friendships, with sickness, aging, troubling news in the media, loss and death. A friend of mine often said as he grew older: *Old age is not for the faint-hearted*. Sometimes, the joy of the mountaintop seems very far away in the distance. The parish mission we just had brought me up the mountain. The faith of our parishioners, the friendship and preaching of Father McGowan, the great assistance of so many, and the magnificent music created a kind of spiritual transfiguration for me.

Lent is a time that invites us to review our spiritual journey. I know God is very much with us in the midst of the ordinary moments of life and we often fail to see how present he is. This holy season invites us to look more deeply into our present realities and see the amazing grace of God. In a few minutes, you and I will receive the body and blood of Jesus Christ. He will enter into our bodies, our hearts and souls. How blessed we are to be here and to have our faith.






St. Gerard Majella, CSsR is a very popular saint of


