The Pastor's Letter



Aday in the life... This past June 8th was my 44th anniversary of the priesthood. I am not sure if it is true or not for those of you who are married, but I usually do not make a big deal of my anniversaries unless they are special numbers such as 25th (which was a big celebration in Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish in Brooklyn) or my 40th (which I had the great joy of celebrating here at St. Martin's). Certainly, one's first anniversary of marriage, priesthood, diaconate, religious life is special. Usually, on my priestly anniversary, I thank God for the joy of being a priest and how much He has blessed me with my vocation; I think of my ordination day and my parents and family; my mind moves me to think of my classmates with whom I was ordained. Other than that, most of the anniversaries through the years begin to blend into one another and I even have to think about how many years it has been since the number does not come automatically to me. I think some husbands make that same mistake with their wives and may get an elbow in the ribs.

Yet, on what is a rather an ordinary number - 44 - (true baseball fans may think of Hank Aaron or Reggie Jackson who was once a member of the evil empire), I had a jubilee weekend that was a great celebration of ministering in the name of Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit. The weekend began with our annual clergy appreciation Mass, a celebration that marks the anniversaries of all our priests and deacons. I was so thrilled to see Michael Leva at the Mass. Mike, founder of the Men's Club and one of the Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers for the Sick, had himself been very ill since Christmas. A large number of people attended the Mass, Elena played some of my favorite songs, and Deacon Tom gave a very moving homily on what it means to be a priest or deacon including special mention of the Redemptorist priests who had blessed St. Martin of Tours Parish for the past thirty-three years. Naturally, a festive gathering around bagels and coffee followed in St. Alphonsus Hall.



That breakfast soon flowed into the beginnings of the ALPHA retreat. For the past several years, I have been chaplain of this group of dedicated men and women who serve our community so well. We all have to do our part!





Sunday began with a frantic call from the former assistant pastor, Steve Descovich. I had promised him I would say a prayer at the annual breakfast that the Knights held for the widows of deceased Knights. I jumped in my car and said hello to everyone and then said a prayer of remembrance for our deceased Knights. If I had not showed up, Steve told me he was going to take my Knights of Columbus sword away and I would no longer be Sir Knight Worthy Chaplain Patrick Woods CSSR (we Knights love titles!)

On Sunday the 9th, I met with a beautiful family of the parish to help prepare for the funeral of our beloved parishioner, Joe Giugliano. Hearing Joe's wife Rosemarie of 66 years and his son Joe Jr. speak about this good man was to be in the presence of love. Later in the day I went to the wake.



At the 1:00 p.m. Mass, as we celebrated the great feast of Pentecost, we rejoiced in the ordination of our parishioner Christopher Quinn. Ordained last week, this was the first Mass that Chris preached and ministered as a deacon. How powerful was the love present in the Church among the parishioners, family and friends of Deacon Chris. It was another Pentecost. Deacon Chris gave a beautiful homily. He is a humble man of prayer and faith, and a powerful witness to the grace of God. Having been a part of the journey of Chris from his first coming to me about the possibility of being a deacon all the way to his first Mass, I was overwhelmed with happiness and told the congregation that this was one of my happiest days, among so many others, at St. Martin's. How blessed is St. Martin's to have Deacons Tom and Chris and by this time next year, God willing, Ron Lacsa will be ordained into the diaconate.

I was the celebrant of the 5:30 p.m. Pentecost Mass. During the Mass, we had nine adult parishioners receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. The candidates had been well-prepared by Ann Hughes and they came forward with eagerness and joy to be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit. Their family and friends were so proud and happy, and their happiness showed the gift of joy from the Holy Spirit. After the Mass was over, a couple of people

asked to receive the Sacrament of the Sick and they extended their hands in prayer asking for healing.

My 44th anniversary of priesthood was no ordinary weekend. It's a message I preach often but I often forget: **there are no ordinary moments in life. Every moment is a gift from God**. Sometimes, the Holy Spirit has to remind us of that and to realize how present he is in our lives. This is a weekend I will always remember.

RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY UNDERSTANDING ABORTION IN AMERICA



STATES ARE DIVIDED: For America, it seems that this is a year of reckoning on the issue of abortion. In the past few months, a slew of states have passed restrictive abortion laws with the explicit intent to have them challenged in front of the Supreme Court. With Neil Gorsuch and Brett Kavanaugh now on the bench, it is the anti-abortionists' hope that one of these laws will be used to overturn Roe v. Wade and take away constitutional protection of abortion rights. These laws range from limiting the legality of certain procedures used to perform abortion, to making abortions illegal once a heartbeat is detected (with a few exceptions), to criminalizing doctors who perform abortions. On the other hand, some state legislatures have

moved in the opposite direction, ensuring legal protections for abortion. **NEW YORK** has passed a law to decriminalize abortion, and **VERMONT** is close to making abortion a fundamental right. **MASSACHUSSETTS, ILLINOIS, RHODE IS-LAND, WISCONSIN, MAINE, NEVADA and HAWAII** are all in different stages of working on bills that would protect abortion rights.

The following states have introduced anti-abortion regulations with a breakdown of what the law dictates and its status: ALABAMA: makes it illegal to perform an abortion, with no exceptions for rape or incest. May 15, 2019. ACLU and Planned Parenthood filed a lawsuit to challenge the law. ARKANSAS: Ban after 18 weeks, with exceptions for rape, incest, and medical emergency. Also has a trigger law to ban abortion in the pipeline in case the Supreme Court overturns Roe v. Wade. March 15, 2019. Takes effect this summer. GEORGIA: Bans abortion past fetal heartbeat usually about six weeks into pregnancy. May 7. Pro-choice organizations promised lawsuits against the law. Businesses investing in Georgia (including Netflix and Disney) said they will reconsider their investment in the state if the law is enforced. INDIANA: Allows medical professionals to choose not to perform an abortion; bans dilation and evacuation, medical procedures used for second-trimester abortions. April 23. KENTUCKY: Bans abortion past fetal heartbeat. March 15. It is currently blocked by federal court. LOUISIANA: A bill that bans most abortion after the fetus' heartbeat is detected. The law will only go into effect if a Mississippi bill is upheld by a federal court. MISSISSIP-PI: Bans abortion past fetal heartbeat; ban on dilation and evacuation. March 21. Temporarily blocked by a federal court. MISSOURI: Bans abortion after eight weeks. May 24. Planned Parenthood challenged the law. NORTH DAKO-TA: Ban on dilation and evacuation. April 10. May be challenged depending on a Court of Appeal's decision on the similar Arkansas law. OHIO: Bans abortion past fetal heartbeat. April 11. Slated to go into effect on July 11. ACLU and Planned Parenthood have filed a lawsuit to temporarily block the law from coming into effect while a federal judge make a final decision. UTAH: Bans abortion after 18 weeks, with some exceptions. Mar. 25. Blocked by a federal court. QZ.com

Republicans hope that getting a case in front of the Supreme Court could result in Roe v. Wade being overturned. Americans are evenly split on whether they identify as "PRO-CHOICE" or "PRO-LIFE", according to Gallup Polls, though they are less divided (and more in favor) when asked specific questions about abortion being legal. Abortion rights groups promise legal battles, guaranteeing that the issue will remain a key one going into the 2020 elections. USA Today.
