# The Pastor's Letter

This is my last bulletin letter. Trees all over the United States are cheering! Some of you have told me that they share them with people who are not in the parish, and few have told me that they save them and occasionally read them again. I thank all of you for your encouragement and support with those kind words. I must give great praise to my editor Genny Mitchell, the parish secretary, who has saved me many times from saying crazy things because I had either left words out of the letter or misspelled words that might have greatly confused people. I am so very grateful to her since she is far more than a parish secretary. She has been a key advisor to me through the years. She has found checks on my desk that were lost, chased after me as I was heading to the dumpster since I was looking for something that she had found in my office, and countless other adventures. She is the person who makes our bulletin special, adding many wonderful and creative touches. She will be a great help to Father Chris.



### Father Pat's Homily of Sunday, July 21, 2019

The word *Redemptorist*, the name for the religious order that has served here at St. Martin's for the past thirty-three years, is really only a nickname. When we were founded, our first original title was *The Congregation of the Holy Savior*. Since there was already an order with that name in the Church, it was decided to have our formal name be *The Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer*. So, the word *Redeemer* has evolved into our less formal name of *Redemptorists*. However, I think most of us love the name *Redemptorist* since it is so linked with Jesus the Redeemer.

Jesus died out of love for every human being and seeks to bring us home to eternal life. What a great mission to share in. When you see us write our name formally, we write the initials *C.Ss.R.* after our name. Most religious do that as well. The Jesuits writing *S.J* after their name standing for *The Society of Jesus*; the Dominicans write the initials *O.P.*, which stands for *Order of Preachers*, the Franciscans *OFM, Order of Friars Minor. C.Ss.R* recognizes our formal title in Latin: *Congregatio Sanctissimi Redemptoris*; which English is *Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer*. Some say *CSsR* really means *Congregation of same sermons repeated.* I know some brides, before they are married, practice writing their new last name since they are so looking forward to the wedding. When I was in the novitiate preparing to enter the Redemptorists, I remember the desire I had to write the initials CSSR after my name. My license plate is reads *CSSR68*. That is the year I became a Redemptorist and I even have a Met shirt with the words *Pat CSSR* on it. I have been told not to wear it since it embarrasses our Order.

The beautiful memorial book that has been prepared for the departure of the Redemptorists from the parish on August 1<sup>st</sup> has been named *Plentiful Redemption*. The book as you know has pages upon pages of touching memories written by our parishioners expressing how they experienced the power of Redemption by God's grace through the ministry of a Redemptorist. The Redemptorist coat of arms going back more than 250 years is described this way in our rule: "The seal of the Congregation consists of a cross with a lance and sponge mounted on three hills; on either side of the cross are the abbreviated names of Jesus and Mary; above the cross is an eye sending forth rays over a crown. Around the seal is the motto written in Latin: Copiosa Apud Eum Redemptio (Translation: "With him is Plentiful Redemption")

The three hills, the lance, sponge, and the cross represent the great act of Jesus' dying for every human being who has ever lived. The initials *ARE* and *M* refer to Jesus and Mary. St. Alphonsus Liguori, the founder of the Congregation of the Holy Redeemer, had a profound love for both Jesus and Mary, His Mother. The eye above the cross with surrounding radiating lines is similar to the lines flowing from Jesus in the Divine Mercy Image. God's love and mercy are pouring into the world from the Trinity. The crown above the eye speaks to us of the reward for those who embrace and accept the redeeming power of Jesus as do the palms surrounding the image. A wreath was often given to the one who completed his or her race just as we might give flowers to someone we love or want to recognize. We think of the words of St. Paul in first Corinthians: *every athlete exercises discipline in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we seek an imperishable crown.* The seal reminds us of the fundamental purpose of life: union with the God who so loves us.

Today, in Redemptorist parishes and churches all over the world we are celebrating the Feast of the Most Holy Redeemer. In the rest of the churches they are celebrating the 16<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary time. We have the joy of celebrating this particular feast which is so very special to our Order. We celebrate the Feast of the Holy Redeemer on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of July.

Pope Saint John Paul II spoke these words to the Redemptorists in 1982: "Following St. Alphonsus, in all pastoral ministry the centrality of Christ must always be stressed, as the mystery of the mercy of the Father. Redemptorists should never tire of proclaiming, that is, the infinite love which Christ has for human beings, especially those most in need of healing and freedom when tainted by the horrible consequences of sin."

In the Gospel we read for this Feast, we heard what many would say are the Gospels and the entire Bible summed up in one sentence. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life. This may well the last time the Feast of the Most Holy Redeemer is celebrated here at St. Martin's. Over the past 33 years of our ministry, we pray the truth of plentiful redemption: **God is a God of mercy and love. Amen.** 

### **Air Conditioning**

We just passed through a brutally hot weekend. I regret that our church air-conditioning is not working at full capacity. There are six units that provide for the A/C in the church. Three are working fine, two are working at limited capacity, and one will no longer function. Unfortunately, we were not aware of this until we needed them this summer. I know there are areas in our church that are cooler than others and I appreciate how patient the parishioners have been. Rather than move to a quick fix that might not be so quick, we felt it is better to evaluate the entire system and consider replacing what needs to be upgraded. Fortunately, due to your generosity, we have the funds from our capital campaign which would enable us to replace the system if need be. If something has to be done that cost above \$25,000, then it must go through the diocesan process. So presently, we are not able to make the church any cooler than it has been in the last several weeks. We are hoping that the three well-functioning units continue to work at full capacity. Although it is not as cool in church as we wish, I do think that the present reality is still tolerable for the short run. If there are more problems, then I think we may have to consider some emergency steps such as perhaps to have Mass in the cafeteria, but I do not anticipate that happening. I am sorry for your discomfort and for this issue landing on Father Chris' desk. I can assure you we are seeking to do the best we can.

### **Parish Celebrations**

In this time of transition, we have had two celebrations that involved nice meals. I am so grateful for the donations that we have received from parishioners, the local Redemptorist community, the sale of tee shirts, and the funding of the *Plentiful Redemption* book. I have been deeply impressed with the efforts of the planning committee to be good stewards, and I am happy to inform you that funds from the parish's operating budget have not been used.
