

On this Catechetical Sunday, as we prepare for another year of our parish Faith Formation program, we thank our directors and catechists for saying yes to the call to teach the faith to our next generation. This calls for each and every one of us, without exception! We all do it in different ways, but we are all called to be missionaries and evangelists. I would like to especially thank those who have been catechists for years and even decades!

As good as the parish religious education or faith formation program may be, it can never replace the role and obligations of parents in handing on the faith to their children. Parents are the first and primary educators of their children in the faith. Our program is a means of assisting our parents in this role. Our program can not do it all. Catholic school can not do it all. No formal program can replace the role and influence of parents and the family in the faith development of children. One hour a week in a classroom can not replace the lived experience of a faith-filled family life.

As September brings about a lot of new beginnings, perhaps now is the time for a "new beginning" of really living the faith as a family. The start of the school year and the faith formation year can be the start of returning to Mass each Sunday (the conclusion of the school year is not the time to stop going to Mass!). If it has been awhile, return to the sacrament of Penance. Bring your children to confession when you go. Rediscover Sunday as a day focused on God and family.

MASS BOOK OPENING AND UPDATES TO SCHEDULE

- The 2020 Mass book for daily and Sunday Mass intentions will open on Saturday, September 21 from 9:30AM 12 Noon and 1PM 4PM in St. Alphonsus Parish Hall and again on Monday, September 23 from 9:30AM 3PM in the school cafeteria. Please use the ramp entrance. Beginning Tuesday, September 24, the Mass book will be open in the Parish Office during normal business hours.
- **Beginning September 21,** the offering for an announced Mass will be \$20. This change brings St. Martin of Tours in line with the Mass offering of most other parishes in the Diocese. Unannounced Mass intentions, which are offered by our priests during time off and retreats, as well as by retired and mission priests, will be \$10. Again, this brings us in line with most other parishes in the Diocese.
- Individuals will be limited to 3 (three) Masses only on September 21 and 23. We are unable to "hold" or "pencil in" any dates out of fairness to the rest of the parish.

6:30AM DAILY MASS:

- **Beginning Tuesday, October 15, 2019** we will again celebrate at 6:30am daily Mass Monday through Friday with some exceptions. (see below). The parish priests recognize the good will of parishioners who wish to attend Mass before going to work. After discussion, the priests of the parish have decided to bring back this Mass for a time period to evaluate how it will affect the schedule with frequent funerals, Friday afternoon weddings, and other sacramental responsibilities.
- We will take Mass intentions now for the 6:30am Mass from Tuesday, October 15 through the end of Lent (Wednesday, April 8, 2020). The offering is \$20. We will continue to evaluate the future of the 6:30 Mass periodically as we go forward and so will only take intentions for periods of time and not the whole calendar year.
- **Exceptions:** We will <u>not</u> celebrate the 6:30am Mass on legal holidays (Columbus Day, Thanksgiving, Presidents' Day, etc) as well as the morning of the eve of holy days of obligation or other days where there may be a scheduled evening Mass. There may be other periods of time, such as one of the parish priests going on retreat, when we will not be able to offer the 6:30 Mass. Those times will be known in advance. Recognizing the desire of our parishioners and the reality that the parish has two fewer priests than a month ago, we felt this was a good compromise for the time being.

NEW CONFESSION SCHEDULE:

- **Beginning Tuesday, October 15** we will have a new parish confession schedule. In addition to the established confession time on Saturday from 2pm to 3pm, we will be adding times the other 6 days of the week. This will make us one of the few parishes in the area where confession will be regularly scheduled every day of the week.
- Confessions will be heard every Sunday from 4:30 to 5:15pm, Monday through Friday *immediately* following the 6:30am Mass (the priest will go into the confessional and stay as long as penitents come in), as well as from 8:30am to 8:50am before the 9am Mass. There will also be confessions from 6:00 to 6:45pm in the evening on the eve of holy days of obligation and on holy days of obligation preceding the 7pm Mass.

Please continue to pray for the priests of our parish and for vocations to the priesthood. - Fr. Chris


