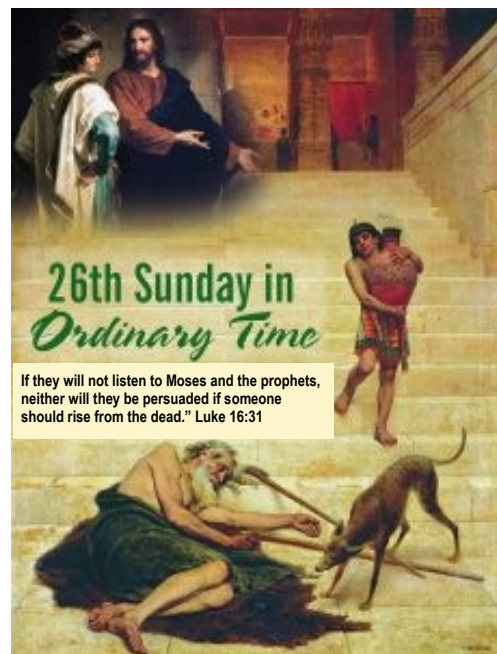

Show others God's mercy, don't judge them, pope says

ALBANO, Italy (CNS) -- Christians are not licensed "inspectors of other people's lives," but rather disciples who reach out to others, assuring them of God's love and welcoming them into the community, Pope Francis said.

Celebrating an outdoor evening Mass September 21 in Albano, about 20 miles south of Rome, Pope Francis used the anniversary of the dedication of the city's cathedral to talk about what Catholic churches should be and how parishioners should act toward their neighbors who never come to church.

"The Lord remembers us," the pope said. "He does not forget us, he does not lose sight of us despite the obstacles that can keep us far from him," as the Gospel story of Zacchaeus demonstrates. Although the tax collector had a "small stature, physically and morally," Jesus noticed him and decided to go to his house even though everyone in Jericho knew he was a sinner. Reading the Zacchaeus story on the anniversary of the cathedral dedication, Pope Francis said, is a reminder that "every church -- the church with a small 'c' -- exists to keep alive in people's hearts a reminder that God loves them. It exists to say to each person, even those furthest away: 'You are loved and called by name by Jesus. God does not forget you. You are in his heart.'"

- **Beginning September 21**, the offering for an announced Mass will be \$20. This change brings St. Martin of Tours in line with the Mass offering of most other parishes in the Diocese. Unannounced Mass intentions, which are offered by our priests during time off and retreats, as well as by retired and mission priests, will be \$10. Again, this brings us in line with most other parishes in the Diocese.

6:30AM DAILY MASS:

- **Beginning Tuesday, October 15, 2019** we will again celebrate at 6:30am daily Mass Monday through Friday with some exceptions. (see below). The parish priests recognize the good will of parishioners who wish to attend Mass before going to work. After discussion, the priests of the parish have decided to bring back this Mass for a time period to evaluate how it will affect the schedule with frequent funerals, Friday afternoon weddings, and other sacramental responsibilities.
- **We will take Mass intentions now for the 6:30am Mass from Tuesday, October 15 through the end of Lent (Wednesday, April 8, 2020). The offering is \$20.** We will continue to evaluate the future of the 6:30 Mass periodically as we go forward and so will only take intentions for periods of time and not the whole calendar year.
- **Exceptions:** We will not celebrate the 6:30am Mass on legal holidays (Columbus Day, Thanksgiving, Presidents' Day, etc) as well as the morning of the eve of holy days of obligation or other days where there may be a scheduled evening Mass. There may be other periods of time, such as one of the parish priests going on retreat, when we will not be able to offer the 6:30 Mass. Those times will be known in advance. Recognizing the desire of our parishioners and the reality that the parish has two fewer priests than a month ago, we felt this was a good compromise for the time being.

NEW CONFESSION SCHEDULE:

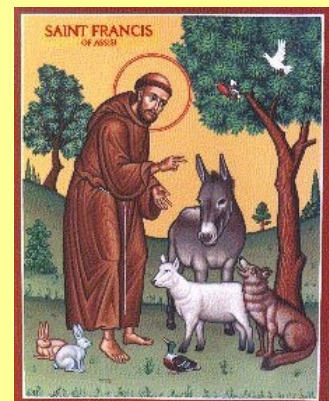
- **Beginning Tuesday, October 15** we will have a new parish confession schedule. In addition to the established confession time on Saturday from 2pm to 3pm, we will be adding times the other 6 days of the week. This will make us one of the few parishes in the area where confession will be regularly scheduled every day of the week.
- **Confessions** will be heard every Sunday from 4:30 to 5:15pm, Monday through Friday *immediately following* the 6:30am Mass (the priest will go into the confessional and stay as long as penitents come in), as well as from 8:30am to 8:50am before the 9am Mass. There will also be confessions from 6:00 to 6:45pm in the evening on the eve of holy days of obligation and on holy days of obligation preceding the 7pm Mass.

If good weather, come by the prayer garden

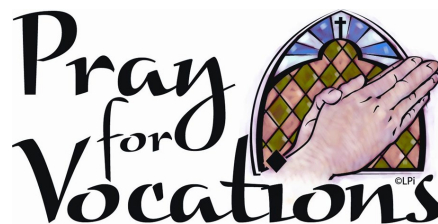

CATHOLIC NEWS AGENCY (CNA): Catholic Hospital in Nova Scotia Required to offer Assisted Suicide, Euthanasia. Antigonish, Canada: A Catholic hospital in the Canadian province of Nova Scotia will now be required to offer assisted suicide and euthanasia on site, after an assisted suicide advocacy group threatened legal action in January. The Canadian Senate legalized assisted suicide and euthanasia in June 2016. Both practices are fully funded in the Canadian healthcare system. The Canadian Press reports that St. Martha's Regional Hospital in Antigonish was formerly run by the Sisters of St. Martha, which signed an agreement to ensure the hospital's Catholic identity and values would be preserved. The Canadian Press reports that the Nova Scotia Health Authority last month "quietly instituted" a policy change to require St. Mattha's to offer assisted suicide. WALL STREET JOURNAL, 9/23/19: PRESIDENT TRUMP STANDS UP FOR RELIGIOUS FREEDOM. On Monday, President Trump became the first American president to convene a meeting at the United Nations on religious freedom. He kicked off the U.N. General Assembly's annual session with a "Global Call to Protect Religious Freedom." The president declared, "No right is more fundamental to a peaceful, prosperous, flourishing society than religious freedom, yet it is rare around the world. As we speak, many people of faith are being jailed, murdered, often at the hands of their own government." The president announced that the U.S. is committing \$25 million to religious-freedom efforts and launching a coalition of businesses for religious freedom. The International Religious Freedom Alliance, the first international body devoted to advancing religious freedom was launched by the administration a few weeks ago.
