

The Pastor's Letter



This weekend is Respect Life Sunday and the whole month of October is designated as Respect Life Month. We are reminded, and need to always be reminded, that premise upon which all of our moral and social teaching is based is that each and every human being is created in the image and likeness of God and maintains that dignity at every stage of life--from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death. What can we do to observe this day and this month? Simply conform our words and actions to reflect this truth. Make decisions based upon human dignity and not upon convenience. Pope Francis

speaks about a "throwaway culture." Sadly this extends beyond our consumption of consumer goods to our "consumption" (and "acquisition") of human lives.

The issue of abortion is rightfully at the forefront of our Respect Life Actions because the right to life is fundamental. Without life, nothing else matters! However, we always need to extend our work from our fight to end abortion (not replace this fight!). In the current political environment of New York State, enacting laws and policies that recognize the dignity of the unborn is certainly an uphill battle. Yet, as the Gospel tells us, "Nothing will be impossible for God." So we keep praying, we keep speaking out, and we keep giving witness to the dignity of each human person by the way we live our lives.

The important ongoing battle in New York State, the one where a decision has not yet been made, is the issue of Assisted Suicide. As of now, the actions of Catholics united with others like doctors and medical professionals, as well as advocates for the disabled, have been successful in blocking these proposals. However, we must always be active and vigilant as the tide is beginning to move in the other direction. Please go to the New York State Catholic Conference website (https://www.nyscatholic.org/) where you can find important information on specific issues in NYS, policy positions, and ways you can make your voice heard!

The annual "Blessing of the Animals" will take place this afternoon (Sunday) at 1:30 pm in the Prayer Garden. This has become a tradition here and in many parishes as St. Francis Assisi (feast day October 4) has been associated with animals. However, the life of St. Francis is so much more! St. Francis was the man who boldly, and unarmed, crossed the battle lines to personally try to convert the Sultan of Egypt. He was a man willing to give his life for the spread of the Gospel. While November is the "month of the saints," the liturgical calendar of October, beginning with St. Therese on October 1, is filled with great saints--ordinary men and women who did extraordinary things because they put the trust and hope in the will of God. One day in the future, will your name be inscribed in the liturgical calendar? Will you be the next great saint?

Beginning September 21, the offering for an announced Mass will be \$20. This change brings St.
Martin of Tours in line with the Mass offering of most other parishes in the Diocese. Unannounced
Mass intentions, which are offered by our priests during time off and retreats, as well as by retired
and mission priests, will be \$10. Again, this brings us in line with most other parishes in the Diocese.

6:30AM DAILY MASS:

- Beginning Tuesday, October 15, 2019 we will again celebrate at 6:30am daily Mass Monday
 through Friday with some exceptions. (see below). The parish priests recognize the good will of
 parishioners who wish to attend Mass before going to work. After discussion, the priests of the parish have decided to bring back this Mass for a time period to evaluate how it will affect the schedule with frequent funerals, Friday afternoon weddings, and other sacramental responsibilities.
- We will take Mass intentions now for the 6:30am Mass from Tuesday, October 15 through the end of Lent (Wednesday, April 8, 2020). The offering is \$20. We will continue to evaluate the future of the 6:30 Mass periodically as we go forward and so will only take intentions for periods of time and not the whole calendar year.
- Exceptions: We will <u>not</u> celebrate the 6:30am Mass on legal holidays (Columbus Day, Thanksgiving, Presidents' Day, etc) as well as the morning of the eve of holy days of obligation or other days where there may be a scheduled evening Mass. There may be other periods of time, such as one of the parish priests going on retreat, when we will not be able to offer the 6:30 Mass. Those times will be known in advance. Recognizing the desire of our parishioners and the reality that the parish has two fewer priests than a month ago, we felt this was a good compromise for the time being.

NEW CONFESSION SCHEDULE:

- Beginning Tuesday, October 15 we will have a new parish confession schedule. In addition to the
 established confession time on Saturday from 2pm to 3pm, we will be adding times the other 6
 days of the week. This will make us one of the few parishes in the area where confession will be
 regularly scheduled every day of the week.
- Confessions will be heard every Sunday from 4:30 to 5:15pm, Monday through Friday *immediately* following the 6:30am Mass (the priest will go into the confessional and stay as long as penitents come in), as well as from 8:30am to 8:50am before the 9am Mass. There will also be confessions from 6:00 to 6:45pm in the evening on the eve of holy days of obligation and on holy days of obligation preceding the 7pm Mass.







Respect Life Sunday, October 6, 2019



WASHINGTON (CNS) L.I. CATHOLIC: This year's theme for Respect Life Month, "Christ Our Hope In Every Season of Life," is "particularly suited for our times," said the chairman of the U.S. bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities. "Attacks against human life seem to grow ever more numerous and callous," said Archbishop Joseph F. Nau-



mann of Kansas City. He urged Catholics who feel discouraged by these attacks to "hold fast to Christ, our hope." The need to "cherish, protect and defend human life" is year-round, he noted, but he said the U.S. Catholic Church sets aside each October as Respect Life Month to bring special attention to all life issues.

During the year, the Catholic Church will celebrate the 25th anniversary of Saint John Paul II's encyclical "Evangelium Vitae" (The Gospel of Life"), which addressed the sacredness of all human life and is considered a social encyclical by many people because it included strong statements on the need for the political world to do its part in protecting human life. As Evangelium Vitae' highlights, he said quoting the document, "together we may offer this world of ours new signs of hope, and work to ensure that justice and solidarity will increase and that a new culture of human life will be affirmed, for the building of an authentic civilization of truth and love." "Our daily activities take each of us to places only we can go, to people only we will meet. May we allow Christ to renew and strengthen us, that He may work through us in each moment of every day."

The Respect Life Ministry is proud to announce it's 17th year here at St. Martin of Tours. We are a committee of a dozen people dedicated to spreading the word of the importance of all human life from conception to natural death. We are not only a committee, we are friends.
