

The Pastor's Letter

This week we will address the third major part of our Catholic funeral rites, the Committal. "In committing the body to its resting place, the community expresses the hope that, with all those who have gone before marked with the sign of faith, the deceased await the glory of the resurrection" (OCF 206). The rite of committal provides a sense of closure for the entirety of the funeral rites, as well as a place where the family and friends can continue to pray and pay respects to their loved ones. Visits to a cemetery at the beginning of November are opportunities for

plenary indulgences for the deceased.

The clear preference is that the three major parts of our funeral rites should be celebrated in their entirety. Sometimes particular circumstances do not allow for this. However, in making funeral arrangements for a loved one, or for oneself, serious consideration should be given to foregoing one or multiple parts of the rites. Each part has its own specific purpose and emphasis, which should not be forced upon the other parts. For example, the vigil or wake is a time of sharing memories, looking at displays of photographs, and greeting friends and family. When there is no wake, there is still a need for those things to happen. However, much of what can and should happen at a wake is not appropriate for the funeral Mass. Where one has great freedom to speak at a wake service, there is only very limited and exceptional opportunity to speak at a funeral Mass. Sharing "words of remembrance" at a funeral Mass should be rare and the words should only speak about the person's faith. Biographies and stories are not appropriate at the funeral Mass, whereas they are certainly appropriate and encouraged at the wake/vigil, or at the committal, or any gathering after the committal.


A word should also be said about cremation. "Although cremation is now permitted by the Church, it does not enjoy the same value as burial of the body. The Church clearly prefers and urges that the body of the deceased be present for the funeral rites, since the presence of the human body better expresses the values which the Church affirms in those rites" (OCF 413). If cremation is chosen, it can only be for reasons not counter to the faith and the cremated remains must be properly disposed in a reverent manner. "The cremated remains of a body should be treated with the same respect given to the human body from which they come. This includes the use of a worthy vessel..., the manner in which they are to be carried, the care and attention to appropriate placement and transport, and the final disposition. The cremated remains should be buried in a grave or entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium. The practice of scattering cremated remains on the sea, from the air, or on the ground, or keeping cremated remains in the home of a relative or friend of the deceased are not the reverent disposition that the Church requires" (OCF 417). Thus, if cremation is chosen, the clear preference is for the entirety of the funeral rites to be celebrated with the presence of the body and cremation to take place following their conclusion.

Next Saturday, Fr. Robert Holz, Dean of the Hicksville Deanery, will be present at the 5pm Mass for my formal installation as pastor of Saint Martin of Tours. I hope you will be able to attend. Following Mass, we will be drawing the winners of the Golden Harvest Raffle at the reception. If you plan on attending, please let the rectory know how many people as soon as possible. The Golden Harvest is a major parish fundraiser. If you have not yet purchased your tickets, please do so after Mass today or in the rectory office during the week. Also mark your calendars and plan to join with us at the 9am Mass on Thanksgiving Day. What better way to begin our national celebration of Thanksgiving than to participate in the Church's offering of thanksgiving in the Eucharist?






FORMED FOR ADULTS: HAPPINESS

BABY SAFE HAVEN IN NEW YORK NO ONE EVER HAS TO ABANDON A CHILD AGAIN.

A distressed parent who is unable or unwilling to care for their infant can give up custody of their baby, NO QUESTIONS Baby Safe Haven ASKED. They must simply bring the infant to a safe haven location and make sure they locate a person to give the child. As long as

the child shows no signs of intentional abuse, no name or other information Is required. The specific locations and maximum age of the child varies from state to state. You can find the details of your location by using our 1-888-510-BABY. It's SAFE. It's ANONYMOUS. You do not need to tell anyone.

Infant Abandonment laws or BABY SAFE HAVEN laws exist to enable a person to relinquish an unwanted infant anonymously. If a mother cannot care for her child, she can bring that baby into a SAFE HAVEN location and leave the baby with a responsible adult, NO QUESTIONS ASKED.

The child will be examined and given medical treatment, if needed. The Social Services Administration will then take custody through Child Protective Services and place the child with an appropriate caregiver. You can leave your baby, up to 30 days old, with any responsible person at a suitable location in New York.

The parent can call the SAFE HAVEN HOTLINE 1-888-510-BABY to receive counseling and get details on the address and locations to the closest SAFE HAVEN in your state.
