

The Pastor's Letter



We are now more than halfway through the season of Advent. This Tuesday, our focus changes to the "O Antiphons" and the late Advent readings of the immediate preparation for the celebration of the Messiah coming into the world. How have you been preparing your life to meet the Lord when the day should come? Have you gone to confession yet? Is the Sunday Eucharist the center of your life? Have you made time each day to spend with the Lord in quiet contemplation? When was the last time you opened the Bible?

Wednesday evening is the last night of our three night "Parish Mission." The evening gives you the opportunity to hear two reflections, go to confession, but most of all to spend time in quiet contemplation and adoration of the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Please take advantage of these late Advent days—even if it is just for 15 minutes each night or an hour one of the nights. We all need more silence in our lives!

A book I highly recommend for everyone's spiritual reading is *The Power of Silence: Against the Dictatorship of Noise* by Robert Cardinal Sarah (I also recommend his book *God or Nothing* as well as *The Day is Now Far Spent*). He makes the case for the need for silence as an essential part of our lives, especially in the modern world. We also need to restore a sense of sacred silence to our liturgy and to the church environment. "If we want to grow and to be filled with the love of God, it is necessary to plant our life firmly on three great realities: the Cross, the Host, and the Virgin: crux, hostia, et virgo... These are three mysteries that God gave to the world in order to structure, fructify, and sanctify our interior life and to lead us to Jesus. These three mysteries are to be contemplated in silence."

Please see the bulletin for the Christmas and New Year's schedule of Masses. Remember we have confession regularly scheduled seven days of the week here at Saint Martin of Tours!

FORMED FOR KIDS EXTRAORDINARY STORIES ABOUT SOLANUS CASEY FOR CHILDREN

Children as young as five and adults of all ages will enjoy the colorful, engaging film. The film features eleven different stories that introduce children to this humble priest's spirituality and ministry. Each segment features a child who tells a fascinating and true story about Blessed Solanus. As the story unfolds, another child colors a large drawing that is eventually revealed to be a colorful illus-

tration of the segment.

The film was written and produced by veteran Michigan filmmakers Dr. Stan and Pam Williams under their SWC Films banner and was directed principally by Kelly Nieto, the creator of The Cross and the Light stage musical. The original orchestral score was created by Royal Oak, Michigan composer James Stonehouse. Famed Catholic illustrator and graphic novel artist, Sean Lam, created the drawings. Although ordained a priest, Bl. Solanus Casey never received permission to hear confessions or preach a sermon. He celebrated the Eucharist each day and carried on his apostolic work not in a pulpit or confessional, but in a tiny office. He was the friary doorkeeper whom people by the thousands visited, seeking counsel and spiritual guidance. Bl. Solanus spent his life in the service of people. He was always ready to listen to anyone at any time, day or night. He faithfully served the people by providing soup for the hungry, kind words for the troubled, and a healing touch for the ill. Because of his holiness, St. John Paul II declared him Venerable in 1995. In May 2017, Pope Francis announced that Fr. Solanus would be Beatified. Venerable Solanus was elevated to Blessed November 18 at Ford Field, Detroit, witnessed by 60,000.

ASSISTED SUICIDE LAWS DANGEROUS TO PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES: LICL: LIFE NEWS 2019 Michael Cook editor at Bioedge.org reported on 10/13/19 that the National Council on Disability (NCD) released a scathing analysis of the effect of assisted suicide laws in the United States on people with disabilities. It finds that safeguards are ineffective and that there is little oversight of abuses and mistakes. Currently eight states and the District of Columbia allow doctors to prescribe LETHAL DRUGS to patients diagnosed with terminal illness and with a prognosis of six months or less to live. If certain procedural steps are followed NYS WILL BE CONSIDER-ING AN ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL IN THE NEXT LEGISLATIVE SESSION that begins in January 2020. Cook stated, "Pain relief is often described as the primary motivation for seeking assisted suicide. In its report Assisted Suicide Laws and Their Dangers to People with Disabilities, NCD responds that the most prevalent reasons offered by someone requesting assisted suicide are directly related to unmet service and support needs. These should be dealt with through new laws and more funding says the NCD, not assisted suicide. In the report NCD exposes the limitations of purported safeguards. It says that INSURERS HAVE DENIED PATIENTS EXPENSIVE, LIFE SUS-TAINING MEDICAL TREATMENT, but offered to subsidize lethal drugs for them potentially leading patients to hasten their own deaths. Misdiagnoses of terminal disease can cause frightened patients to hasten their deaths. Though fear and depression often drive requests for assisted suicide, referral for psychological evaluation is extremely rare prior to doctors writing lethal scripts. I know firsthand that well-intended doctors are often wrong. If assisted suicide is legal, lives will be lost due to mistakes, abuse, lack of information or a lack of better options. No current or proposed safeguards can change that!
