#### The Pastor's Letter

I would like to begin my first bulletin column as pastor of Saint Martin of Tours by offering thanks to Father Pat and the Redemptorist Community for their care and support of this community for the past 33 years. Over the past several months I have experienced just a small part of what you have experienced for the past decades. Thank you for your assistance in the transition from one pastor to another, and the larger transition back from Redemptorist priests to Diocesan priests staffing this wonderful parish.

Thank you also to the parish staff with whom I have been in regular contact over the past few months and who I am looking forward to working with in the years to come. Thank you to all responsible for the *Plentiful Redemption* book and video. Having read and viewed them over the past few weeks, I am more excited to begin my ministry here at St. Martin.

I was very happy to be here for the Mass on July 7. I met many of you that day, but I must confess that it will take a little time to remember names and faces. So please remind Father Sylvester and I when we meet you over the next few months. Please see the bulletin for more information about our Block Party on Friday, August 16. It's a great way to meet the new priests, as well as fellow parishioners who you may see each week but never really took the opportunity to sit and speak with. Thank you to the Knights of Columbus and the committee for their work preparing for the day.

I just wanted to share with you some of the practicalities of the transition. Normally, parishes will have one priest leave and another take his place while the other priests in the parish remain. A few weeks ago, Bishop Barres assigned Father Vincent Schifano to live in residence here at St. Martin while he ministers full time to the sisters and residents at Saint Joseph Residence in South Huntington. So, by October everything will be running "normally."

There is a lot of transition here at St. Martin and it may take a bit of time before everyone feels "normal" again. That is understandable. 

As you recall, in response to concerns raised over inadequate instruction at some Jewish schools, the State Education Department (SED) had proposed "guidelines" that would have given authority to public school districts not only to oversee instruction at religious and independent schools, but also to determine whether our schools would be able to continue to operate. Although those "guidelines" were thrown out by the NYS Supreme Court on narrow procedural grounds, the SED advanced proposed regulations that would, if adopted by the Board of Regents, do essentially the same thing.

Education Commissioner Mary Ellen Elia, who spearheaded this initiative, has since announced her resignation, and a number of state legislators and members of the Board of Regents have expressed their opposition to the initiative, believing that SED should focus attention instead on the particular schools over which there are concerns. Despite the support we believe we have secured from Regents and lawmakers, we are working hard to ensure that the proposed regulations, as currently drafted, are defeated.

The NYS Catholic Conference and NYS Council of Catholic School Superintendents will continue these efforts, and may call upon you in the future to once again add your voice to help defend the independence and success of our Catholic schools. We will keep you posted as this issue continues to evolve. In the meantime, we extend to you our best wishes for an abundance of summertime blessings.

#### 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF AMERICA'S FIRST LANDING OF ASTRONAUTS ON THE MOON

Fifty years ago, July 20, 1969, the first men walked on the moon. Those of us who witnessed it understood what a giant step it was. Following U.S. President John F. Kennedy's challenge in 1962, to put a man on the moon and return him safely to earth before the decade was out, the nation went into high gear, using the efforts of thousands of people to meet that challenge. Seven years later, astronauts Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin transported aboard the Apollo 11 spacecraft, made the first steps on the moon. Even when the U.S.'s great competitor in space, the Russians, were of good cheer with congratulations, confirming the words written on the lunar plaque, which was left behind on the moon. "Here men from the planet Earth first set foot upon the Moon July 1969, A.D. We came in peace for all mankind." To the Moon: Grumman, the company that built Apollo 22's Lunar Module: The Apollo Lunar Module, or the LEM for short, was a highly specialized spacecraft built by Grumman Aircraft Engineering, Bethpage which was designed to land on the lunar surface and return the astronauts to the Command Module in lunar orbit for their trip back to Earth.

On a personal note: I was one of the Grumman employees that worked on the LEM Project in Plant 25, specially built for the Project. Working among engineers and technicians, and situated right outside the office of NASA, I was privileged to witness astronauts coming and going. I was there to see how the space suits were made, lucky enough to go enter the LEM Mockup in Plant 5, and crawl through what these brave men would spend their space travel in. It was no larger than two telephone booths put together. I was given Top Secret clearance, and with it able to witness much of what went into the making of this incredible endeavor. Most of all, watching and sharing the concern and worry these men and women went through as they established together a vehicle that would take, and hopefully return these men safely home.

Many of those that were there, have died or retired, but for me, at 19 years of age, it was an experience filled with honor and privilege. We felt a sense of pride in our country that we were coming together to unite the world, reach out and look up at the moon, and realize, together, we can achieve anything. America, at the time, faced challenges with issues of economic and social justice, opposition to the Vietnam War, and a tortured political scene that saw a President and other leading figures assassinated in the space of five years. Even our president, John F. Kennedy didn't survive to see his dream become a reality.

Today, we face challenges once again. We are a divided country in many respects. We look for hope and a pathway to delivering patriotism back into classrooms and hearts of our people. We once again strive for social justice, and end to war, and peace among us as Americans, and the people of the world. I can tell you, that for a brief moment in time, America came together as we looked to the skies and could only imagine what would be waiting for us that day in 1969. Maybe it was a promise that all of the world would realize that working together we could do anything. Maybe, we will have that opportunity to strive for that once more, as President Trump is planning for a return to the moon in 5 years. What we need now, more than ever, is to join hands as Americans and look toward the good in America, pride in our accomplishments and a future of peace and harmony. No country is without its problems, and those problems surely are a priority. We need to work towards an answer, heal the wounds, and go on united as a people. We can do this, if we remember that respect for life, all life, kindness with words and understanding can take as anywhere, to the moon and beyond.
