

## The Pastor's Letter

Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which concludes the Christmas season. It's a good reminder for us of the dignity and grace that come from our baptism, as well as the responsibilities that come from it. Throughout the Advent and Christmas seasons, the Scriptures have given us many examples of men and women who have been called by God to do great things and play important

roles in His plan of salvation. These calls demanded a response. We are all the beneficiaries of the "Yes" spoken by the Blessed Mother and so many others to their call from God.

Our baptism is also a call from God that demands a response. We are all given a calling, or vocation, as a particular way to live out our baptism. These calls are all demanding, but as we have heard in the Gospel several times over the past weeks, nothing will be impossible for God (and for us when we cooperate with His grace).

This is a good Sunday for a reminder of the requirements of a baptismal sponsor or "godparent." Contrary to the popular idea of the godparent being "a good person" or "good role model," in our faith the godparent has a specific role as a sponsor for the sacraments of initiation. To sponsor someone for initiation into any organization, a person must be a member himself. Therefore, sponsors must be fully initiated Catholics (that is, having been baptized and received the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation). He or she must also be 16 years of age or older and have no other impediments (such as a marriage not recognized by the Church). He or she must be someone who lives the faith on Sunday and throughout the week (here is where the "good role model" part comes in). If there are two godparents, one must be male and the other female. Please check on the requirements before asking someone! This will avoid any potential embarrassment.

As we conclude this Christmas Season, I wish to extend thanks to those gave so much of their time and talent over these past weeks: Elena and our music ministry for all the extra work and practice, extra Masses, and assisting with our parish mission evenings; George and our maintenance staff; Genny and our office staff; Ann Hughes and our decorating team; all our servers, ushers, lectors, and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, many who did double or treble duty these past weeks. We don't want to forget our collection counters! Thank you to all our parishioners for your generosity in our Christmas collection and throughout the year.

Finally, on behalf of the priests, deacons, and staff, thank you for the cards and gifts you dropped off at the rectory. They are very much appreciated.

FROM: Most Reverend John O. Barres, Bishop of the Diocese of Rockville Centre

On behalf of the Catholics of Long Island, I would like to express our deep sense of solidarity with our Jewish neighbors and friends at this difficult time. We grieve at the recent violent attacks directed at the Jewish community in the NY metro region. We pray that our civil authorities will work diligently to bring those responsible to justice and to prevent any further violence throughout our nation.

For the Jewish community this is a moment of fear. These are acts of intimidation that intend to conjure terrors from the past. I urge all of our Catholic faithful to reach out to their Jewish friends and assure them of our support. For generations we have shared life on this island, visiting in one another's homes, churches, and synagogues. May this blessing of community be a source of consolation and strength to us all.




